BARBARA JANTZI AND JACOB SCHWEITZER FAMILY

MOSE J. AND LOVINA (STUTZMAN) SCHWEITZER

Mose J., known as M. J. Schweitzer, son of Jacob and Barbara (Jantzi) Schweitzer, was born May 29, 1874 in Ontario Canada, near the village of Brunner.

At the age of 6, Mose went with his family to Seward County, Nebraska. Later they moved to Holt County and then back to Milford. Here he met Lovina Stutzman, oldest daughter of Jacob and Amanda (Hershberger) Stutzman. They were married on July 3, 1898.

In the early 1900s he was a Banner Buggy dealer. He was the first Model T Ford car dealer in Milford. Carloads of cars were shipped, unassembled, into Milford by train. Later M. J. was Dodge and Plymouth dealer as well.

In 1916 a daughter, Dorothy, was born to M. J. and Lovina. She was their only child.

In 1919 M. J. built a new home in the town of Milford and a garage up town for his business. He also was a truck driver -- drove or hauled cars from Detroit to Omaha and Lincoln, Nebraska, for a long time. In fact, he had a license to drive yet at 75.

M. J. had a hobby (if they had these in those days) as a "watch maker." He enjoyed repairing watches at his desk in his home. In his late years, he enjoyed his violin and accordion which he had learned to play in his early years.

My parents were Mennonites. They lived in the same community and went to the same church all their lives. They had men who boarded and roomed with them. Mother enjoyed the art of cooking and housekeeping. She was a very caring woman. She

was always concerned about her family and about their Christian life as well as hers, too. She died in 1935 before I married, but I am happy my father saw all of our children, even if the two youngest girls were only small when he died.

Dad was always on the go -- seldom sick. Due to cataracts, he was blind the last three years of his life. In 1959 he passed away at Milford, Nebraska, leaving to mourn his only daughter Dorothy, her husband Harry D. Miller, and six grandchildren, all of Nampa, Idaho, at that time. My parents were faithful members of the East Fairview Mennonite Church at Milford and are buried in the church cemetery.

Larry Jantze recalled the following:

"I knew Mose real well. He was a very interesting person. He hauled cars from Detroit during the 1920-1930 period. My dad (Lee Jantze) worked for him before Dad Married. Mose also was a watch repairman and had a shop in Milford. He owned several of the business buildings in Milford and at one time was considered wealthy."

It seems that after Jacob Schweitzer's death in 1899, Barbara (Jantzi) Schweitzer spent most of her time with Mose and Lovina. Thus it fell to them to entertain all the folks who came to visit Barbara, including the Canadian relatives. In 1806, Christian Lichti wrote home reporting that they (he, his wife and his mother, Catherine Jantzi Lichti) had arrived safely at Mose Schweitzer's in Milford, Nebraska.

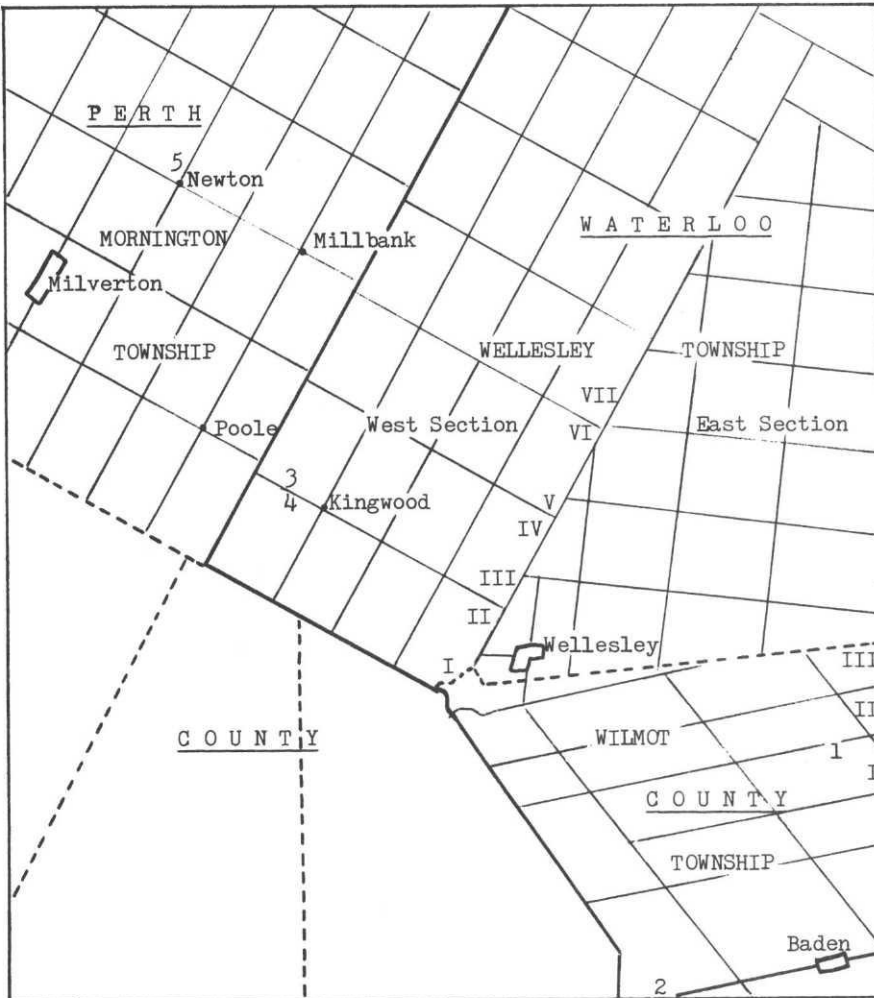
MARIA JANTZI AND NICHOLAS ULRICH FAMILY

Maria Jantzi, the third daughter of Joseph and Catherine, was born in 1839 in Wilmot Township in what was then known as Upper Canada. She was only seven and a half years old when her father died. Her mother married again three years later to Christian Riser. Maria's life during this time was probably very difficult. In the 1851 census three of the Jantzi children were not with their mother and step-father. Maria was found in the home of John and Veronica Erb. Although this family was made up of quite a number of people including some children, she must have felt keenly the separation from her parents. Since she was now thirteen, she was probably expected to do enough work to earn her board.

In the 1861 census we find all the Jantzi children at home in Wellesley Township (except Catherine and Barbara who were married) as well as four Riser children. Another 15-year-old Catherine whom we can't identify, was also part of the family. This must have been a very lively household with two young people in their twenties, three in their teens and four younger ones. Besides, there must have been some visits

from the young people in the neighborhood, because in December of 1861 Maria married Nicholas Ulrich who lived across the road. Bishop Peter Litwiller from Wilmot performed the marriage. The following March Maria's brother Christian married Nicholas' sister Magdalena.

