JOHN J. AND EMMA (SCHROCK) JANTZE

John J. Jantze was born January 20, 1877. According to family tradition, the Joseph B. Jantzi family went to Nebraska via western Canada and Minnesota, and John was born while they were in Saskatchewan.

The land records show that Joseph B. Jantzi sold his farm in Wellesley Township, Ontario, Canada, on Feb. 15, 1878 and purchased his Seward County farm on March 14, 1878. People sometimes rented out their farm, moved elsewhere, and returned later to sell their property, which is what may have happened in this case.

John J. was only four years old when his father died and 14 when the family also lost their mother. Thus he was thrust on his own resources at a very early age.

In 1901 John married Emma Schrock, daughter of Peter Schrock and Lena Unsicker.

At the time of their death, John and Emma lived at Upland, California. They are buried in the Mausoleum at Ontario, California.

JOSEPH B. AND CATHERINE (JAUST) JANTZE FAMILY

Amos J. Jantze was the first of the Joseph B. Jantzi children to be born in Seward County, near Milford, Nebraska. Joseph B. purchased his farm in March, and Amos was born in July of 1878.

Amos was only three years old when his father died and not yet thirteen when his mother also died.

January 4, 1900, Amos married Katherine Zimmer-

man, daughter of Christian Zimmerman and Rosalene Eicher.

It is from Amos, as told to Larry Jantze, that we have the story that they saw the name Jantze on a feed bag which came from Canada, and thus decided that this must be the correct spelling of their name. The children of Joseph B. Jantzi all adopted this spelling and have used it ever since.

The obituary of Amos Jantze as it appeared in the Gospel Herald:

"He was born near Milford, Nebr., July 20, 1878, the son of Joseph and Catherine (Yousi) Jantze; passed away at his home in Milford, Nebr., Oct. 20, 1952 as the result of a heart ailment; aged 74 y. 3 m. He united with the Mennonite Church early in life, having his membership first with the East Fairview congregation near Milford, Nebr., and since 1926 in the Milford A.M. Church, where he was a faithful member until death. On Jan. 4, 1900, he was united in marriage to Katie Zimmerman. To this union were born 4 sons and one daughter. He was a loving husband and father, always concerned about the welfare of his family. Surviving are his wife, 3 sons (Ralph, Vernon, and Lee, all of Milford, Nebr.), one daughter (Edith--Mrs. Elmon Bontrager, Milford, Nebr.), one brother (John, Upland, Calif.), 2 sisters (Mrs. Catherine Hershberger, Seward, Nebr.; and Sarah--Mrs. Joe Hershberger, Milford, Nebr.), 11 grandchildren, and many other relatives and friends. His parents, one son (Joseph), one sister (Rachel--Mrs. William Beckler), and one brother (Jonas) preceded him in death. Funeral services were held Oct. 22 at the Milford A. M. Church in charge of W. A. Eicher, assisted by William R. Eicher and Oliver Roth. Burial was made in the Milford A. M. Cemetery."

CHRISTIAN AND CATHERINE (BOSHART, JANTZI) RISER FAMILY

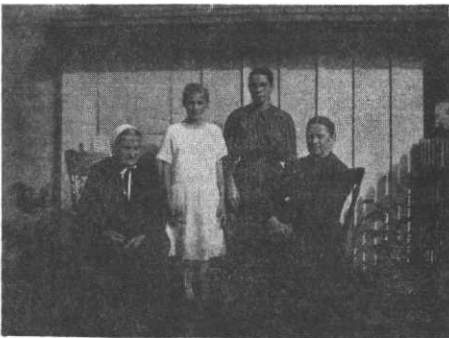
In the introduction to this book we have already discussed the marriage of Christian Riser to the widow Catherine (Boshart) Jantzi. In the early writings the name frequently appears with a German "f" which is usually translated "ss." Aleida (Jantzi) Brunk remembered discussions concerning the spelling of the name. Her uncle David Riser argued that in the statement "Jesus is risen," risen is written with one "s." Therefore, Riser, which has the same sound, should also be written with one "s." Since David was the only one in the family who continued to use the name, we have chosen to use that spelling consistently.

Christian and Catherine lived on Lot #2 E $\frac{1}{2}$, Con. III, West Section, Wellesley Township. To the west of their farm was a rather steep hill which came to be known as Risser's Hill. The local residents still call it by that name although they have long forgotten the source. Katie (Leis) Schwartzentruber remembered how treacherous it was to go over that hill with a horse and buggy.

Of Christian and Catherine's five children, two daughters and David survived childhood. Catherine died at their home in Wellesley Township and is buried at the Poole Mennonite Cemetery. Christian was living with Annie and Joseph Brunk at the time of his death and is buried in the St. Agatha Mennonite cemetery.

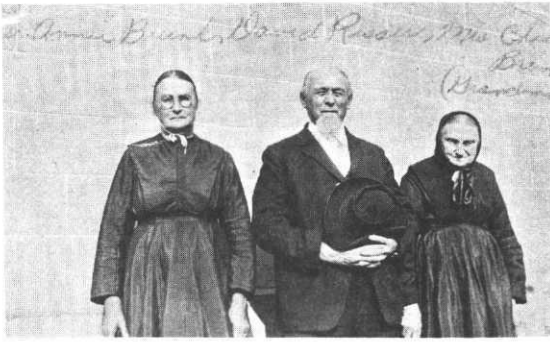

MAGDALENA RISER AND CHRISTIAN BRUNK

The two Riser girls, Magdalena and Annie, married Brunk brothers, sons of Peter Brunk and Catherine Ernst. Christian and Magdalena (Riser) Brunk resided at Musselburg, a little hamlet less than a mile east of the hamlet of Poole in Mornington Township, Perth County. Christian was a carpenter. Eleven children were born to Christian and Magdalena, but two of them died in childhood of diphtheria. Christian and Magdalena were members of the Poole Amish Mennonite Church and are buried in the church cemetery north of Poole.

