

After reaching high school age, I did house work etc. until I was thru school. As a --- I have lived and boarded with people of most every faith and usually attended the va us churches with them. My mother was a Christian Scientist and was a reader in their church, was thoroughly inoculated too. Dad liked to go to church but it did not matter to him which church it was. He never made any comments (discisive) about any one church or mma any persons that I remember. He liked everyone and I have never heard of any one who did not like him or remember him. He also always said there was no excuse for anyone not to have a good education with all the papers and libraries there were. I think he only finished grammar school.

Adria has always been the same way, I think she has read her way thru most of the state library. She did have a year or two of business college (I finished High School) She gets interested in a subject and then buys, borrows or rents all the books she can lay her hands on. So you see she and myself have always read and talked about religions a great deal. not against but about their differences and what made them distinct from each other. We have talked too and wondered about the Mormon church, but never knew anyone of that faith well enough to discuss it with them.

About 3 years ago Adria joined the Catholic church, which was her priviledge of course. We discussed it before she joined but never could see that any objection on my part would serve any good purpose, and still dont know if what differences I may feel or based on truth or predjudice that is drummed into people from the time they start breathing. That is one thing I do try to do and that is not to be predjudced or intolerant of people and think I have pretty well succeeded. On the other hand either I like people on meeting them or I dont. No, thats not quite true, for many people do not effect me either one way or another., b but if I dont, I dont.

Aunt Maude on the other hand is a very mild mannered person, she was always close to grandpa until he died, and tho she is a good christion woman I am sure she has objections To The Mormon faith. I have never been as close to her as Adria, so guess you can see that my not writing to her for information is because until I cans see her, I think correspondance is not the way. I do have a cousin in Portland who I think at least has some more on the family and by the end of the week should have my forms filled out to have him fill in some of the holes. Its a funny thing but think it would be easier to talk about most anything to you than to Aunt Maud. Adria wanted to read your letters so I sent them to her but told her to send them back. She enjoyed them too and said she wished she could meet you.

Then I am leaving out a paragraph or two not of interest.

I am going to the library tomorrow nite, Have you noticed too how much longer it takes how to find it than to find it.

By the way there is or was a Wm Y. in Salisbury N.C., and one in Morgan (town) N.C that received Rev. War Rammammas pay vouchers in the 1789's, I keep wondering if it will mmmk be William when we get back to the origional four.

These things surely take impressive turns or twists, You see I was looking for my Malanda Woodruff Austin to take me to the Mormon church, records possibly, as I remember the name Woodruff from the trip we took thru the Museum at Salt Lake. Intend to do some looking for my Joseph Austin tomorrow nite. but know I will end up in the southeast looking for more of my Yanceys. it happens every time.

Other thing is traveling, and this I have never mentioned to anyone before, for it sounds far fetched, There are parts of the country that as we travel thru ,it seems to have a familiar feeling as if I had been there before, and have felt that a great deal. especially thru Nevada and Utah. Nothing more of interest in the letter. Signed Lillian Borgardus.

Richard Kelley and his wife Maria Gibbs emigrated to America in 1773. It is not known where they came from.

A decendant Edmund Levi Kelley states this in his biography in the Church History published by the Reorganized Church in Lamoni, Iowa. Published in 1903 his biog. is found in Vol 4, p726. Edmund Kelley made a trip to the southern states possibly around the turn of the century. He apparently found some sources which have not been rediscovered as yet. Reference to these will be indicated in these papers as E. L. K. Two Kelley sisters used this material as a basis for their applications to the D. A. R.

In doing research for our Austin Yancey it has come to our attention that members of the Kelley family were almost always found nearby. We find a Richard Kelley living close to Austin Yancey in the 1790 South Carolina Census. The only known son of Richard and Maria is Benjamin Franklin Kelley. However, as we proceed through the census records we find an Austin Yancey Kelley who was born 1790-1800. Until disproved, he could logically be classified a probable son of Richard and also to the idea that Richard was a neighbor to Austin in 1790.