Between 1861 and 1879 Nicholas and Maria resided in either Mornington Township, Perth County or in Wellesley Township, Waterloo County. Part of this time they must have been renting farms; so it has been almost impossible to trace their various moves. In 1861 they appear in Mornington (Lot 9, Con. VII) on a list of residents. The church record gives Wellesley as son Christian and daughter Magdalena's place of birth in 1863 and 1869 respectively. In 1871 the census records locate them in Wellesley Township. Between 1874 and 1879, Nicholas and Maria owned his parents' farm (Lot 3 W $\frac{1}{2}$ , Con. II, West Section, Wellesley Township). It is likely that between 1861 and 1872 Nicholas Ulrich and Christian B. Jantzi alternated renting farms and living with the Ulrich parents. Seven children were born to Nicholas and Maria during these years.

————— Concessions and other roads (Concessions are numbered I, II, III, etc.)

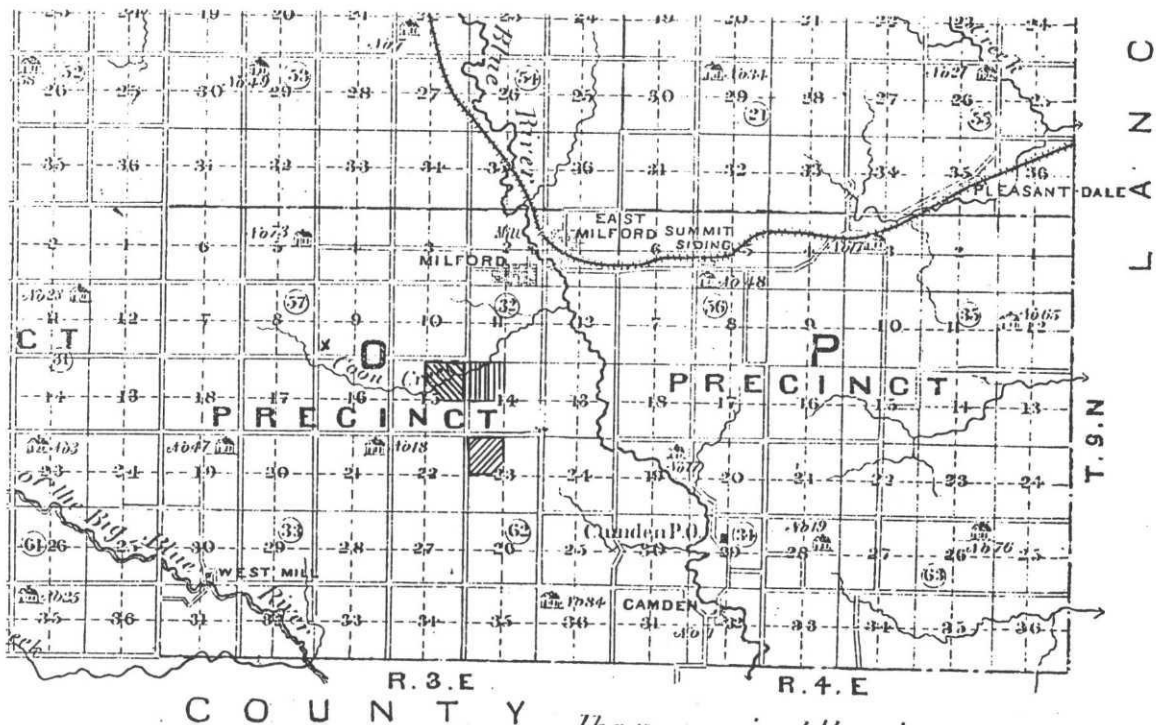
In October of 1878 a letter was written to Lewis County, New York reporting that Nicholas Ulrich had bought land and was building in Seward County, Nebraska. He planned to rent it out until he could sell his land in Canada. However, it may have been the other way around, because a daughter, Sarah, was born in Milford in May of 1879, and Nicholas did not sell his farm in Wellesley until September of 1879.

In 1979 Daniel and Magdalena (Roth) Sutter submitted the following:

"Nicholas Ulrich and wife Maria left Canada in the winter of 1878-1879 for Milford, Nebraska, and bought 160 acres of land from the Burlington

Railroad for seven dollars an acre. They built a nine-room house. They bought horses and cows, a sod-breaking plow, wood bar harrow, a pull check corn planter, a tongueless cultivator, and a sling shot oats seeder. They later moved to another farm 180 rods north.

Today Nicholas' great granddaughter Aloha (daughter of Esther Ulrich and Jake J. Roth) and husband Wayne Roth and four boys are living on the first farm, which is two miles south of Milford, Nebraska: Northwest Quarter of Section 23, Township 9, Range 3. They are enjoying a happy home because my grandpa, their great grandpa and great great grandpa moved to Nebraska 100 years ago."

The Nicholas Ulrich purchases in Seward County were as follows:

Deeds from Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad Co. to Nicholas Ulrich:

- 1) November 12, 1884 -- Northwest Quarter of Section 23, Township 9 North, Range 3 East of the 6th P. M. Seward County, for \$1,365.98. Later sold to Michael Roth. (area shaded on map)
- 2) December 24, 1889 -- East half of the Northeast Quarter of Section 15, Township 9 North, Range 3 East, Seward County, for \$560.

Deed from John Coutts to Nicholas Ulrich:

December 31, 1894 -- West Half of the Northeast Quarter of Section 15, Township 9 North, Range 3 East, Seward County, for \$2600. (area shaded on map)

The Benjamin and Barbara (Ulrich) farm was located in the Northwest Quarter of Section 14, same Township and Range as the above. (Area shaded )

Absalom and Mary (Ulrich) Hershberger owned the east half of the Northwest Quarter of Section 3, same Township and Range as the above and part of Section 34, Township 10 North, Range 3 East.

Granddaughter Fannie (Boshart)Stutzman recalled memories of her grandparents as follows:

"Until I was seven years old we lived just several miles from my grandparents' home. We would spend special days, like Easter and Christmas, at their house. It was such fun to play with our cousins Nick, Mary and Mabel Roth and Emma, Ben and Willie Herman at these family gatherings. Mary, Mabel, Marian and I had such special times together. At one of these get-togethers, Mary and I took our dolls out to the outdoor toilet. We could set the two dolls side by side on one hole and they would stay there. Mary took her doll first and mine went down the hole into the mess. Aunt Mary came, got the doll out and cleaned it up for me. My unhappiness with Mary did not last long, and we were again best friends.

Easter was such an exciting time. Aunt Mary would send us outside to make grass nests. While we were making nests, she dyed the eggs. She used onion skins for the coloring. Sometime later we would go back to check our nests, and there to our joy would be those beautifully colored eggs.