ANNIE RISER AND JOSEPH BRUNK

Annie Riser married Joseph Brunk. From December of 1877 to November, 1880, they resided on a small plot on the west part of Lot #4, Con. II of the West Section of Wellesley Township. Later they lived at Petersburg, where Annie continued to live after her husband's early death at a railway crossing. Annie and Joseph had five children. Two died in childhood of diphtheria (within a day or only hours of each other). Aaron died at age 21 of tuberculosis. Two daughters married and had families. Annie and Joseph were members of the Amish Mennonite Church at St. Agatha and are buried in the cemetery adjoining the church.

with the country. We have good land, a healthy climate and good water....

Land is not yet so dear in this vicinity as it is in other counties, and can still be had at from \$10.00 to \$15.00 per acre. Persons who wish to buy a farm in Nebraska will please visit us and take a look at our land.

Quite a number of Amish Mennonite brethren and sisters have settled here. Our church took its beginning in 1883. Traveling ministers are solicited to visit us when they travel westward.

We had the pleasure lately, of welcoming Bro. Andrew Naffzinger and wife¹ of Canada in our midst. They expect to settle here.

On the 3rd of March we opened our Sunday-school. The scholars attended pretty regularly. The average attendance was between 20 and 25, and we intend to close it on the 27th of October. David Riser was elected Superintendent, Christian Riser² teacher of the Testament class and Jacob Erb teacher of the junior class. May God bless these three brethren who have labored so faithfully during the past summer to instruct the young in the word of God.

Last Sunday we had meeting for public worship, on which occasion quite a number of brethren and sisters were present. The opening remarks were made by Pre. John Beller, after which Pre. Valentine Garber (Gerber) held a very edifying discourse from Acts 7...."

It was thought that David and Fannie had only three children, who died in infancy. Two of them died within four days of diphteria. One tombstone in the O'Neill Mennonite cemetery has inscribed the names and dates of all three children. According to the obituaries, however, David and Fannie had an adopted son, Frank Riser. To date, we have not found any of his descendants.

The obituaries of David and Fannie appeared in the Gospel Herald, and excerpts are printed here

"David, son of Christian and Kathryn (Boshart) Riser, was born at Wellesley, Ont., Sept. 23, 1858; died at his home in Milford, Neb., May 19, 1936; aged 77 y. 8 m. 4 d. At the age of 17 years he gave his heart to Christ and was baptized and united with the Amish Mennonite Church, in which faith he remained true until death. His health had been failing for several years, and his only desire was to be removed to his heavenly home. On Dec. 3, 1882, he was united in marriage to Veronica Ernst. In the year 1886 they moved from Canada to Holt Co., Nebr., where they lived till 1916. Then they moved to Milford, Nebr. This union was blessed with 2 sons and 1 daughter who preceded him in their childhood. He also had 1 adopted son, Frank Riser of Friend, Nebr. He leaves his loving companion, adopted son, 4 grandchildren, 1 sister (Anna Brunk of Kitchener, Ont.), and a host of relatives and friends to mourn his loss. Funeral services were held at the Milford A. M. Church in Milford, Nebr., on May 21, 1936. Bro. Wm. Schlegel preached the funeral sermon. Text, Heb. 9:27. Burial at Milford A. M. cemetery."

"Veronica (Fannie) Ernst was born at Wellesley, Ont., Nov. 7, 1862; passed away Nov. 19, 1944, at the home of her adopted son, Frank Riser, near Friend, Nebr., where she had made her home and was cared for the past two years; aged 82 y. 12 d. In her youth she was baptized and united with the Amish Mennonite Church, in which faith she remained until death....She leaves her adopted son, 3 granddaughters (Mrs. John George and Mrs. Al Spadt of Lincoln, Nebr.; and Mrs. Elmer Huber of Richmond, Va.), one grandson (Francis Riser, somewhere in England), 2 great-grandchildren, and 2 sisters (Mrs. Mary Roseler of Boulder, Colo; and Mrs. Susan Kubichek of O'Neill, Nebr.), besides many other relatives and friends. Funeral services were held Nov. 22, at the Milford A. M. Church, in charge of W. A. Eicher, Text, Job 14:14. Interment was made in the Milford A. M. cemetery."

Information on John (1810-1876) and Anna Ulrich is very scant. One story of John's early life, which Lena (Roth) Sutter related to Ruth Ryan is as follows: John Ulrich escaped from the war in France. War wagons were kept in sheds with holes augured in the sides for the wagon tongues. John hid in one of the sheds until night, then crawled through one of the holes. He said he never knew how he got through such a small hole.