In Lincoln County, Ky on the 9th of Jan 1805, Austan Yancy requests a marriage license for his daughter Nancy to Benjamin Kelley. Austin is found on the tax rolls of this county from 1800 through 1806. These tax rolls have not been checked for Kelley.

Austin Yancey and Richard Kelley have not been found in the 1800 census. Kentucky was searched and there was no census for Tenn in 1810. There were no census records for either Kentucky or Tennessee in 1800. It seems likely that from 1805 to 1820 they were somewhere in Tenn.

In 1820 we find Both these men in Montgomery County, Tenn along with their families. Scanning the names in this county will produce many other familier names to be found in later census and other records in Williamson Co. Illinois. This move seems to have occurred about 1828/9 and a friend in Williamson County told me that a severe earthquake took place in Tenn. about this time and many people left. When they arrived in Illinois they were in Franklin County. In 1839 Williamson County was formed from Franklin and the part of the county they lived in became Williamson. The early records of Franklin County were destroyed by fire tho there could be some few records remaining. The records of Williamson County have also suffered losses but some remain and some searching has been done.

It would seem that the Kelleys settled in the south central part of the county near a small settlement called Pulleys Mills. My friend Lona Tyner told me some years ago that her gr. gr. grandfather was buried in a small cemetery near there and she thought there was a Kelley. She also told me that her Randolpf Casey, son of Levi Casey, had come from the Carolinas through Georgia, Tennessee and into Illinois. That some of her Caseys had married

Kelley girls. It therefore follows that the Casey name should be watched for, as more Kelley research is done and that Georgia (likely the northern part) would be a likely place to do some Kelley searching.

Abstract from the biography of Edmund Levi Kelley from the Church History before mentioned;

He was born near Vienna, Ill 17 Nov 1844. His parents lived there ten years and then moved to Mills Co. Iowa. His grandparents were Richard Kelley and Maria Gibbs who emigrated to America in year 1773. Their son Benjamin Franklin was married to Miss Nancy Yancey dtr of Austin Yancey of N.C., in the year 1805. They had 7 children, one of whom was Richard Yancey Kelley. Richard married Sarah Ballowe and their children were; Benjamin E. F., John Smith, William H., Mary J. H., Edmund L., George T., Parley P., and James M. Kelley.

The following is the Lineage Record of Harriett Martha Kelley France wife of Joseph Ernest France. Residence 1141 South 33rd St., Omaha, Nebraska. This is given on her application #219768 dated 18 Dec 1925, to the D. A. R.

Her Rev. War ancestor was Austin Yancey, b Tyson or Tryon Co. N.C. 29 Aug 1752. (His pension application states neither place of birth or date. (L. B.) His death occurred after 8 Oct 1833 (at which time he applied for his pension from Franklin Co., Ill where he lived. The pension application does state that his age was eighty one years, one month and ten days. (L. B.)

Harriett Kelley's father was William Henry Kelley b. 1 Apr 1841 d. 14 Aug 1915, md. Nancy Ellen Campbell Dec 1868. She b 28 Jan 1851 d. 20 Mar 1907.

William Henry was son of Richard Yancey Kelley b 23 Jan 1814 d 10 June 1861, md 31 May 1837 Sarah Elizabeth Frances Ballowe b 3 Jul 1814, d 18 Nov 1873

Richard Yancey Kelley was the son of Benjamin Franklin Kelley b 4 Mar, died after 1840, md Nancy Yancey b. Aug 1787 d after 1840.

Nancy was the daughter of Austin Yancey (as above) who md 11 Feb 1775 Sarah Garrison in Rutherford Co. N.C. (Have not been able to verify. L. B.)

Information about Basel Nelson and his wife Elizabeth (Chattin) Nelson who came to Williamson County Illinois about 1830/31

Ambrose Nelson living in Pittsylvania Co. Va., in the August Court Session 1779 is exempt from paying tax levies in the future. The law of Virginia stated that residents were not to be taxed after reaching the age of 60 to 70 yrs. Presuming him to be about 65 years old at this time, he would have been born about 1714. He first appears on the tax rolls of Pittsylvania Co. on their earliest ones of 1782-84, owning 136a. Where he was born is not known. Possibly Va. His will was probated in 1799 and he would have about 85 years old at this time.