Grandpa and Grandma always had family devotions. In the morning right after breakfast or sometimes in the evening before we went to bed, Grandpa would read a portion of scripture from the German Bible. I could not speak German so I did not understand much of what he read. After the Scripture reading we would all kneel and Grandpa would lead in prayer.

At the table at mealtime, Grandpa and Grandma always sat beside each other at one end of the table. Grandpa said a prayer before we ate the meal and again after we were finished eating. We called Grandpa "Det" and Grandma we called "Mem."

Grandpa died in 1910. Mother, Marian and I had gone to Milford because he was not feeling well. That morning he had gotten up and seemed to be feeling better. He decided to walk up town which was about four or five blocks. About three o'clock that afternoon he died while my mother and Aunt Mary were setting up a heating stove for the winter.

After Aunt Mary married Abner (Absalom) Hershberger, she and Grandma moved out into the country on his farm. Grandma died in 1922. She lived with Aunt Mary and Uncle Ab until her death."

Granddaughter Marian (Boshart) Beckler also shared her memories:

"Going back to my childhood days, I have many memories of my Grandparents, Nicholas and Maria Ulrich. As my parents moved to Wood River when I was still real young, I remember going back to Milford at different times, and how nice it was to go to Grandpa's house. They were living on the farm southwest of Milford, and Aunt Mary was living with them. Yes, Grandpa farmed and also milked some cows. They had a board sidewalk from the house out to the milk house, which was about halfway between the house and the barn. There they separated the milk. I always had a cup to take out and could drink some of the warm cow's milk before it went through the separator. Why

that milk was so special, I do not know, because I also got to drink milk at home, but from Grandpa's cows it was special.

How much fun we had running back and forth on the sidewalk, with our cousins Mary and Mabel Roth. Grandma always had so many pretty flowers in her garden. I especially remember the pink and white (guicht rosa) peonies. What a good scent they had! I also liked Grandma's pantry. She always had ginger snap cookies in a container, and they tasted so good. One time we were at Grandpa's at Easter time. Again Mary and Mabel were there to play with my sister Fannie and me, and we went out in the yard to pull grass and make Easter bunny nests. Then we were told to go out and play for a while, and in the meantime the Easter bunny came and laid eggs in our nests. How excited we were to find such pretty colored eggs in the nests, and they were still warm -- oh, so much fun!

Later on Grandpas had sale and moved to town. Uncle Ben and Aunt Barbara Roth moved on the farm. Grandpas had not been in town very long until Grandpa passed away. On October 10, 1910 Mother, Fannie, and I were in Milford, and we were planning on going home the next day. Very suddenly in the afternoon, as Aunt Mary was wiring up the heater stove pipes, and Grandpa stood by watching her, he started falling. Mary quickly got off the chair and caught him before he hit the floor, but he was gone.

Grandpa and Grandma had a family of two sons and seven daughters. Along with their joy, there was also much sorrow. Their oldest son lived to be 18 years of age, the youngest son only five. Two little girls, one seven years and the other five years old died the same day of diphtheria. The day of the eighth child's funeral, I heard Grandma say, 'Will I have to follow all my children to the grave?' The Lord called her home before the death of her last remaining child."

Granddaughter Alvera (Boshart) Hochstetler wrote: "We do not know much about Grandma and Grandpa Ulrich, but we do have Grandpa Ulrich's green wine pitcher. Each morning they would drink a small glass of wine or 'schnopps' (whiskey) with hot water and sugar for their 'stomach's sake.'"

Grandson Amos Boshart particularly remembered his grandfather and his gentleness.

"Grandpa Ulrich was a good-natured man. He had a heifer that was a kicker -- so he tied a rope around her flank and milked with one hand into a bowl and held the bowl in the other hand and then dumped it into a bucket. If that would have been me, I would probably have taught her different!

When my cousin Nick Roth and I were at Grandpa Ulrich's one day we took some sticks and threw mud on the side of the barn. It was all plastered with mud. When Grandpa came in at noon and saw the mess, he never said a word. All through the meal I wished he would say something, spank us or kick our behinds, but he never mentioned it at all. For years you could see the mud plastered on the barn. Today, after many coats of paint, it is covered up.

Every morning after breakfast Grandpa Ulrich

would read from their German Bible, then kneel for prayer. I remember goofing off -- looking out the window, and then the cuckoo clock would strike, but Grandpa never scolded me for this.

I remember driving Grandpa Ulrich's team of horses when they put up hay. There was a hay loader on the back of the hay rack. Grandpa would take wheat to the mill at Crete. My cousin Nick Roth and I went to Crete with him one day. As usual, Grandpa was real gentle with his horses. The trip to Crete went just fine, but on the way home it was getting quite warm. Of course, Grandpa did not push the horses, and Nick and I became very thirsty. As we drove past the farms and could see the windmills pumping the good, fresh water, we would ask Grandpa

to stop so we could get a drink. Grandpa would say, 'We will soon be home.' I suppose if he had stopped to have a drink, we would have been thirsty again at the next farm! Anyway, it was a lot longer coming home than going.

Grandpa was quite a wealthy man in his day. He owned and built up several farms in the Milford area. He also built a house in Milford which is still there today. I remember when Grandpa Ulrichs had sale. I was too small to see out the window so had to stand on a chair. Grandpa sold a black horse which was named 'Farmer.'"

Nicholas and Maria Ulrich were part of the pioneer Amish Mennonite settlement in Seward County which is described in more detail in the introduction to the Joseph B. Jantzi family. They are buried in the East Fairview Mennonite cemetery south of Milford.

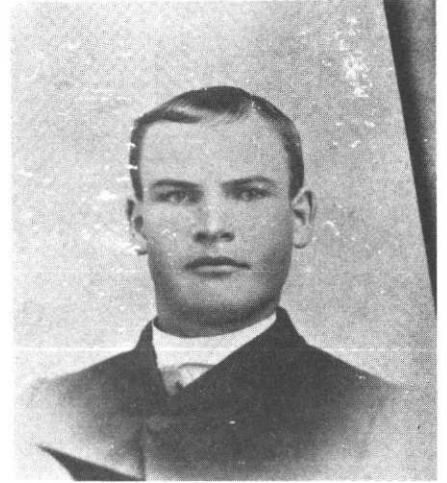

is at the rear on the right. This building is still part of the drug store today.



