The David Hicks land record above may be the David of this Hicks line; I found an 1827 lottery listing for a David Hicks, RS, living in Pike County at the time of the lottery. The only two of this family that I can identify in the 1830 census are William and Johnson in Elbert, so the others seem to have been moving around. Wyatt Hicks might be Harrison Wyatt; certainly, it's highly likely that "Wyatt Hicks" is part of this family. Isaac W. Hick, found in the Thomas Hicks guardianship records, appears to be the Isaac W. who was in Pike County in 1840, as was Jefferson Hicks. An Isaac "W." Hicks was in the 1827 lottery living in **Monroe Co.** at about the same time as the David Hicks line, In 1840, the three Hickses in Troup Co. are Johnson Hicks, his brother William Hicks, and my Nathaniel Hicks - Nathaniel was living in LaGrange, near where Homer was living in 1850.

2nd...To my wife Jane Hicks, 101 1/4 acres land I now reside , known as west half of lot 181 in 9th district, orginally Monroe , now Pike . With all stock, household furniture, lifetime estate. At her death, to go to son-in-law, John Statum, who already lives on land and is to take care of widow during her lifetime.
3rd.....To my sons, Frederick, John, William, Harrison , Wyatt and Samuel Hicks, and to daughter Elizabeth Parham one dollar each.
4th....Appoints son-in-law John Statum and friend William V. White, executors.

THE FOLLOWING ARE NOTES ON THE OGLETHORPE ISAAC HICKS – NOT OUR ISAAC W. HICKS

NOTE: Looked at this Isaac as a possible father to our Isaac, but doesn't seem to fit.

The vague mention of Hicks in an article on Yanceys is found in Volume III of Histories of LaGrange and Troup County, Georgia pp. 539-540. It shows that Robert Hicks and Sarah Reeves had Abigail Hicks and Isaac Hicks. Abigail married William Yancey and Isaac Hicks married Elizabeth Hines and that their children (who were first cousins) married: that is: Thomas Yancey married Sarah Hicks. There is a little more on them in the article on the Reeves family in this same Volume III pp. 449-451. But neither place gives anything of the other children of Isaac Hicks.... I think you could check Oglethrope Co., Ga records for that is where Isaac Hicks died, I believe, after 1824... Per Steve Riggan:

I think Isaac and Elizabeth married in Wake Co., NC, but not sure. I saw where there was a Thomas Hines living there who could be Elizabeth's father. I don't have any other information on the Hines. However, the Hicks were from Granville Co., NC and descended from Robert and Sarah Reeves Hicks. Their old house is still standing in Granville Co. near Oxford I believe. Jim Yancey told me that. He was back there and took pictures of it. He also took pictures of the old Yancey plantation in Oglethorpe Co., GA where Thomas and Sarah Hicks Yancey lived. This was the house where my 3rd great grandfather Thomas Hines Yancey was born and raised.

Just found this posting of Steve Riggan's on Genforum. This explains that Sarah Hicks who married Thomas Yancey; Sarah was the *daughter* of Isaac Hicks! Good grief, I don't think I ever picked up on that in my e-mails with Steve. Steve, however, could give me no information on Isaac and referred me to Jim Yancey. Boy, this sure is confusing.

"I think I've corresponded with you on my Dad's Hurley family. My mother is a **Yancey** and happens to be descended from both siblings of Sarah Hicks Bell - Abigail Hicks who married William **Yancey**, and Isaac Hicks who married Elizaeth Hines. Abigail's son, Thomas **Yancey**, married his first cousin Sarah Hicks, daughter of Isaac. Thomas and Sarah Hicks **Yancey**'s son, Thomas Hines **Yancey**, b. 1818 Oglethorpe/Clarke Co., GA, was my gr-gr-gr grandfather. My family went from GA into Alabama and on to Arkansas. Thomas Hines **Yancey** abandoned his wife and children and went to TX from GA where he married and had another family unbeknownst to his wife back in GA. Since time, we have contacted the **Yancey** relatives in TX who have filled in the gaps with the Medearis/Bell/Hicks family connections. I have more information on genforum under **Yancey** with a narrow down search under my name. Take a look. Stay in touch."

GOES ALONG WITH THIS FROM HICKS GENFORUM:

This is the link between the three Hicks brothers who were born in NY and moved to Granville Co., NC. Their great grandfather:

HERODIAS LONG March 14, 1636/37 in St Faith, St. Paul's, London England, daughter of ROBERT LONG and ELIZABETH ??. She was born 1624 in England and died 1722 in Rhode Island.

The link is from W.H. Phillips' letter of Jan 23, 1980 to Esther Emory and Edwin Hicks. letter: "The first John to come to Long Island with his brother Stephen was a Kieft patentee of Flushing and also involved at Newtown. That John had Thomas, who was the noted Judge Thomas Hicks who lived from 1640 to 1740, then he (Thomas) had your ancestor Jacob, then married Mary Doughty and by her had Isaac, John (c 1679-1730) who married Elinor Ellison, Benjamin, Charles, William, Elizabeth, Stephen, Charity, Phoebe, and Mary."

From Eugene C. Hicks's book: John was left in England to be educated when he father went to America in 1621 and was educated at Oxford. He followed to America in 1635, and lived for a time in Weymouth MA, but later moved to Newport, RI, and still later in 1642, he moved to Hempstead LI. The first patent (Oct 1645) for the land at Flushing, granted by Gov. Kieft (the Dutch governor from 1638 to 1647) to English immigrants included John Hicks.