A great grandson, Benjamin Ulrich, described John's coming to Canada:

"The Ulrichs came to Canada from France in 1832 in a group (other families in the group are unknown to me) to New York City, went by boat up the Hudson River to the Erie Canal where they transferred to a barge, which was hauled by horses and mules in a single line along the canal, called the tow-path, to Lockport, N.Y. Here the barge was raised up for Lake Erie. They then went to Port Dover, Berlin and west to Waterloo, Baden and to a town called Voole, Canada.¹ Near there the government was practically giving land away to families who wanted to settle down and farm it."²

On April 5, 1840, John Ulrich was married in Wilmot Township to Anna Yausy (Jausi) from New York state by Bishop John Oesch.³ It may be that she was a sister to John Jausi whose daughter, Catherine, married Joseph B. Jantzi. (See page 320) On March 12, 1842, John Ulrich received the Patent for 50 acres at Lot 22 N Snyder's Road in Wilmot Township. Since these patents were not issued until the settlers had completed their land-clearing and building duties, Ben's story of John's arrival in the 1830s is quite likely correct. His comment that "the government was practically giving land away" was also correct. This area of Wilmot Township had been a Crown Reserve. Governor Maitland had promised Christian Nafziger, the leader of the Amish Mennonite migration from Europe, that the settlers would be granted 50 acres free if they cleared the roadway in front of a 200-acre lot, cleared ten acres and built a house of certain dimensions. The remainder of the lot could be purchased whenever the settler was able to pay. This, however, did not apply to the land in Wellesley Township.

John and Anna's oldest son, Nicholas was born in 1841. Two daughters, Magdalena and Anna (also

referred to as Nanneth) were also born in Wilmot Township. In July of 1848, John Ulrich sold his 50 acres to a Peter Sommer. It is likely that the family moved into Wellesley Township at that time. The Ulrichs appear in the 1851 census of Wellesley Township. Although this part of the country was a Clergy Reserve and not officially open to settlement, many people were moving in as "squatters." The area was popularly known as the "Queen's Bush." However, John did not get his deed from the Crown for this 100 acres (Lot #3 W $\frac{1}{2}$, Concession II, West Section) until 1874. The youngest son, John was born in September of 1848, the only one of the Ulrich children born in Wellesley Township.

We'll now let Ben continue the story:

"So they were able to obtain 160 acres.⁴ They built a house and barn on the back end of the land where there was a good spring of water. Right away they planted an apple orchard, sold apples and made apple butter for their own use. Soon other settlers came a distance to purchase apple butter.⁵

In October, 1945, I took time off from my hospital work in Mt. Clemens, Mich. and went to Voole (Poole), Canada. I arrived there in the evening and enquired for a party by the name of Yancey (Jantzi), but he was not at home; so I located an old-timer and stayed with him for the night. The next day he went with me to see if we could locate my grandparents' graves. He took me to the Ulrich farm. They had built a more up-to-date house and barn nearer the highway.

We then went on the back end of the farm where the old original house and barn had stood. I saw a hole or cellar where the house had stood, and a few old weather-beaten trees nearby. The old-timer said the house was built of planks and painted red. He said his mother came to cook for the men when they raised the barn.

We went back to the occupants of the newer house nearer the road. They showed me some papers and maps of the farm, and cemetery across the highway from the house. He showed me about where the graves were. It was all grown up with brush and briars."⁶

¹Port Dover is on the northern shore of Lake Erie. Berlin is now Kitchener. Waterloo is a city adjacent to Kitchener, but it was also the name of the county in which are found the cities of Kitchener and Waterloo. Baden is a village near which the Ulrichs first settled. "Voole" is probably Poole in Morningson Township, Perth County. It is a small hamlet near which the Ulrichs settled in the late 1840s.

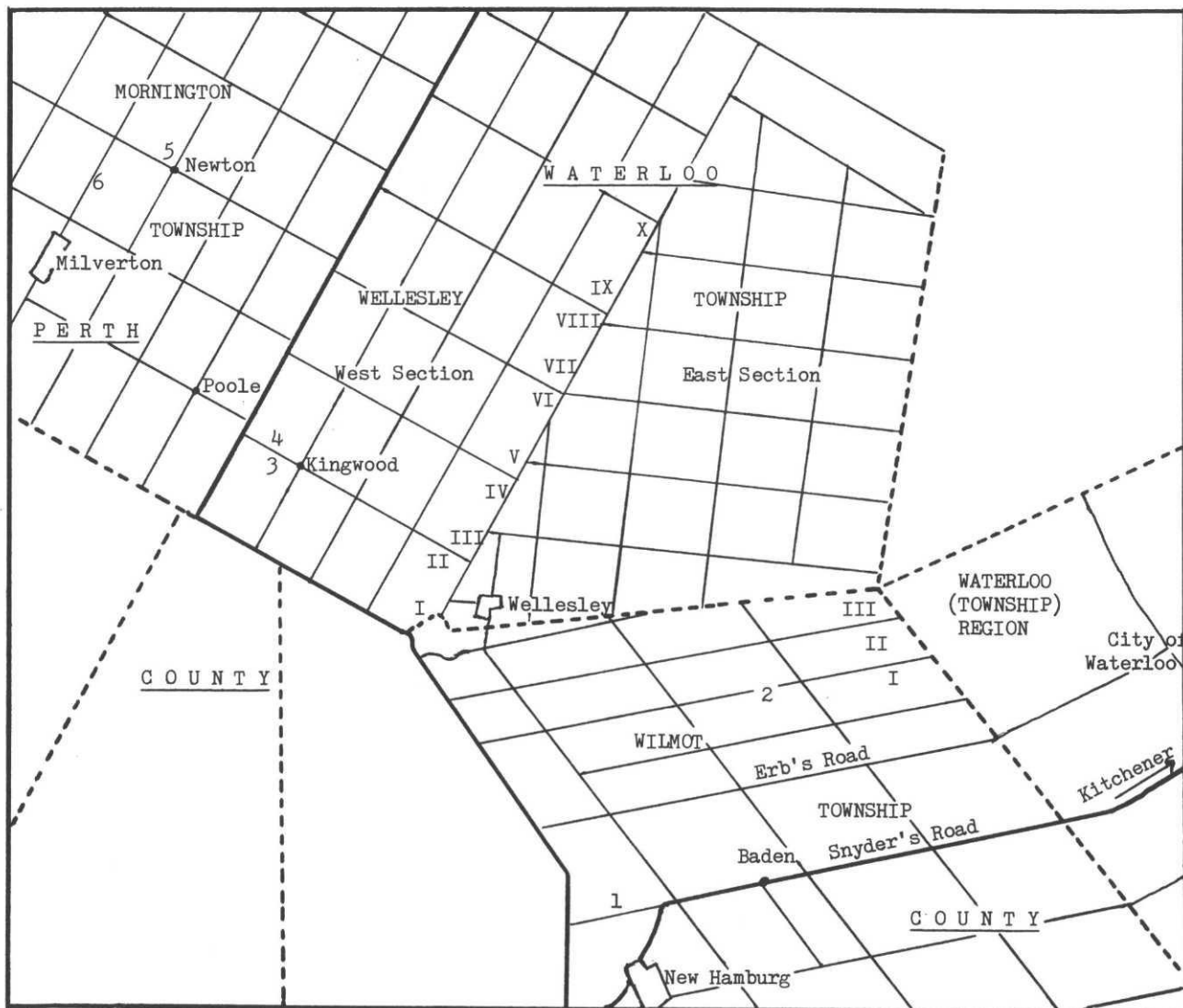
²From a letter written in 1968 to Ben's nephew, Sidney Herzig. Some of Ben's details are somewhat misplaced, but the general story is probably correct.