His will dated 6 May 1768 - proven 18 Feb 1799

To my son Bazel Nelson - 2 shillings 6 pence

To my son James Nelson - the land on which I dwell (136a)

To my son William Nelson - 15 pounds

To my dtr Barsheba Ricketts 2 shillings 6 pence

Bazel (Basdale) Nelson Sr. and his wife Rebecca ____? had known sons James, Basil Jr and John - Possibly a William also.

The marriage record for James C. Nelson and his wife Elizabeth Allen is dated 13 Jan 1807 in Pittsylvania County, Va. Her father was Welcome William Allen. Their marriage bond is dated 27 Dec 1806 at Chatham, Va. On a separate page will be found the family records for James and Elizabeth - p 11

Basel Nelson Jr. was married abt 1810 to Elizabeth Chattin, dtr of John Chattin of Pittsylvania Co. Marriage bonds have not been found for them but the division of John Chattin's estate establishes the fact.

Basel Nelson Sr appears for the last time on the tax rolls in 1809 and James in 1811. In 1815 Basel Jr and Elizabeth leave to go to Montgomery County, Tenn. After their arrival in Tenn, Basel sells his land in Va. and this also is recorded in the deeds in Pittsylvania.

In 1837 to Bainbridge prec, this county. Died 1861. Giles Mother, born Va. 1793, lived with son Martin in Marion Co, after death of her husband. She died in 1879. Eight of seventeen children are living. When twenty years old Giles left home and married Jan 30, 1862 Louisa Lawrence, who was born 1837, Stewart Co., Tenn. Their children are William F. farmer and teacher, Sirena A. teacher, Cornelia, Emily H., John M., George M. and Giles E. Giles first located in Bainbridge Precinct but in 1864 he went to Idaho Terr and after gold mining one year and farming, he returned in 1867. After compiling my miscellaneous bits and pieces collected on the Nelson and Kelley families, again we return to our Austin Yanceys (both of them). While sorting through all these various notes, it was found that two signatures of Austin were on hand but they surely were not the same. Neither the handwriting nor the spelling. The only other document that might possibly have his signature, was the marriage bond for Sophie Yancey. Sent to Blount County Tenn and was fortunate. They had a xerox copier and the original. Comparing this signature to the ones found on the pension application and the request for Nancy Yancy's marriage license, we find the one from Blount County and that on Austin's pension request from Williamson Co. Ill to be the same. The one from Lincoln County, Ky was Austan Yancy. On a sepearte page you will find the three signatures. p 18

* Is the Austan in Lincoln Co then our missing Austin Jr.? Other than the old records of Edmond Kelley there is no proof that there was one. Since the sig on the pension record establishes Austin Sr., then it follows that Nancy's brother made the request for her marriage license. Perhaps then we should establish a new pattern for Austin Sr's route to Tenn from South Carolina in 1790. Jr. could have also been the one who purchased the land in North Carolina in 1794. Austin Sr. could have traveled across northern Ala. and Ga. and up into Tenn. To my knowledge, there has not been much searching in these two states for our Yanceys. Having kept a card file on all Yanceys for a few years, it is a fact that there are parts of many different lines who went into these two states from Virginia and the Carolinas where it all began.

✓ The tax records 1800-1806 in Lincoln Co. Ky were the last known records of an Austin Yancey until we find him in the Montgomery Co. Tenn census in 1820. My conclusion was then, that the younger Austin was dead and the older one had married a second time and had another family. Once again it may be that Jr. had the family, something happened to him and they went to live with Sr.

✓ There has been some research done in the Lincoln Co. Ky records but if taxes were only paid for six years, there would not be too many records to find. Possibly there should be more searching done there. Bertha has done and had done quite a lot of research done in Blount Co Tenn. Also work has been done in Rutherford Co. N. C. and in Warren Co. and Montgomery Cos Tenn.