Notes for HERODIAS LONG: (Hicks book)

Was from a good family and wealthy in her own name. When John Hicks married her by license issued in London March 14, 1636/7 she was only 13 years old. They went to Weymouth MA and then in 1641 to Newport RI. They quarreled (probably because she was an emotional Quaker) and separated. In 1642, he left and went to the western part of LI, then under Dutch rule.

There has been a suggestion.. that as she subsequently lived with and had children by, George Gardiner, she was living in adultery. However, before she married Mr. Gardiner in a Quaker ceremony on Dec 2, 1643, a divorce had been granted to her in RI.

The link for Robert, and William moving from LI to NC is in a warrant. From W. H. Phillips' letter of Jan 23, 1980 to Esther Emory and Edwin Hicks. "Elizabeth's notes [Elizabeth Hicks Hummel] show that she found the Warrant and the Recognizance Bond in a box of old unsorted papers in the vault. The warrant states that William and Robert, brothers went to Granville to Little Neck near NYC in 1758, that they made a settlement (we assume an estate) on June 26, 1758, that on July 3, 1758 between little Neck and a place called the narrows that Robert threatened William with a knife and demanded four pounds New York money as a balance due, and that on October 23, 1858 William swore out the warrant against his brother. On the back of the Recongizance Bond one can make out a few words suchas "settle, Jamaca, rode some distance, L 10 dollars, to the ferry."

"Elizabeth felt that since the grandfather Thomas did not mention them in his will that they took what they had got from their father (1730) and left LI in 1740. We know that Robert was in Bertie Co., NC in 1749 and 50, sold out and bought land next to William in Granville in 1749 (he would have been age 24). Elizabeth further surmised that prior to 1758 another relative died in LI, or that there was a residue of their father's inheritance from their grandfather, hence the need for the 1758 trip to Little Neck."

"Gene Hicks tells me ... that he found that except for the record of their baptism and of their being named in their father's will - that William, Robert and Thomas have no history of them or of their descendants on Long Island. This indicates that they are the ones that left LI. He further researched records of all five persons by the name of Thomas Hicks born in the area during this span of time and that all but this Thomas lived and died on Long Island."

From Uncle Thurston's book:

"In the summer of the year 1807, when my father Benjamin W. Hicks was in his 69th years, he wrote in a blank book at my request some of the history that he had often told me..." A church was started (Origins of Harris' Meeting House). "My father, Abner agreed to help and furnish the land. THE deed was made by Abner Haricks and isrecorded in Book V, Page 329, Granville, ... two acres including the use of the spring, is still known as "The Meeting House Spring." (There is a historical marker there now per RYF.)

"My father.. mentioned the further fact that his father, Abner, met his wife Elizabeth Harris at this Harris Meeting House....

Hicks who was in the 1827 GA Lottery listed as residing in Monroe County. This is also the one I think I've found in 1880 in Elmore County, AL - right age - claims born VA, birth date would be 1809. He has the son, Elijah.

-Isaac Hicks 1860: 2 new Isaac Hickses show up, one in Dade and one in Fayette County.

Perhaps it's just a coincidence, but there are families with the surname of Williams surrounding the Habersham Isaac in 1850, and I find Williams near Isaac W. in Meriwether in 1850, as well as near him in 1880 in AL.

Wow, you could be walking the beach in Del Mar, watching the ponies run, and all that good stuff!

I also wanted to watch and listen to the surf, around the clock, walk the beach, forever, but, instead, ended up in La Mesa, about ten miles east.

I did spend lots of time in the surf, years ago, without a board, likely too much time in the sun because my dermatologist now tells not to go outside unless its dark.

Sorry to be so tardy in getting back to your last message. My wife's mom (age 90) passed away on 16 October, and, as might expect, there has been much to do, especially since she was an only child. It has been up to me to do all that must be done.

I did do some digging for the Hicks folks you mentioned in the early (1785 and on) Wilkes County tax records, thinking they may have made their way to Georgia via Wilkes, like so many others. I didn't find the names you mentioned, but did find a John Hicks by 1790, and Daniel and Isaac Hicks by 1799. I also checked Warren County deeds. Warren County was formed from a big piece of Wilkes County in 1793, but I only found John and Thomas Hicks, albeit a few years later.

I also strolled through early Elbert County deeds, finding a James Hicks witnessing a deed as early as 1806, although the principal parties were noted as all from Augusta, Richmond County, so this James Hicks may have been from there.

You said your David Hicks had made his way to Elbert County by at least 1819. This may be of interest. David Hicks was apparently in Elbert County by at least 1804. On 2 August 1804, Elbert County, David Hicks witnessed the John Parham will, probated 22 April 1805. Of possible interest, John Parham's will names, among many children, a daughter Hollyberry Hicks.

And, of likely interest, I found a 20 February 1806 deed from John Booth to David Hicks for 130 acres of land "on Doves Creek waters", both parties noted as residents of Elbert County. Of possible interest, a Brown was noted as an adjacent landowner, no given name mentioned.

Also, on 15 March 1811, David Hicks and Jinny, his wife, sold (apparently the same) 130 acres on Doves Creek to James Oliver. Both David and Jinny signed with an "x." A Brown was still noted as an adjacent landowner.

Then, on 21 July 1813, John Parham and his wife Mary sold 164 3/4 acres on Doves Creek to the aforementioned James Oliver. Both David (x) Hicks and a Harrison Hicks witnessed the deed. I assume this was a son of the John Parham who left the 1804 will!

Of possible interest, Elbert County marriage records include:

There are a potful of Brown marriages in Elbert County during that period.

I also checked Greene County will abstracts, 1786-1877, but found no Hicks folks listed. Are you certain Thomas Hicks died in Greene County?

I trust some of this is of interest.