The southeast corner of the Jantzi-Riser farm and the northwest corner of the Ulrich farm came together at the road known as the Third Line, Wellesley. It is not difficult to imagine how Nicholas and Magdalena Ulrich found their mates -- Maria Jantzi and Christian B. Jantzi. Nicholas and Maria were married in 1861 and Magdalena and Christian B. Jantzi in 1862. In 1863, 17-year-old Anna died and is likely buried across the road. Between 1861 and 65, the youngest son, John, made his way to Lewis County, New York and married Mary Yancey, daughter of Peter, half-brother of

Joseph Jantzi, the ancestor of the family featured in this book.

After their marriage Nicholas and Maria probably lived part of the time with Nicholas' parents, and in 1874, Nicholas bought the farm from his father. On February 4, 1876 John died, and according to tradition is buried across the road on the Jantzi-Riser farm.¹ In 1879 Nicholas sold the farm to John Kennel (first cousin to Maria) and moved to Milford, Nebraska. Anna Ulrich accompanied Nicholas and his family. She died in 1883 and is buried in the East Fairview Mennonite cemetery.

¹The date of his death is found in the family Bible. No tombstones remain in the burial plot.

The date and age at time of death is found in the Wilmot-Wellesley Amish Mennonite Congregational record book. The cause of death is listed as "Narfen Viebar." Contagious Nervenfieber, according to the dictionary, is typhus. It may be that her illness was typhoid fever. Lena (Roth) Sutter reported that she was 17 when she died and was working for Nicholas and Maria Ulrich when she took sick.

JOHN AND MARY (YANCEY) ULRICH FAMILY

John Ulrich, born September 16, 1848, was the fourth and youngest child of John and Anna Ulrich. Since the Ulrichs sold their farm in Wilmot in July of that year, it seems quite certain that John was born in the virgin forest of Wellesley Township. John's older brother and sister married in 1861 and 62 and Anna, just older than John, died in 1863. What may have prompted John Jr. to go to Lewis County, New York? That we will probably never know, but we will let his son Ben tell the story as he remembered hearing it.

"Pa told me he came to New York State from Canada at the time Abraham Lincoln was President (1861-1865). He had \$700¹ in Canadian money and had it converted to United States money. The bank gave him \$300 more, which made \$1,000. Later he owned a farm and sawmill on Beaver River, a short distance down the river from the Village of Belfort."

John married Mary Yancey, daughter of Peter and Magdalena (Zehr) Yancey. Peter was a half-brother to Joseph Jantzi, father of Maria and Christian B. who married Nicholas and Magdalena Ulrich, respectively.

Sidney Herzig, grandson of John and Mary, researched the location of the sawmill on the Beaver River and reported the following:

"The Lewis County Clerk's office shows that John and Mary Ulrich bought from Nicholas & Catherine Tiss 26 acres on Balsam Creek and Beaver River.

An Atlas of Lewis County, New York -- 1875, and also a Survey made by Whitlock's, New Haven, Conn. -- 1875, of all the businesses in the Town of Croghan, N.Y. lists: John Ulrich, farmer and proprietor of Saw Mill, P. O. Croghan, N.Y. The

¹If John went to New York before 1865, he was less than 17 years old. One would question whether he had been sent off with that much money at that age. It is more likely that he received the \$700 when he came of age (in 1869) or at the death of his father in 1876. Since he had a sawmill by 1875, perhaps he received some money when his father sold the farm in 1874.

farm and sawmill were down the Beaver River a short distance from the Village of Belfort, where Balsam Creek empties into the river at the water falls in the river, which provided excellent water power for the sawmill. A dirt road called High Falls Road passed through here to Belfort from Croghan. At the time, a family by the name of Frank Monnat lived nearby and became good friends of the Ulrich family.

All this area in later years has been under water, caused by the J. P. Lewis Paper Co. and Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation building a large dam and power house. The section is called High Falls. John and Mary Ulrich sold the farm and sawmill to Mary S. Pate."

We continue with Ben's account:

"In the spring of 1881 John Ulrich decided to go further into the woods where he would be nearer to the big timber and not so costly getting the logs to the sawmill for lumber -- mostly pine and hemlock. They went about two miles from the outlet of Long Pond to a stream where they had to build roads and a dam for a pond to store logs and operate the sawmill by water power. It was called 'The Millpond.'