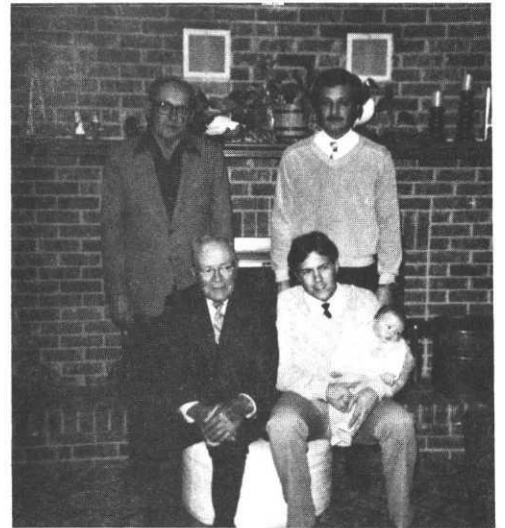
The house that Nicholas Ulrich built at Milford, Nebraska, when he came from Canada. Daughters, Barbara and Mary are in front. (taken about 1890)

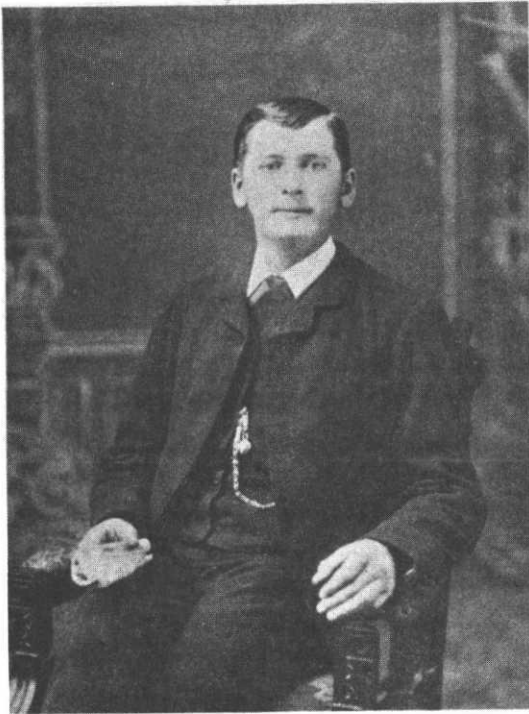

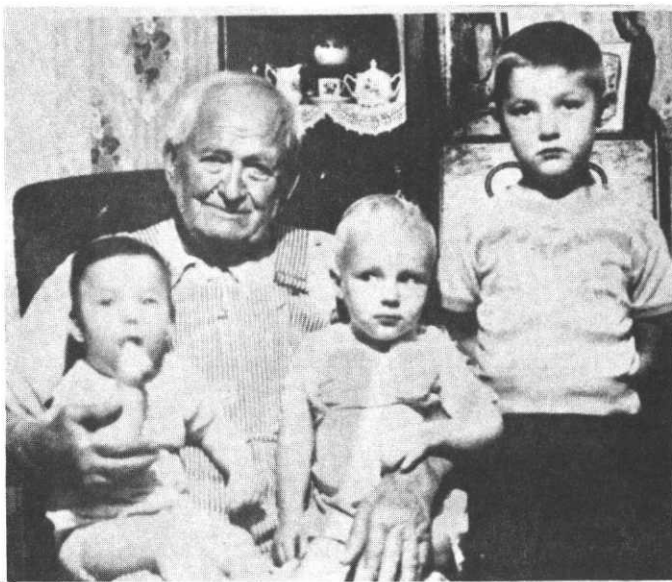

ANNA ULRICH AND GUSTAF HERMANN

Anna Ulrich, the second child of Maria Jantzi and Nicholas Ulrich, was born in 1864 in Ontario, Canada. She was 14 or 15 years old when the family moved to Milford, Nebraska.

In 1892, Anna married Gustaf F. Hermann, who was born in Posen, Germany. Concerning her grandparents, Betty Earnest wrote the following:

"I am not sure when Grandpa Hermann came to this country. His older brother, Karl, came to Illinois about 1880. Some time after that, Karl sent first for his sister Albertena, then for Gustaf, and still later for another brother William.

Gustaf and Anna Hermann farmed at one time southwest of Milford, Nebraska. Gustaf was not well, and his brother, Karl Hermann from Oklahoma, came to Milford and took him back to Oklahoma where he put him into a hospital. He died in Norman, Oklahoma. His body was shipped back to Milford for burial.

Anna moved to town when Gustaf went to Oklahoma.

She raised the four children at 819 First Street in Milford. She took in washing and ironing for different ones to make a living for the family. Only one of the four children finished high school, and that was Benjamin Harrison Hermann. The other three quit school and went to work to help their mother earn a living.

Concerning her Aunt Anna, Fannie (Boshart) Stutzman remembered the following:

"When I was about four or five years old, Aunt Anna and her four children lived in our upstairs. Later she had a house built in Milford close to our house. Aunt Anna's husband died when their children were quite small. She would do laundry for other people to help support the family. She would heat all the water on a wood range in her summer kitchen. She would scrub the wash on a wash board. Later, I believe she had some kind of washing machine. I remember going with her children to pick up or return laundry to her customers."

"When Grandpa Herman died at the age of 39, Grandma took in washings and did ironing to make a living for her family. Mom (Emma) quit school to help make a living by waiting on tables at the hotel-cafe.

My folks were married in July of 1918. I remember Mom telling us about Dad receiving his draft papers to go into the service (World War I). They had only recently been married, and there were others who had to go at the same time. They got as far as Seward, Nebraska, and the Armistice was declared; so they got to come back home.

When the folks were first married, Dad worked in the plumbing business for a while. About 1930, we moved to Crete, Nebraska, where Dad worked for the Standard Oil Company. But in 1933, the year Shirley was born (last of six children), we moved back to Milford to a two-room house on the west

edge of town. Those were the years known as "the depression years." Dad worked on WPA during that time. We kids walked ten blocks to school, winter and nice weather. We had some good times, and there were those things we would like to erase, but those are the years that are memorable. LaVern quit school at 16, and at 17 went to Pekin, Illinois, to work in a hatchery there. My two older sisters graduated from high school and started to teach country school. But in 1941 we had the chance to rent a big two-story house in town for \$15 a month, and we moved into it that summer. While living on the edge of town, we never had the modern plumbing, electric lights, and all the other conveniences. I remember the kerosene lamps, the outdoor can, and no running water. We had to pump it by hand. But the other day when three of us were together talking about a few things, the one thing we all remember was the old washing machine we had, and how we all

had to take turns turning it for Mom when it was wash day. I remember having to turn the wringer by hand. Mom did some washing on the wash board, too. Moving to town, then, was a great thrill -- a big house with lots of yard and rooms.

Dad started in the well business then and was in it until he retired. Maxine remembers that when she was in the 5th grade, she was May Queen in school. Shirley was Victory Queen in her junior or senior year in high school. We had homemade bread a lot and there was always a pan of rolls, too. How good they tasted when we got home from school! Mom never worked away from home much. As a matter of fact, I can't remember a time when I was growing up that I came home from school and Mom wasn't there. We used to pile into the old panel truck Dad had, and we went to Bradshaw, Nebraska, to see Uncle Ben's. They had a grocery store there, and, well, we did bring a few things back.