✓ Did Austin Sr. and Jr. travel together or did they go separate directions? Were Mahale, Richard Kelley, Hiram John, Matilda and Wm. Riley the children of Sr. or Jr.? In any case, we find them all in Franklin Co. Ill. in the 1830 census. In 1839, the part of the county in which they lived, was separated from Franklin Co. and made into Williamson Co. where we find them in the 1840 census. That is with the exception of Austin Sr. who now appears to be dead.

✓ Mahale married Joseph Smith in Tenn and part of their children were born there. Richard Kelley Yancey also was married in Tenn to Elizabeth (Smith?) It is not known if Matilda married in Williamson Co. There was a license issued for a Matilda but beleive it was a dtr of Richard. William Riley, according to the census was married to Rhoda---?. He was the youngest and likely married in Franklin or Williamson Co. Ill. The name Rhoda seems to run in the Webb family. Maybe she was a Webb.

Our Hiram John was married in Tenn also, to Elizabeth Pratt. Other than her name we have been unable to find out any more about her. William Riley and possibly Adeline were born in Tenn and the rest of the children were born in Ill. They lived there until about 1851/2. By this time Wm. Riley, Adeline and Emeline were married and had their own families started. Emeline married her cousin Thomas, a son of Richard Kelley Yancey. When Hiram left Illinois, all of his children and their families went with him. It is possible that his sister Matilda also went with them. They all went to Utah and settled in or near Ogden (Fort Weber). There they lived from 1851/2 until about 1858. On their journey to the west, Hiram's wife Elizabeth Pratt died. Tradition says this was in Missouri and that she was buried there. During the time they lived in Utah, Hiram John Jr., Jesse Pratt and Charlotte were married. These ^{were} the middle children, leaving only Oliver and Elizabeth the two youngest, with their father.

Hiram's sister Matilda married on 6 Aug 1852 in Utah, William Stevens. This was probably in Salt Lake City. William Stevens had a large family by his first wife who was now dead. The Stevens family were one of the original founders of the town of Holden, Utah. Three years ago, it was a pleasure to meet Mr. Alma Stevens at his home in Holden. He told me something of the family history and of the stories he had been told of "Aunt Tid". The family seemed to have a warm affection for her memory. He also directed me to the beautifully kept cemetery where Matilda and William Stevens are buried. It was almost sunset and the view to the west from the top of the hill was very beautiful. There was time to take a good picture of the markers.

In 1858, Hiram Sr. and almost all of his family again started moving west. The exception was Gilbert and Adeline Cox, who with their family, went east. They lived in Missouri for a few years and then moved to Pleasanton, Kansas. Also, Hiram Jr's wife Harriet did not go with the family. Of their three children, only one survived, John H. Harriet was pregnant with her fourth child Adam, who was born after the family left. She stayed with her parents. The boy John H. went with his father Hiram Jr.

Jesse Pratt's wife was Susannah Hagler. Her mother was a Penrod and they had come to Utah from Union Co. Ill, just to the south of Williamson Co. Both the Penrods and the Haglers were from Ill in fact. At any rate, Susannah had an uncle, Emanuel Penrod "Manny". He was in, or near, Carson City, Nevada at this time and the family is beleived to have lived in this area for about a year or so. Manny Penrod's name is found mention in several histories of the Comstock mines of Nevada. He supposedly sold his share to Comstock. Manny did own property in Carson City and later in northern Nevada. It is known that some of the Yancey had gold fever and this was the likely reason for their stay in this area.

By the time the 1860 census were taken, the Family were all on the west side of the Sierra Nevadas and living at Smith Flats just to the north of Hangtown (Placerville). Emeline's husband Thomas Yancey joined the Calif Vols in Nov 1861. Emaline ran a boarding house for a while.

Also shortly before the census, Hiram Sr. married for the second time. Mary Tuttle was her name and she had a daughter Ann by a previous marriage. It is said they were married in California but much searching has not turned up any records to date.

About 1863 Hiram Sr and his new wife Mary and again all of the family moved to Geyserville, Calif, which is not far from Healdsburg. Ukiah.