In late summer or fall 1881, after a log cabin was built, John Ulrich, his wife Mary and three children -- Anna, Peter and Mattie -- moved from High Falls to their new home called The Ulrich Sawmill, Long Pond, Town of Croghan, N.Y. Anna and Peter went to school at Belfort and stayed with Peter and Magdaline (Zehr) Yancey, their grandparents. Peter Yancey owned and operated a grist mill at Belfort where the tail race is now for the power plant. The farmers had very little money to pay for grinding the corn, buckwheat and oats; so the farmers gave Peter an equal amount of flour for the cost of the grinding. Money was very scarce and no paper money. The working men in the woods would sign an order to have money taken out of their pay. A lot of it went for whiskey, which was plenty.

My brother John was the first one born, November 25, 1881 in the log cabin. I (Ben) was the next one born there March 5, 1885. Sometime later the log cabin caught fire and burned to the ground. I was the baby at the time. About 1887 a temporary wood frame house was built nearer the road where sisters Minnie and Louise were born.

Still later they built a warmer winter house. Your dad (Fred Herzig) and Theodore Brant were building cottages at Number Four for a Mr. and Mrs. Fenton. They would come over through the woods and do the carpenter work at our house. A thick-set German from Beaver Falls did the mason work such as plastering. No doubt he was Augustus Heimhilder. And a man from Croghan did the painting. This house was built very good and warm. You (Sidney) were born in this house.

I remember when Clarence Putnam came to survey a line on the east side of Desard Pond, which was further in the woods, that I worked for him carrying the chains. We stayed in an old camp in the woods. Men who used to hunt around there said the pond was haunted. About this time a man drowned in the pond. My brother Peter drove the horses when they brought the body out of the woods on a buck-board wagon to Croghan.

After the winter house was built we did not move further into the woods anymore to cut logs for the mill. We let the logging and cutting out to sub-jobbers. In the spring the logs were floated on the pond to the sawmill.

I remember Pa said there were Indians around Long Pond. One of them caught a white man and said, 'I gotcha.' From then on the river was called Oswegatchie River. After that, whenever I was in the woods alone I feared like there was something telling me 'Watch out.'

At this time it was legal to trap and kill any animal in the woods. One day two men stopped at the sawmill. One had his foot caught in a bear trap. I could see where it had cut through his shoe and into the flesh of his foot. Ma gave it medical attention and they went on their way. One of the men was Joe Ardison.

I remember when we were living in the woods it was legal to hunt deer with dogs. Many wealthy men from New York, Syracuse and Utica would come to hunt deer and usually brought their own dogs. When they hunt they would take their dog on a leash in the woods, find a fresh deer track and let the dog loose. The dog would pick up the scent of the deer and start barking and chase until the deer would find a body of water to swim across to get away from the dogs. The hunter would station himself at a trail where the deer were in the habit of traveling to a body of water, and wait until the dog and deer appeared. He would then shoot his deer.

Some of the hunters would leave their dogs with Pa to board and take care of them until they would come to hunt again. The hunters did not stay at our house. They stayed at what was called the Long Pond House on Long Pond, about two miles away from our home. Your mother, Anna, worked there at one time. It is now owned by the Future Farmers of America."

John Ulrich must also have made shingles. Arlene Yousey found an entry in her grandfather's diary in 1892 saying he drove from Kirscherville to the Ulrich Mill at Long Pond and got 12 packs of shingles.

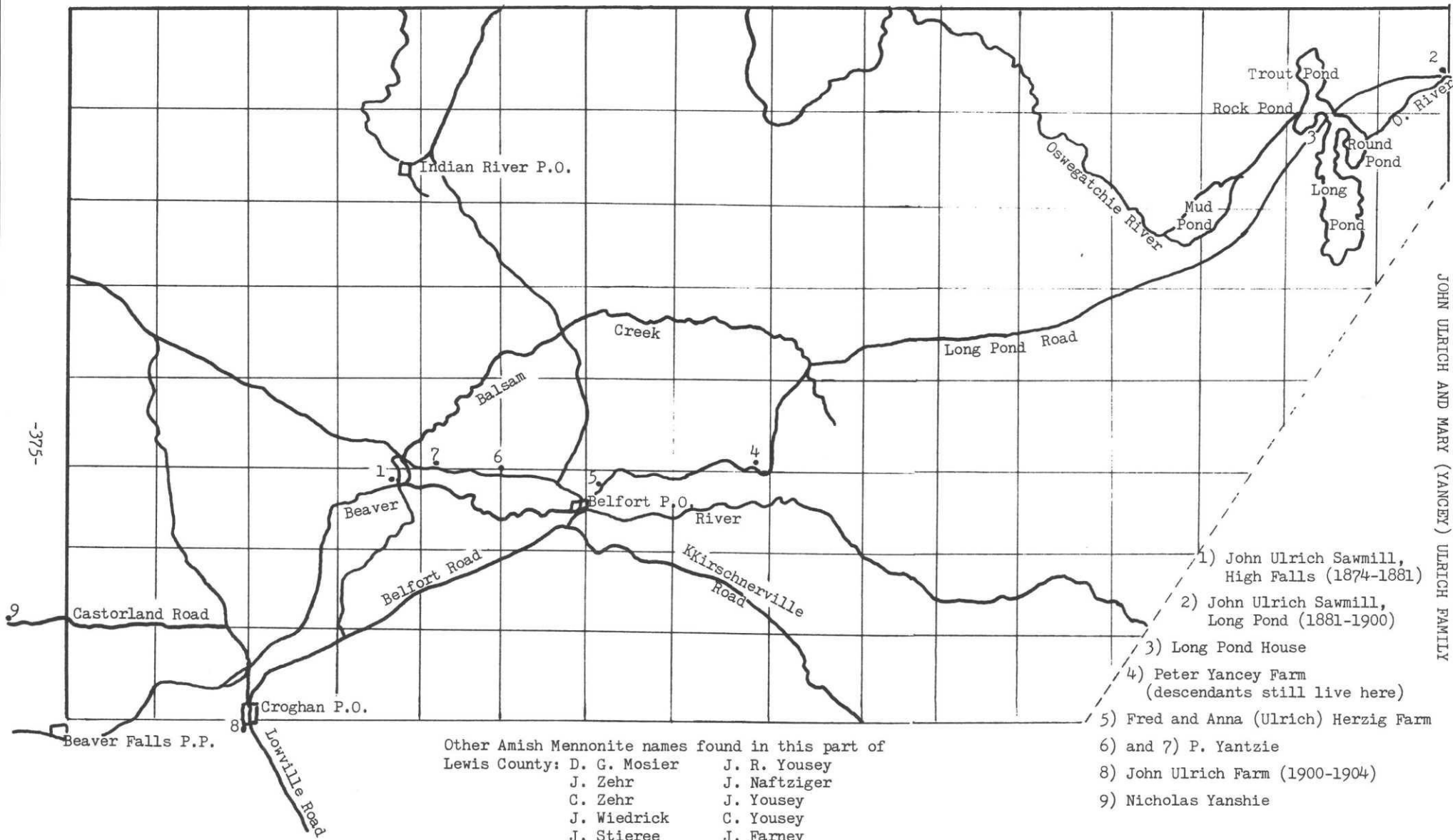
We continue with Ben's description of life at Long Pond:

"I also remember my sister Mattie and I used to pick wild raspberries and take them to the Long Pond House to sell for 5¢ to 10¢ a quart. This was a delicacy for the people from the city. Sometimes the cook would give us a cookie as well.

My mother went through a lot when we were in the woods. Pa had a serious accident one time when he fell on the saw which made a deep cut in his leg. Another time he became very sick and lay on his back for six months. He weighed only 75 pounds. The doctors charged \$10.00 a trip from Croghan and \$21.00 from Lowville. Ma made up her mind the work was too much for her and too expensive to get a doctor to travel that far."

Sidney's research carries forward the story:

"Records in the Lewis County Clerk's office show that John Ulrich sold the sawmill property, Long

 Pond, to Alexander Compo December 26, 1901.

Also records in the Lewis County Clerk's office show that March 30, 1899 George P. Becker sold a parcel of land to John Ulrich just outside the Village of Croghan at Black Creek on the Lowville-Croghan Road for \$2,500.

In view of such records it appears the Ulrich family moved out of the woods about 1900 or 1901. They built a house and barn on this property and started dairy farming. Some of the lumber was sawed at the sawmill in the woods before moving out. Kenneth and his wife, Lila (Gingerich) Widrick, a great grandson of John Ulrich now own and operate the farm.

According to a warranty deed dated March 31, 1904, the Ulrichs sold the farm to Alpheuse Virkler, Croghan, N.Y.; consideration \$4,025.

Uncle Ben said in one of his letters he was sure they moved to Pigeon, Michigan the first week of April, 1904."

No explanation is given as to why John and Mary Ulrich decided to move to Michigan, but Ben described the event as follows:

"There were two car-loads of freight. My brother Peter and I stayed with the cars (railroad cars) so we could take care of the cattle and horses.

When we arrived at Detroit we found there was a flood in the 'thumb of Michigan.' A railroad bridge had washed out. So they transferred us to the Michigan Central where new papers were made out before we could leave the Lapeer Cattle Yards. This held us up one more day.

When we arrived at the farm at Pigeon, Michigan, one mile from the village, there was clay, mud and more mud all over the place. The barn stood in mud; therefore we had to build a stone wall at once to set it on. There were no paved roads at that time. They farmed it with registered Brown Swiss cows and raised acres of sugar beets, seed corn and navy beans."

The John Ulrich family were first members of the Pigeon River Amish Mennonite Church but changed their membership to Berne (now Michigan Avenue Mennonite).¹ According to Louise (Ulrich) Wideman, they moved to Imlay City, Michigan in 1920 or 21. John died there on November 4, 1924. He is buried in the Bethany Mennonite Church cemetery.