I can remember the first piano we had in our home. Geraldine, Maxine and Mom used to sing church songs. Church and Sunday school attendance was a regular thing for us when we had the transportation to go. We went to the East Fairview Mennonite Church during our growing-up years. Later, as one by one we went our own way, we chose other places of worship. In 1941, LaVern enlisted in the service (World War II). Melvin was drafted in the army during the Korean War. Mom looked forward to her two boys getting out of the service and coming home for good.

Five of the six children married and started their own homes. I never remember the folks taking vacations, until about 1954 or 1955. I was the only one at home, but was grown and was working. After some persuasion, the folks then did take vacations without any of us. They went to Wisconsin, Illinois, the Black Hills several times, Cheyenne and Denver, and Texas several times.

I always wished that I had grandparents. I never knew any of them. I have envied those who have known grandparents, but one thing I am grateful for is that we six children were all grown and on our own when we lost Mom. I can remember yet in the spring of 1945 when Mom was so sick with gall bladder trouble and gallstones. The doctor wondered how she ever made it. But God knew. I reminded Mom on several occasions that she still had three younger children to raise. Mom died of cancer in 1960.

Our roots go down several generations here in Milford. Our grandparents and great grandparents came here to live. Just sitting here, lost a while and sort of taking inventory, I realize that with another wedding this year and three more babies due, our family will grow to sixty. (written in 1979)

Shirley Ebers continued with her memories:

"When we were growing up, we were very poor but not poor in spirit. During those years of not having much, we learned the value of work and getting along with what we had. Our dad was never too proud to do any kind of work. His philosophy was: 'If I can't get a job for a dollar, then I'll find one for 75¢ or one for 50¢ or whatever, to make a living for the family.' I can remember, too, during those years Mom would go out and try to sell Stanley products so there would be some more money.

Mom was concerned also for the welfare of her family. She always took an interest in the things her children did in school and in other things. As the years went by and times got better for the folks, we had it a lot nicer, financially and otherwise. But Mom continued to give herself to her children. One by one, as each got married and had homes of their own, and as time went by and there were grandchildren, she took an interest and gave of herself there, too.

Most of all, Mom always looked forward to the Christmas season and having everyone come home. We didn't get together much during the year as a family, but at Christmas time we looked forward to getting together. As the family grew larger, and we could no longer meet in the home, we would get together in a community room such as the local library or bank had. When the whole family gets together, from Dad on down through the great grandchildren, there are close to 60 members. Today, at the age of 82, Dad still believes in the work ethic. Our family circle is broken here on earth, with Mom, a nephew and a sister gone. Geraldine died of a heart attack in 1973." (written in 1979)

Benjamin Harrison Hermann was born on a farm near Goehner, Nebraska in 1899. He graduated from high school in Milford and in 1923 married Hattie Hazel Gallagher. Ben taught school for nine years after graduation; then went into the grocery business in Bradshaw, Nebraska for 19 years. As the war came on, he left the grocery store for his wife and daughters to run for a short time. His son was in the service. Ben went into ordnance work in Hastings, Nebraska. His family joined him there later. From Hastings he was transferred to Sidney, Nebraska, then to Herlong, California for two years, where he died of a heart attack at the age of 66 years. He is buried in the Utica, Nebraska, cemetery. (by Hattie Hazel Gallagher Hermann)

Cheryl (Schack) Dajani contributed the following from her memories:

"I remember, in Sidney, Nebraska, just before Mom and Harold were married, we were all over at Grandma and Grandpa Hermann's. Mike and I were jumping on the couch (we were three and four years old). Harold had asked us to please stop, but you know kids, so he gave us each a whack on the behind. We were more shocked than hurt, but we both started crying. Grandma Hermann said to Harold he really should not do that and took us to the kitchen for milk and cookies. Of course, we agreed and liked her instantly.

Grandpa Hermann, I remember, always had the time to play and answer all of the kids' 'whys' and 'how comes' when most adults avoided it as much as possible. He was remarkably patient with all the children. I will not forget his funeral and how all those kids looked, and we all knew we would surely miss him much."

In the years of the depression he was the one who had job security and had no family responsibility. He is buried at the Memorial Gardens Cemetery in Cheyenne.

KATHERINE ULRICH AND JOSEPH H. ROTH

Katherine Ulrich was about 12 years old when the family moved from Wellesley, Ontario, Canada to Milford, Nebraska.

In November, 1892, Katherine married Joseph H. Roth, son of Jacob and Mary (Lauber) Roth. Four years later Katherine died. An infant son, Jacob, also died.

Mary (Roth) Riley wrote, "When I was three my mother passed on and I lived with Grandpa and Grandma Ulrich for two years. Then my father remarried and we moved to Illinois. Several years later I came back to Nebraska."

Fannie (Boshart) Stutzman recalled the following:

"Aunt Katherine and Aunt Barbara married brothers. Katherine married Joseph Roth and Barbara married Ben Roth. After Aunt Katherine died, her husband married again, had a family and lived in Eureka, Illinois. When Mary, Aunt Katherine's daughter, was a teenager she came back to Nebraska and stayed with my folks. It was here that she met Ed Riley, the man she later married.

Mary and Ed lived in Wood River, Nebraska for some years. They had four sons and one daughter. They later moved to Crete, Nebraska. Mary is still living there."

MAGDALENA ULRICH AND DANIEL B. BOSHAFT

Magdalena, known as Mattie, Ulrich was born April 18, 1868 (according to the family records) or 1869 (according to the church record) in Wellesley Township, Ontario, Canada. The Ulrich and Boshart families moved to Milford, Nebraska. On February 3, 1890 Mattie Ulrich and Daniel Boshart were married by Bishop Joseph Schlegel.

While they lived in Milford, Daniel worked as a carpenter and also helped his brother Jacob with some plumbing. Daniel and Mattie had three sons and two daughters -- William, John (died at the age of five months) Amos, Fannie and Marian. In March of 1907 Daniel and Mattie and their family of four children moved to Wood River, Nebraska. Here farming was Daniel's occupation. He was instrumental in helping start the Mennonite congregation at Wood River as well as building the church. He served many years in this congregation as a song leader and music instructor.

In 1911 Mattie's sister passed away. An infant daughter was left motherless. Mattie and Daniel took the young niece, Esther Roth, home with them. Fannie and Marian had been wanting a baby in their home, but little did they

realize that this would actually happen. This new member brought much joy to the Boshart family.

However, in 1917 the Boshart family also lost their mother. Mattie died of breast cancer at the age of 48. At this time seven-year-old Esther went back to her family. The Boshart family found it very difficult to lose both their mother and little Esther whom they dearly loved.

Soon after Mattie's death Daniel sold his farming equipment and spent his time with son William in Colorado, Amos in Nebraska, or Fannie and Marian in Oregon. In this way his grandchildren also fondly remember him for his wood-working and his singing. He died in Colorado at the age of 90 and is buried in the Wood River Mennonite cemetery beside Mattie.