It would seem that a gradual disintegration of the family now starts to take place. Oliver and Elizabeth both marry and start their own families and very likely each of the various brothers and sisters and their respective families now have their own ways to go. Jesse Pratt and his brother Hiram Jr. are the unsettled ones. Sometimes together and sometimes by themselves, but they are always looking over the hill for the greener grass.

In 1866 Hiram Sr., Wm Riley, Oliver and Lem and Charlotte Davis came to Oregon and settled in Lane Co. in the vicinity of Cottage Grove. This of course included their respective families. After 4 or 5 yrs, the Davis's and Oliver and their families again went back to the vicinity of Healdsburg, Calif. Elizabeth and Garret Wycoff always lived in this area and all of their large family were born and raised in Sonoma and Mendocino Counties.

Hiram Jr. and his son John went by boat from San Francisco to New York then back to Ill, Mo., and Kas to see his sister Adeline. In 1873 he went to Mo. and there married Hester Ann (Harris) Rhodes. About this time also their brother Jesse Pratt ~~also~~ came with their family to visit Adeline and Gilbert Cox. It would seem that after 2 or 3 yrs Jesse and his family again returned to the west. Hiram Jr. ~~also~~ came again to the west and possibly with Jesse. Jesse and his family are found in the Nevada State census for the year 1875. This was in and near the town of Austin, Nevada. In the same census were found Lem and Charlotte Davis. Hiram Jr. was not there so had again returned to the east, where he lived the rest of his life in Mo., Iowa and Kas. Hiram and Hester had the following children;

During the time these families lived in Austin, Nevada, Jesse's oldest son Ed married Rachel Rhodes, daughter of Hester.

For the past twenty some years, a part of our September vacations have been spent in Nevada. We have made friends there throughout the state. One of the most delightful ones has been Bert and Millie Acree. Bert was the County Clerk of Lander Co. from the age of 21 until his retirement a few years ago. Bert and Millie were both born in Austin, Nev and are still living there. When I became interested in the Yancey family, he remembered a Yancey Canyon and the next year when we went back to Austin we were able to spend a day in the canyon where they had lived and also a day in the clerk's office at the Court House.

Jesse owned land at the head of Birch Creek Canyon. (Yancey Canyon). They raised horses and cut and hauled wood into Austin. Ed was married there and Jesse had gold claims in the Clyde District(mineral claims) in the town of Austin. Jesse and his family eventually came back to Oregon, where their last child was born. Most of his family settled in eastern Oregon in Prineville and Klamath Falls. Jesse and Susannah's children are:

We have names of the children but very little else so an attempt to match names with initials gives us a family picture that is apt to be incorrect.

If Ohio is the correct birthplace for the boy George, then it is possible that Lem and Charlotte also made the trip to see Adeline and Gilbert Cox in Kas. and wandered around the mid-west for a year or so along with Jesse and perhaps Hiram Jr. now and again.

Both Lem and Charlotte Davis died in Sonoma Co. Calif., but so far we have been unable to contact any of their descendants. We hope to!

Emaline and her three sons Oliver, Levi and William lived their lives in the northern California Counties of Shasta and Tehama. Emaline had a 40 a farm to the west of Red Bluff in Tehama Co. There they raised and sold fruit and almonds from their orchard. Oliver's daughter Neva Frye also told us that Emaline and her sons had also raised and traded horses while living up near Alturas, Calif. This was likely before they bought their Tehama County property.

Elizabeth, the youngest of Hiram Sr's Children married Garret Wycoff. They raised a large family but always lived in Sonoma and Mendocino Counties in Calif. One of their daughters Annie Payne was able to give us much assistance regarding her family. The Wycoff children, all born in Calif.:

Bertha Jensen was also able to compile information from this family and I beleive she told me that one of Adeline's granddaughters visited her for a time. We do not know where Gilbert and Adeline are buried. They lived for a time at Mound City and Pleasanton, Kansas but it is beleived they moved from there and lived perhaps with some of their children. (speculation only)

