Under the provisions of Sections 4736 to 4740, inclusive, Revised Statutes, and the Act of March 9, 1878.

On this 30th day of May, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eighty seven, personally appeared before me Clerk of the County Court, the same being a court of record within and for the County and State aforesaid, (1) E. B. Yancy, aged 89 years, a resident of Plumville, in the State of Kentucky, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of (2) Joel Yancy deceased, who was the identical (3) Joel Yancy, who served under the name of (4) Joel Yancy as a (5) Lieutenant in the Company commanded by Captain in the 8th regiment of Infantry, commanded by in the war of (6) ; that her said husband (7) volunteered at was appointed lieutenant on or about the 27th day of October 1820 A. D. 1820 for the term of , and continued in actual service in said war for the term of (8) and whose services terminated, by reason of (9) discharge at on the day of A. D. She further states that the following is a full description of her said husband at the time of his enlistment, viz: (10)

She further states that she was married to the said Joel Yancy, at the city (or town) of North Garden, in the county of Albemarle, and in the State of Virginia, on the 11th day of December A. D. 1823 by one (11) Benjamin Piza, who was a (12) Minister; and that her name before her said marriage was Elizabeth Brown, and that she has not remarried since the death of said Joel Yancy; and she further states that (13) The said Joel Yancy had not been previously married and that her said husband (14) Joel Yancy in Grant county West Virginia, died at age the 31st day of October 1865, in the State of West Virginia, on the 31st day of October 1865, and she further declares that the following have been the places of residence of herself and her said husband since the date of his discharge from the Army, viz: (15) In Albemarle co. Va till 1840. then till 1865 in Grant co W. Va. She then resided in Lewis co. Ky. 1844 - She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Pension to which she may be entitled under Sections 4736 to 4740, inclusive, Revised Statutes, and the Act of March 9, 1878, and hereby appoints, with full powers of substitution and revocation, Charles & William B. King, of Washington D.C., her true and lawful attorney to prosecute her claim.

And she further declares that she has heretofore made no application for (16) pension or Bounty land.