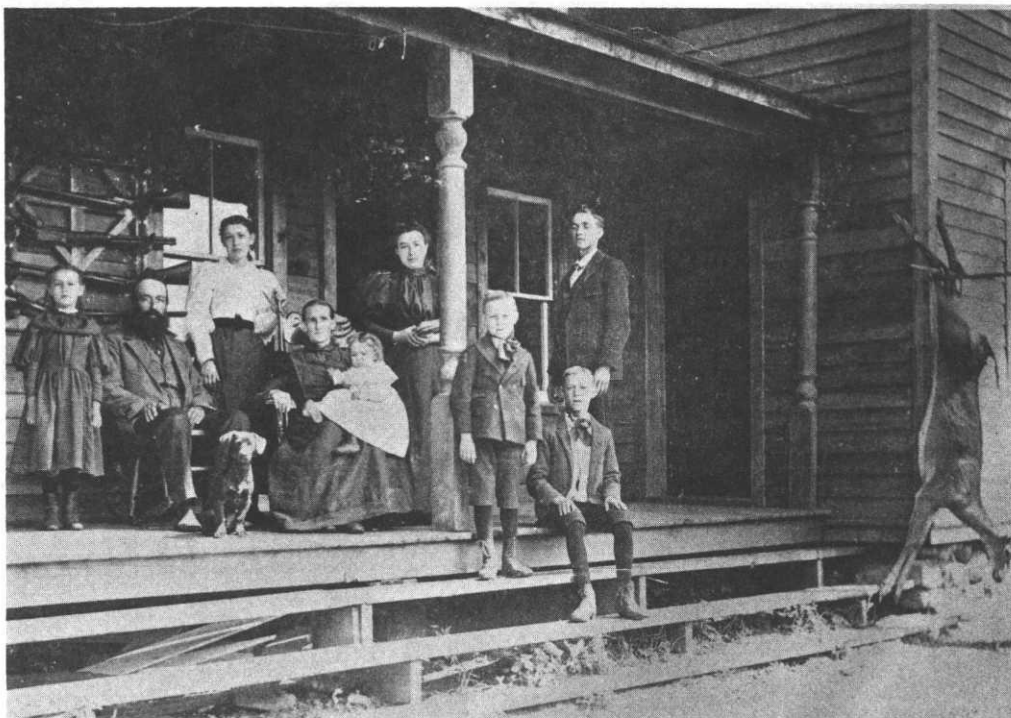
Anna, John and Mary Ulrich's oldest daughter, was already married by the time the family moved to Michigan. She and her husband Fred Herzig remained in Lewis County, New York. Sons Peter and John Ulrich eventually returned to Lewis County. Mattie and her husband Daniel Albrecht and Ben Ulrich went to Imlay City, Michigan. Mattie and Ben are buried there.

Arlene (Wideman) Snyder reported: "In 1927, Mom and Dad (Louise and Richard Wideman), Grandma Ulrich, Leona and Leon (first two children of Louise and Richard) moved to Akron, New York, on a farm. Grandma Ulrich made her home with us until she passed away." She died June 12, 1941 and is buried in the Clarence Center Mennonite Church cemetery near Akron, New York.

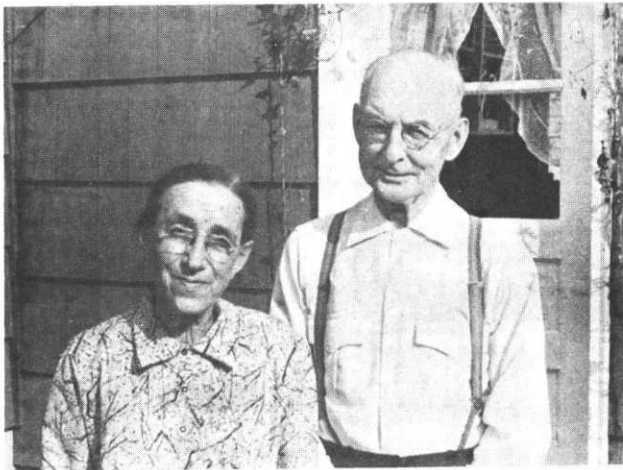

Reminiscences of their Son,

Sidney A. Herzig, February, 1981

My mother's parents came from Canada and settled at Belfort, N.Y. My dad, at the age of 18, came with his parents from Switzerland and settled on Long Pond Road, Belfort, N.Y. My parents, Fred Herzig and Anna Ulrich, were married May 11, 1897 in Beaver Falls Evangelical Church by Rev. P. C. Braunschweig.

For three years after their marriage, my parents lived at Belfort, and Dad did carpenter work. In 1900 they bought the Herzig homestead on Long Pond Road and gradually worked into farming, and Dad did carpenter work as a side line for extra income.

In 1912, Dad built a new barn near the old site and a little nearer the house. And in 1914 and 1915, he completely remodeled the original house. My parents were devoted to one another and to their nine children. Honesty, kindness, punctuality and thrift were stressed to their family.

In those days, with no radio or television and only a biweekly newspaper for news, the evenings were long. Mother spent many hours preparing rags (for rag rugs for cold floors) from leftover materials after making aprons and children's clothing. Dad helped Mother knit socks and mittens for the family, but Dad lacked speed as compared with Mother. She made beautiful quilt tops, and together the family would set up frames and tie off quilts, using wool from their own sheep for the center layer.

Dad spent many hours making deerskin moccasins for the children to wear in the house. At various times he carved or whittled three picture frames (approximately 25" x 30") of cherry wood. With the aid of a ruler and jackknife, he notched five or six separate layers and put them together to form a pyramid effect. One of these framed their marriage certificate.

They were thrifty folks and raised all the meat and vegetables, plus apples from eight or ten trees, with 75 to 100 bushels of potatoes raised and cared for by the family. Mother, Dad, and the family were good wild berry pickers, and many quarts were picked each year for the table and for canning. Before the arrival of winter, the cellar was well stocked to feed a hungry family for what seemed a long winter.

Meals were on time, all off to bed by nine o'clock, and up early in the morning to eat breakfast together with Mother and Dad. Breakfast consisted mainly of either fresh Johnnie Cake or buckwheat pancakes, both with maple syrup from

our own trees. We had to walk one and a half miles to school. We carried our lunch pail with sandwiches, etc., which Mother packed for us.

As some of the children became older and helped with the housework, Mother became an avid flower gardener. Her front yard presented a beautiful picture of flowers that impressed passers-by. They would often slow down to get a broader and more lasting view. House plants were plentiful in winter.

At an early age, my four brothers all worked in the big woods, cutting timber for lumber and paper mills. This was hard work as at that time there were no chain saws or tractors. Everything had to be done with cross-cut saws, axes, cant hook (peavey) and horses. Each spring they would work in large sugar bushes making maple syrup. My four sisters, too, found employment within a few miles of home, and at an early age.