In 1911 William Boshart and Cora Stutzman were married in the Wood River Mennonite Church. They lived in Wood River, Nebraska where they farmed for about six years. Two of their children were born there -- Vera and Clarence.

In 1917 they moved to Thurman, Colorado where they purchased 160 acres of land and continued farming. They had two more children but one died in infancy. In 1922, Pa (Daniel Boshart) came to Thurman to live with Will and his family. He opened up a blacksmith shop across the road from the farm.

In 1934 daughter Vera married Ben Hochstetler, and in 1937 they and the Boshart family moved to Colorado Springs. In 1942 Clarence married Ida Belle Zook and Dorothy married Ezra Stauffer. The Stauffers lived on a farm at Milford, Nebraska until a tornado destroyed it. Then they moved into town.

Will and Clarence bought a wood and coal company. They operated it for about five years. The coal company was sold and Clarence went into the trucking business and Will bought a house-moving business. Pa was still living with

Will and Cora periodically and tinkered in carpentry work to pass his time. In 1955 he passed away in his sleep. Will continued with his house-moving business until his death in 1965.

All of William's grandchildren remember something a little different and special about him. Bob recalled the time he wanted to buy a motor scooter and, not having the money, he asked Grandpa for it. He had to pay him back \$5.00 a month until he had paid it all back.

There were a lot of trips to Aunt Dorothy Stauffer's house in Nebraska. Of course Grandma and Grandpa never went alone. On one of these trips Bob and Bill started a tractor which they were not supposed to do. So, Betsy, Judy and Bonnie went into the house to get some cookies, so they could see if Grandpa could hear it.

My father, Amos Boshart, was born in Milford, Nebraska. When he was nine years old his parents moved to Wood River, Nebraska. At that time there were quite a few families who had moved to Wood River where they established a Mennonite church. Grandpa, Daniel Boshart, was head carpenter at the time the church was built.

My father married Sarah Stutzman, daughter of David D. and Mary Ann (Beckler) Stutzman, on March 14, 1918 at the home of the bride's parents. In January of 1919 my aunt Minerva (Stutzman), her husband Joe Schweitzer, and their oldest son Ervin, died from the flu epidemic. My parents took their youngest son, LeRoy, who was two years old, into their home, and he has been part of the family since. LeRoy's two sisters, Beulah and Elsie, went to live with our grandparents, David D. and Mary Ann Stutzman.

In 1926 my father bought a new Model T Ford. It came only partially assembled. In the plan, some of the crates were used as floor boards. Dad assembled the Model T in Wood River and drove it home. He took us for a ride and I can still remember looking down and seeing the shiny hub cap and spokes. I was on the left hand side in the back and LeRoy on the right side. And that is the way we always rode. We always went to church each Sunday, weather permitting.

Soon after my parents were married, Dad took up farming. In 1927 he had a sale and we moved to what was known as the Levenworth Ranch. I remember in the fall going to Wood River, which was seven miles away, to help drive 12,000 head of sheep from the stock yards to the ranch where they were to be fattened. Then in the spring they would be taken back to the stock yards to be shipped away by rail.

I also remember Dad hauling hay to Wood River in the winter time. He had the hayrack behind four horses. He would put on a big fur coat and walk beside the wagon. In the years 1934 to 1936, Dad, LeRoy, and I hauled a lot of hay to the Milford area. At that time it was dry, and they needed the hay. To tie the hay down, we used to make our own ropes with binder twine. I still have the rope machine we used.

Dad used to enjoy working with horses. One time I remember him breaking some horses to a wagon. They ran away with the wagon and did not stop until one horse jumped into the water tank.

During the war in 1947, we raised sugar beets. One interesting thing was that we hired German

prisoners of war who were stationed at Grand Island. Each day we would take our truck, pick up the prisoners, and return them after work. My Dad was able to talk to them in German and learned about their many different professions. At noon we would take a hot meal out for about 25 to 30 men. How they enjoyed the meal! They also enjoyed our small son, Gene, who was then one year old. Homesick, they would get out their billfolds and show us pictures of their own families.

Amos' older sons stayed at home for some time after their marriages to help on the farm. After eight years Merrill moved to Oregon. Delbert moved to the Milford area. LeRoy had gone to Pennsylvania at the time of his marriage. Aldoris developed diabetes when four years old and died at age 33. Amos Jr. and Omar remained in Wood River, and Omar is now on the home farm.

In 1962 my mother (Sarah) passed away. She had crippling arthritis and the last few years she was confined to the wheel chair. She kept going as long as she could, never complaining about her disability. She was a good mother to us all. The younger boys remember when they were naughty, she would tell them to go out and find a switch. But sometimes, no matter how hard they looked, they could not find one! So when they would return, they would say to Mom, "We just couldn't find one." She would start laughing, and they knew the whipping was off.

In 1965 my father remarried to my mother's sister, Mary Ann Stutzman. They enjoyed traveling, going to Phoenix, Arizona in the winter. In the fall of 1971 they took a trip to Iowa, Pennsylvania, and on into Canada to visit Boshart relatives in the Wellesley area. On their return to Pennsylvania at LeRoy's, Mary Ann became sick, soon going into a coma for one month. She died as the result of encephalitis.

Dad, a retired farmer, moved to Cairo, Nebraska. He enjoys going to work in Grand Island two days a week to work at the sale barn checking cattle in and out. He also keeps busy cooking most of his meals and keeping up his house and small garden, sharing the surplus with neighbors.

On December 18, 1977 all the family were home to help him celebrate his 80th birthday. Most of the grandchildren were there also. At an open house in the afternoon, many friends, relatives, and neighbors came to wish him a happy birthday.

"On April 23, 1900, when my parents were living at Milford, Nebraska, I was born. I was the fourth child, and the first daughter. My parents named me Veronica at birth, but I have always been called Fannie.

I have many pleasant childhood memories. I enjoyed going to visit my cousins and grandparents. Travel by horse and buggy was slow; so our visits to relatives and friends were special occasions. After we moved to Wood River, Nebraska in 1907, our visits to our family in Milford would be by train. We would spend several days to a week visiting there before returning home. My mother died when I was 17 years old. That was a time of loneliness and tremendous adjustment.

On April 29, 1920 I was married to David Stutzman at Wood River. Dave and I started farming with my father's machinery. The next year he sold his equipment. In 1925 David and I, with our two small daughters, moved to Thurman, Colorado. We spent about four years farming in this area. By 1928 when we moved back to Wood River, we had our first son. For a short time we were in the creamery business at Wood River. We would buy sweet cream from the farmers. This was then taken to Grand Island, Nebraska. During the depression we were again farming. We raised some sugar beets. In the spring of 1936 it was so dry we had to irrigate before we planted the beet seed, and we irrigated all through the summer.