William Riley and his wife Elizabeth Nelson lived out their lives in the area near Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon. They are buried at Sears Cemetary, 3 miles east of Cottage Grove along with Hiram John Sr. and his second wife Mary Tuttle. All of Wm Riley's children were married in Lane County. Alonzo and William Henry homesteaded on the John Day River in Gilliam Co. Elizabeth married Albert Smith and they had a ranch out east of Prineville, Oregon. Hiram B. married Emma Rhodes another daughter of Hiram Jr.'s wife Hester. They lived in the Cottage Grove area. Melvina married Joseph Mann and they moved to Chico, Calif. where they lived, raised their family and died. Alonzo, the oldest of Wm. Riley's children was my grandfather. He in turn had five children, all of whom remained in Oregon except Isaac who lived the later part of his life in Stevenson, Washington on the Columbia River within sight of the Oregon side of the river.

It is not my intent at this time to carry the family down their respective lines. With the exception of Oliver and Charlotte, we do have the families fairly well documented. If anyone is interested, please write.

Bertha Yancey Jensen and her sister Sylvia started this project many years ago. They are descended from Hiram Jr. through his son Adam who was raised by his mother in Utah. Rev. War Pension Application of Austin Yancey age 81 yrs 1 mo 10 days

Abstract

He entered the service of the State of North Carolina as a volunteer from Rutherford County in 1775. Went to McKinney's Station on the Broad River in Rutherford County. There under the command of Col Wm. Graham who commanded the militia in R. Co. Col Graham to detach 25 men and go to Chimney Mountain on the Broad River and guard the pass between Chimney Mtn and Green River cove (about 20 miles) so to prevent the Cherokee Indians from making incursions on the defenceless settlers on the eastern side of the mountains. They were ther for 4 1/2 months. Were disbanded about Sept 1775.

In 1781 he was on a visit to relations in South Carolina. Troops were collected to aid in beseiging the fort at Ninety Six. He volunteered and attached himself to Capt Obid Holloway's Co. They marched to Ninety Six and his compnay was' attached to the command of Col. Henderson. The duration of this was from 22 May to 19 Jun 1781. On the 18th of June he was engaged in the assault by General Greene's troops on Ninety Six in which Gen Greene lost from 150 to 200 men.

He had been absent from the Carolinas more than twenty years and knew of no one who could verify his time in the military, having received no discharge papers. Witnessed by Elijah Spillars, min from Jackson Co.; James Oglesby, min from Franklin Co., and James Duncan resident of Franklin Co.

Richard Kelley and his wife Maria Gibbs emigrated to America in 1773. It is not known where they came from.

A descendant Edmund Levi Kelley states this in his biography in the Church History published by the Reorganized Church in Lamoni, Iowa. Published in 1903 his biog. is found in Vol 4, p726. Edmund Kelley made a trip to the southern states possibly around the turn of the century. He apparently found some sources which have not been rediscovered as yet. Reference to these will be indicated in these papers as E. L. K. Two Kelley sisters used this material as a basis for their applications to the D. A. R.

In doing research for our Austin Yancey it has come to our attention that members of the Kelley family were almost always found nearby. We find a Richard Kelley living close to Austin Yancey in the 1790 South Carolina Census. The only known son of Richard and Maria is Benjamin Franklin Kelley. However, as we proceed through the census records we find an Austin Yancey Kelley who was born 1790-1800. Until disproved, he could logically be classified a probable son of Richard and also to the idea that Richard was a neighbor to Austin in 1790.

In Lincoln County, Ky on the 9th of Jan 1805, Austan Yancy requests a marriage license for his daughter Nancy to Benjamin Kelley. Austin is found on the tax rolls of this county from 1800 through 1806. These tax rolls have not been checked for Kelley.

Austin Yancey and Richard Kelley have not been found in the 1800 census. Kentucky was searched and there was no census for Tenn in 1810. There were no census records for either Kentucky or Tennessee in 1800. It seems likely that from 1805 to 1820 they were somewhere in Tenn.