With the careful attention of Mother and Dad, and home remedies, we all escaped the dreadful 1918-1919 influenza epidemic. We also managed to get through the depression of the 1930s without state or federal aid. My parents were very happy when they managed in 1921 to purchase their first automobile -- a new 1921 Chevrolet.

Dad loved to hunt and fish, especially with his boys. Many an overnight trip was spent together in what we called "the shack" in the woods. In later years, Mother, Dad, Edith and I spent many weekends there, which seemed like the times of our lives in that wonderful woods air and next to Nature. Mother did not care to fish but was always happy to go along, and she saw to it that we had plenty to eat -- and well prepared.

Both my parents were faithful members of the Beaver Falls Evangelical Church. Mother was a member of the Ladies Aid Society, and Dad was a steward and trustee for many years. Both were members of the Belfort Grange #533. Dad joined in 1901, Mother in 1921. Mother was a member 26 years, Dad for 56 years.

My parents were proud of their family and ever thankful to God for good health to raise them to maturity. All the children outlived their parents and now live within 50 miles of one another. Mother died March 17, 1948 at age 75 in the home she loved so well. Dad stayed on in his home until three days before his death in a Watertown hospital on June 28, 1957, at the age of 91.

Sidney tells his story:

"One evening, in the latter part of September, 1911, Mother and I were doing the milking, and it was thundering and sprinkling outside. I took a pail with some milk to feed a calf a short distance from the barn. There I leaned on a 'bob-wire' fence with the pail on the ground between my feet while the calf drank its milk. I suddenly saw a flash and went backward to the ground, and the calf and pail went in other directions. After getting my bearings, I got up and ran to the barn as fast as I could and told Mother, and then ran up the hill to the house. That night I perspired terribly all night and felt so weak and wobbly when I tried to walk. As time went on I seemed to get back to normal except that I tired more easily. We pondered then if the perspiration came from the lightning or from fright. I still do not know. My hands were burned wherever they touched the wire fence.

Later, on a Saturday in the early part of November, I plowed all day with a frisky team of horses. That evening I felt a slight pain in the lower part of my right hip. The next morning it was still there only a little worse. Since it was Sunday, I lay down most of the day.

Monday came and I did not go to school. I remember hearing Dad say that if I was not better in the morning we were going to get Dr. Spencer

up from Croghan. I went to bed that night, November 11, 1911, and in the morning I was paralyzed from the hips down. The pain was gone, and I felt good except that I could not move my legs or toes. Of course, they got the doctor right away.

Sometime later, three local doctors diagnosed the trouble as infantile paralysis, and they gave me several shock treatments at home. They advised me to exercise my body and arms as much as I could. I was in bed the rest of the winter until spring when I was able to hobble around on crutches in and out of doors the rest of 1912.

On January 18, 1913, I started school at Beaver Falls. The following May, my grandfather, John Ulrich, came from his farm home in Pigeon, Michigan and took me back home with him, hoping to get better medical attention than perhaps I would get in rural New York. Of course, my grandmother, Mary (Yancey) Ulrich, Uncles John and Ben Ulrich, and Aunt Louise were all there at home at the time.

I started taking medical treatment at once on the advice of a doctor, or clinic in Wisconsin (I believe it was). I do remember I lived on buttermilk and olive oil for one month, also cold sitz baths daily, and once or twice weekly a sweat bath, plus exercising all I could. After

one month of this procedure I started gaining in weight and appetite, and I soon abandoned my crutches and walked with a cane thereafter.

On September 17, 1914, Uncle John and Aunt Minnie Yousey accompanied me by train and horse and buggy back to my parents' farm home on the Long Pond Road, Belfort, N.Y., after spending about 16 happy months at my grandparents' home in Pigeon, Michigan.

December 3, 1918, after finishing school at Beaver Falls, I started working for Peter Shinbourn & Son in Croghan, N.Y., making the famous Croghan Lumberjack Shoes and repairing the same.

December 14, 1920, I opened a shoe repair shop in a small building attached to the Nuffer Block in Beaver Falls and gradually worked into the sale of shoes. I boarded with Mrs. Lydia Nuffer in the same block. When I was married in 1936, we took an apartment in this block also.

February 1, 1922, forty-one members of the I.O.O.F. Lodge chartered the Lowville & Beaver River Railroad for the ten miles to Lowville, N.Y. and return, where I, along with several others, took the Third Degree as a member of the Lodge. There were very few automobiles in the area at the time.

On May 16, 1936, Edith Parshall of Utica, N.Y., and I were married in the Tabernacle Baptist Church there. The previous month I had been appointed Acting Postmaster in Beaver Falls for a four-year term. In 1940 I was appointed Postmaster for a Life Term under a new law and served in that capacity for 27 and a half years until retirement on September 6, 1963. In 1940, I closed the shoe store so as to devote full time to the post office. In 1941, Edith and I attended the regional postmasters' Convention in Boston, Mass.

In 1946, Edith and I attended the local Firemen's annual banquet in the Community Hall, and I was made Honorary Member of the department.

We have always made our home in Beaver Falls. In January of 1963 we bought the former home of Mr. and Mrs. Martin Just, overlooking the Beaver River, and next door to our Grammar School. In spite of my lameness I have had a happy life with never any lengthy pain. I always tried to look on the bright side of life. When I would go anywhere I could see people worse off than myself. I feel I have had a fairly normal life and eventually found a home-loving wife. With God always beside us we try to enjoy each and every day together.