In the spring of 1936 Dave's brother Ira, married to my cousin Mary, moved to Albany, Oregon. We told them if they liked it out west, we would move out too. So in the fall of 1936 Dave and I with five of our children (our youngest was born in Oregon) left for our new home out west. The last of November we loaded our most necessary possessions on a Chevy truck and left our home and family in Wood River. It was a long, hard trip. It seemed we would never reach Albany, Oregon. On December 7, 1936 we reached our destination.

What a disappointment! We expected to see lush green fields; instead everything looked so dry. How we wished we could turn around and go back home. But we were here and here we had to stay.

We lived in the Albany area, and attended the Fairview Mennonite Church for about four years. We then moved to Sweet Home. Western Mennonite High School had just opened. We wanted our younger children to have the opportunity of a Christian education; so in 1947 we moved to this area.

In 1957, after Dave was sick from Parkinson's disease, we had a sale and left the farm. Dave and I moved to Lebanon, Oregon in 1960. For a number of years I was employed, on a part-time basis, at the Lebanon Community Hospital. We attended the Lebanon Mennonite Church. April 11, 1969 Dave passed away. He is buried at the Fairview Mennonite cemetery.

Two of my daughters and I have a home in Lebanon. Special times for me are having my children, grand children and great grandchildren all together, whether it is at our home in Lebanon, or another home or at a camp-out at the beach. We, as a family, enjoy playing, sharing, praying and singing together. A special hobby of mine is piecing and quilting quilts. I really enjoy going to the different Mennonite church sewing groups, or to a friend's home to help quilt. One of my goals is to make a quilt for each of my grandchildren.

As a family we have had our disappointments and sorrows but God has been faithful. He has truly blessed me with a loving, caring family."

Grandson Lowell Stutzman reported that "Grandma is still using a 'starter' for her bread that she has had since 1924."

"I, Marian (Boshart) Beckler was the fifth child born to Daniel B. and Mattie (Ulrich) Boshart on November 20, 1903 in Milford, Nebraska. My husband, Ira Beckler was the eighth child born to Peter and Lovina (Stutzman) Beckler on January 18, 1902 in Milford. The Peter Beckler family moved to Wood River, Nebraska in 1905 or 1906, and the Dan Boshart family moved to Wood River in March of 1907. Ira and I grew up in the same community, attended the same Mennonite church and were both baptized in the Wood River Mennonite Church by Bishop J. E. Zimmerman. On October 20, 1921, we were united in marriage in the same church by Bishop Dan G. Lapp.

After our marriage we started farming in the Wood River area. In February of 1931 we moved to Thurman, Colorado where we again were engaged in farming and raising cattle and milking cows. We lived there for seven years, encountered several years of dust storms and also the depression years. In February 1938 we moved to Albany, Oregon. The first two years Ira worked as a day laborer. After this we started farming again -- milking cows and raising chickens. In 1956 we sold the farm and purchased a Livestock Sales Barn. We managed this for a number of years. Ira and our son Delmar were the auctioneers. After selling the auction business we retired on a small acreage still running a few cattle, but as Ira's health began failing, we quit the cattle business completely.

Ira was stricken with Parkinson's disease and required much care for several years. He was completely helpless for about two years, but the Lord granted me the health and strength to care for him in our home until the Lord called him

home on February 2, 1976. Our son Clifford was a very big help in caring for Ira, as he was living with us. He helped put him to bed and also helped get him dressed in the morning. Without his help, I could not have kept Ira at home. Naomi, our daughter, lives just a few miles from our home and when I needed help during the day when Cliff was at work, she came and helped me. I often thank the Lord for our family; they have all been such a help in time of need. Ira and I shared the joys and sorrows of life for over 54 years.

Another time of great sorrow came on May 31, 1976, when our daughter Ardis and family met up with a tragic automobile accident. Ardis, her husband Jim and their oldest son Ronald were killed. The five remaining children were all hospitalized, some in critical condition. But again we thanked the Lord for His goodness as the children have all recovered very well.

As a family we enjoyed many happy hours together. We all love to sing and when we get together since the children are married and have families of their own, we spend much time in singing. The grandchildren also love to sing."

Daughter Naomi reports her fond memories when many an evening after supper they sang "till way past bedtime."

MARY ULRICH AND ABSALOM HERSHBERGER

Mary Ulrich, fifth of the Nicholas Ulrich children, was born in Wellesley Township in Ontario, Canada. She was only six or seven years old when the family moved to Nebraska.

At the age of 42 she married a widower, Absalom Hershberger, with eleven children. The youngest was ten and the seven oldest were already married. She had no children of her own but was grandmother to a host of her step-children's children.

Mary and her husband farmed near Milford and later moved to town where they lived at 620 Fifth Street. Mary's mother, Maria (Jantzi) Ulrich, accompanied Mary to the farm and back to town, because Nicholas Ulrich had already died in 1910. Mary was the only one of the Ulrich children to survive her mother. Mary's husband died in 1940 and Mary in 1944 at the age of 71. Both are buried in the East Fairview Mennonite cemetery.

Since Grandmother Ulrich lived with Mary the last years of her life, and since all the others died so young, the nieces and nephews learned to know Mary better than the other members of the Ulrich family. Betty Earnest reported that she remembered Mary very well.

Marilyn (Burkey) Graham wrote, "Since I am the youngest in our family, I have few memories of the larger Ulrich family except for mother's Aunt Mary (Ulrich) Hershberger, whom we visited frequently. I remember walking to her house in Milford, Nebraska. I was especially intrigued with the 'dumb waiter' she had on her back porch which could be lowered into the basement to keep food cool. I remember eating tomato soup at her house, and my sister remembers her beautiful dishes and quilts."

Clara (Hershberger) Miller wrote concerning her step-grandmother, "There are many things I remember about Grandpa and Grandma Hershberger. When I went to high school I would stay at their house when it stormed and the roads were drifted shut. I remember the breakfasts with chocolate oatmeal and brown sugar. Grandma was my Sunday school teacher for several years. We had to memorize John 14. That chapter has been precious to me."

Fannie (Boshart) Stutzman also has pleasant memories of her aunt Mary. "Aunt Mary did not marry until after I was grown. She lived at home with Grandpa and Grandma. She made visits to Grandpa's home very memorable. She would do special things that we children would enjoy, such as dye and hide Easter eggs. After we moved to Wood River, Nebraska, Grandma and Aunt Mary would quite often come and visit us. After Grandpa died Aunt Mary married Ab Hershberger. Grandma stayed with them until she died in 1922. Aunt Mary was a very kind, loving person. I remember her as a very special aunt. Most of my children had the privilege of meeting her. They too remember her as a very dear aunt."