In 1820 we find Both these men in Montgomery County, Tenn along with their families. Scanning the names in this county will produce many other familier names to be found in later census and other records in Williamson Co. Illinois. This move seems to have occurred about 1828/9 and a friend in Williamson County told me that a severe earthquake took place in Tenn. about this time and many people left. When they arrived in Illinois they were in Franklin County. In 1839 Williamson County was formed from Franklin and the part of the county they lived in became Williamson. The early records of Franklin County were destroyed by fire tho there could be some few records remaining. The records of Williamson County have also suffered losses but some remain and some searching has been done.

It would seem that the Kelleys settled in the south central part of the county near a small settlement called Pulleys Mills. My friend Lona Tyner told me some years ago that her gr. gr. grandfather was buried in a small cemetery near there and she thought there was a Kelley. She also told me that her Randolpf Casey, son of Levi Casey, had come from the Carolinas through Georgia, Tennessee and into Illinois. That some of her Caseys had married

Kelley girls. It therefore follows that the Casey name should be watched for, as more Kelley research is done and that Georgia (likely the northern part) would be a likely place to do some Kelley searching.

Abstract from the biography of Edmund Levi Kelley from the Church History before mentioned;

He was born near Vienna, Ill 17 Nov 1844. His parents lived there ten years and then moved to Mills Co. Iowa. His grandparents were Richard Kelley and Maria Gibbs who emigrated to America in year 1773. Their son Benjamin Franklin was married to Miss Nancy Yancey dtr of Austin Yancey of N.C., in the year 1805. They had 7 children, one of whom was Richard Yancey Kelley. Richard married Sarah Ballowe and their children were; Benjamin E. F., John Smith, William H., Mary J. H., Edmund L., George T., Parley P., and James M. Kelley.

The following is the Lineage Record of Harriett Martha Kelley France wife of Joseph Ernest France. Residence 1141 South 33rd St., Omaha, Nebraska. This is given on her application #219768 dated 18 Dec 1925, to the D. A. R.

Her Rev. War ancestor was Austin Yancey, b Tyson or Tryon Co. N. C. 29 Aug 1752. (His pension application states neither place of birth or date. (L. B.) His death occurred after 8 Oct 1833 (at which time he applied for his pension from Franklin Co., Ill where he lived. The pension application does state that his age was eighty one years, one month and ten days. (L. B.)

Harriett Kelley's father was William Henry Kelley b. 1 Apr 1841 d. 14 Aug 1915, md. Nancy Ellen Campbell Dec 1868. She b 28 Jan 1851 d. 20 Mar 1907.

William Henry was son of Richard Yancey Kelley b 23 Jan 1814 d 10 June 1861, md 31 May 1837 Sarah Elizabeth Frances Ballowe b 3 Jul 1814, d 18 Nov 1873

Information about Basel Nelson and his wife Elizabeth (Chattin) Nelson who came to Williamson County Illinois about 1830/31

Ambrose Nelson living in Pittsylvania Co. Va., in the August Court Session 1779 is exempt from paying tax levies in the future. The law of Virginia stated that residents were not to be taxed after reaching the age of 60 to 70 yrs. Presuming him to be about 65 years old at this time, he would have been born about 1714. He first appears on the tax rolls of Pittsylvania Co. on their earliest ones of 1782-84, owning 136a. Where he was born is not known. Possibly Va. His will was probated in 1799 and he would have about 85 years old at this time.

Bazel (Basdale) Nelson Sr. and his wife Rebecca ____? had known sons James, Basil Jr and John - Possibly a William also.

The marriage is for James C. Nelson and his wife Elizabeth Allen is dated 13 Jan 1807 in Pittsylvania County, Va. Her father was Welcome William Allen. Their marriage bond is dated 27 Dec 1806 at Chatham, Va. On a separate page will be found the family records for James and Elizabeth - p 11

Basel Nelson Jr. was married abt 1810 to Elizabeth Chattin, dtr of John Chattin of Pittsylvania Co. Marriage bonds have not been found for them but the division of John Chattin's estate establishes the fact.

Basel Nelson Sr appears for the last time on the tax rolls in 1809 and James in 1811. In 1815 Basel Jr and Elizabeth leave to go to Montgomery County, Tenn. After their arrival in Tenn, Basel sells his land in Va. and this also recorded in the deeds in Pittsylvania.