BARBARA ULRICH AND BENJAMIN ROTH

Barbara Ulrich was the youngest of the Nicholas Ulrich family to reach adulthood. Her two younger sisters died of diphtheria the same day when Barbara was ten years old. Her baby brother escaped the diphtheria but died seven years later.

Barbara married Benjamin Roth in 1896. Ben and Barbara farmed near Milford, Nebraska (S $\frac{1}{2}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , 14-9-3).

Barbara gave birth to six children, and in 1911, when little Esther was only seven months old and Magdalena, the oldest, was only fourteen, Barbara died. The children's aunt Mattie Boshart took Esther along home with her, and the family lost both mother and sister. When Aunt Mattie died six years later, Esther returned to her father's family, and the Boshart children suffered the loss of a mother and sister.

Fannie (Boshart) Stutzman wrote concerning Barbara:

"I remember Aunt Barbara as a very dear person. We children always enjoyed going to Uncle Ben's home to play with their children. We cousins were all about the same age. On special occasions we would go to Grandpa's place and Aunt Barbara would be there with her children too."

Magdalena (Roth) Sutter shared her childhood memories, especially those related to the trauma of losing her mother:

"Grandpa Ulrich sold his farms and had sale. Mother made me a red calico dress for the sale. My parents lived with my grandparents for six years. Grandpa asked my father to stay with him to help him get his debts paid -- one of his in-laws got him in pretty bad. Grandpa kept 28 acres and built a house and out buildings and moved about one quarter mile from our home. I was five years old then; so I was close to Grandpas through a lot of my years.

My mother died when she was 37 years old. She was concerned for her children, especially Esther. It was not her will that she would not be raised by her. It was sad to give her up. Esther said often she did not feel like she belonged to us. Mother was sick for some time with gall stones. She had severe pain and would put heat on her side. She would say to me, 'When I hear you come, I start to feel better already.' She finally had surgery and died 48 hours later. We were at her bedside -- Nick and I. Some of the family did not want us to, but we were there anyway.

Ezra was a very lonesome boy when evening would come and time to go to bed. He would lay on the

floor and not want to be undressed for bed. He would say, 'If Mama would be here I would go to bed, but them ugly men just put her in that deep hole.' He was three years old."

Ruth (Sutter) Yoder reported that about 1970 Dan and Lena Sutter and three daughters -- Ruth, Myrtle and Dorothy travelled to Kitchener, Ontario. They found the house where Magdalena's mother, Barbara (Ulrich) Roth, was born. It was a log cabin. They each took a piece of bark from the cabin as a souvenir.

Ben and the family carried on farming after Barbara's death. Ben did not remarry. Barbara and Ben are buried in the East Fairview Mennonite Church cemetery south of Milford.

Shirley (Jantzi) Boshart sent an article from the Kalona News (February 5, 1981) in which was reprinted a card given by the teacher, H. E. Vincent, to his pupils of the Stauffer School, Dist. No. 73, Seward County, Nebraska in 1906. The card listed the 82 pupils in the school that year. Those found in this genealogy were: Marvin Danner, John Erb, Fannie Boshart, Cinda Hershberger, Eddie Hershberger, Dan Sutter, Willie Boshart, Amos Boshart and Paul Hershberger. Almost all of the 82 children were obviously of Amish Mennonite families. The article was written by "Bill Jr." whom we have not been able to identify. We quote the following:

"This photo and card was given to us by Grandpa Sutter\* who attended School there at that time and now he is 88 years old, and Grandma Sutter also attended Stauffer School a few years later. School those days was much different than school is now a days as there were no nice warm buses to ride in and most children walked several miles and one thing I miss these days is the ringing of the old school bell. They would always ring what they called the 8:30 bell and the 8:55 bell and also the final 9:00 o'clock bell when school would begin and the ball players used to try and be at school on the old ball diamond by 8:30 so sides could be chosen and a ball game enjoyed before school started in the morning.

I also remember how cold it used to be on Monday morning in those old country school houses during the winter months as no fire would be kept during the weekend and the teacher would usually board some place in the district and walk to school and start fire on Monday morning. The first hour of school on a cold Monday morning was spent marching up and down between the seats to the music of an old hand crank Victrola till the seats were warm enough to sit down on."

D. Mabel U. Roth

About her early childhood, Mabel (Roth) Erb made the following comments:

"I was six years old when my mother died. Our father kept us together except for the baby, Esther, who was raised by Mattie Boshart until seven years old and then returned home.

Mother was sick so much that I spent much of my first six years at Grandpa and Grandma Ulrich's home. After Mother died, Grandma Ulrich spent a lot of time helping with our home and family."

"Mabel U. Roth and Louis M. Erb were married in February, 1923, at Mabel's home by Joe Zimmerman. They lived in the Ab Hershberger farmhouse for the summer and leased 80 acres from Jerry Hershberger which they farmed with horses. Lou also hauled milk for the Milford Dairy with horses and used a truck only when the roads were fit. In the fall they moved in with Mabel's folks for the winter, and during this time Milton was born. In the spring they moved to the Charlie West farm which they rented and farmed for three years. After this they quit farming and had sale.

After the sale, they moved to Milford and Lou hauled coal for a year for the Soldiers and Sailors Home. Then they again took up farming on the Dillenback farm east of Milford for four years. During this time Illa Mae was born.

Several more moves were made: to the Bill Klien farm, the Bill Miller farm, the Watson farm near Beaver Crossing, then back to the Schultz farm west of Milford. Ronald was born during the Watson farm stay, and on this farm Lou purchased his first John Deere tractor. These were also the seven dry years; so Lou worked on the WPA doing

road work to help buy groceries. Milt also went to Iowa to help pick corn to help the family finances.

In 1948 they purchased a 78-acre farm near Grover. This house had their first furnace. Here they farmed, raised pigs, chickens and milked an average of 20 cows. The milk was pasteurized and delivered to Milford by the gallon in Lou's white Nifco milk truck. Later the cows were sold and Lou started delivering milk for Rolfsmeier Dairy in Milford to the schools, cafes and door to door.

In June, 1961, the farm in Grover was sold to W. O. Stephens, and they purchased a home at 711 2nd Street and moved to Milford. This house had a great luxury -- their first real bathroom. Lou kept on delivering milk for Rolfsmeiers to schools and cafes, but door-to-door delivery was discontinued for health reasons.

Lou and Mabel took their first vacation in 1963 to the Black Hills of South Dakota. Other trips were made to Colorado and Wyoming, plus the trips to Iowa.

On October 25, 1968, Lou was taken to the Seward Memorial Hospital with a heart condition, and he passed away October 26, 1968 of a heart attack. Mabel started doing house work in Lincoln at age 52 and worked at this for 22 years. In 1977 she quit the Lincoln jobs and cleans the Bellwood Church." (excerpted from The Louis M.