Giles was born in Marion Co. Ill in 1834. Son of B. and Elizabeth (Chattan) Nelson. Father of Scotch ancestry b Va. 1785. After marriage went to near Dover, Tenn, then in 1827 to Marion Co. Ill. In 1837 to Bainbridge prec, this county. Died 1861. Giles Mother, born Va. 1793, lived with son Martin in Marion Co, after death of her husband. She died in 1879. Eight of seventeen children are living. When twenty years old Giles left home and married Jan 30, 1862 Louisa Lawrence, who was born 1837, Stewart Co., Tenn. Their children are William F. farmer and teacher, Sirena A. teacher, Cornelia, Emily H., John M., George M. and Giles E. Giles first located in Bainbridge Precinct but in 1864 he went to Idaho Terr and after gold mining one year and farming, he returned in 1867. He bought forty acres in Eight Mile Precinct and then added to that. In 1886 he settled on 125 a in Bainbridge Precinct and built his home. In 1862, as corporal, served about six months when he enlisted in Company D, 128 Ill Vols under Capt. Brown

After compiling my miscellaneous bits and pieces collected on the Nelson and Kelley families, again we return to our Austin Yanceys (both of them). While sorting through all these various notes, it was found that two signatures of Austin were on hand but they surely were not the same. Neither the handwriting nor the spelling. The only other document that might possibly have his signature, was the marriage bond for Sophie Yancey. Sent to Blount County Tenn and was fortunate. They had a xerox copier and the original. Comparing this signature to the ones found on the pension application and the request for Nancy Yancy's marriage license, we find the one from Blount County and that on Austin's pension request from Williamson Co. Ill to be the same. The one from Lincoln County, Ky was Austan Yancy. On a separte page you will find the three signatures. ¹² 200

Is the Austan in Lincoln Co then our missing Austin Jr.? Other than the old records of Edmond Kelley there is no proof that there was one. Since the sig on the pension record establishes Austin Sr., then it follows that Nancy's brother made the request for her marriage license. Perhaps then we should establish a new pattern for Austin Sr's route to Tenn from South Carolina in 1790. Jr. could have also been the one who purchased the land in North Carolina in 1794. Austin Sr. could have traveled across northern Ala. and Ga. and up into Tenn. To my knowledge, there has not been much searching in these two states for our Yanceys. Having kept a card file on all Yanceys for a few years, it is a fact that there are parts of many different lines who went into these two states from Virginia and the Carolinas where it all began.

The tax records 1800-1806 in Lincoln Co. Ky were the last known records of an Austin Yancey until we find him in the Montgomery Co. Tenn census in 1820. My conclusion was then, that the younger Austin was dead and the older on had married a second time and had another family. Once again it may be that Jr. had the family, something happened to him and they went to live with Sr.

There has been some research done in the Lincoln Co. Ky records but if taxes were only paid for six years, there would not be too many records to find. Possibly there should be more searching done there. Bertha has done and had done quite a lot of research done in Blount Co Tenn. Also work has been done in Rutherford Co. N. C. and in Warren Co. and Montgomery Cos Tenn.

Did Austin Sr. and Jr. travel together or did they go separate directions? Were Mahale, Richard Kelley, Hiram John, Matilda and Wm. Riley the children of Sr. or Jr.? In any case, we find them all in Franklin Co. Ill. in the 1830 census. In 1839, the part of the county in which they lived, was separated from Franklin Co. and made into Williamson Co. where we find them in the 1840 census. That is with the exception of Austin Sr. who now appears to be dead.

Mahale married Joseph Smith in Tenn and part of their children were born there. Richard Kelley Yancey also was married in Tenn to Elizabeth (Smith?) It is not known if Matilda married in Williamson Co. There was a license issued for a Matilda but beleive it was a dtr of Richard. William Riley, according to the census was married to Rhoda---?. He was the youngest and likely married in Franklin or Williamson Co. Ill. The name Rhoda seems to run in the Webb family. Maybe she was a Webb.
