Dear Bertha,

It was good to hear from you again and know that you were alright. Sounds as if you had a busy summer in spite of the weather and the heat. We surely did not suffer from any heat here. In fact it seems as if we hardly even saw the sun. Too bad we couldn't bundle it up and shake the weather out a bit more evenly.

We had quite a nice vacation but we took it a bit easier than usual for which I was kind of pleased. Geo wanted to see the National Air Races at Reno so spent several days there. I just mostly wandered around and watched the rest of the people. Did go to the Historical Society and met the women there. Also took the bus one day to Carson City and went thru the old Mint, which has been converted to a museum and quite a nice one. Too, spent several hours in the Court House looking for any records. Knew there would not be too much for our Ys were there for such a short time. Watched all through the records for Emanuel Penrod. He did much shuffling about of land and also his name was on quite a few mining claims. On three or four of them appeared also E. Yancey. But I can't quite figure this one out, would expect to see Jesse Yancey. Our only E's were Emaline and Elizabeth. Do you think it could be Our Emaline? Had hoped also to get into Placerville to the courthouse but this was not on our trail this time. Maybe later. Still looking for the missing families in the 1860 Census and they surely should be around somewhere near to the rest at Placerville. Also keep looking for Hiram's second marriage. It has to be somewhere between Utah and Calif.

Went to the State Lib at Sacramento and feel there would be quite a little to be found there if there were the time to dig a little. Did find a few biographies in some of the old County Histories. Think these will help to clear up the identity of the several families of Yanceys in the phone books found throughout the state. Am sending you copies of these. YOU KEEP.

Also met my Carver relative there at the library. She took me to a nice lunch and we did enjoy our meeting. We are both Gr daus of Isaphena Carver (Walker) (Fleming).

Then too we went to Bodega Bay and met Neva but it was disappointing. Just before we got there had trouble with the generator on the car and so had to leave in time to get back to Sonoma before nightfall. Added to this was the fact that those terrible fires were raging in the Sonoma Valley and you couldn't hardly see in the daytime. It burned to within a mile and a half of friend Ed's house there and the wind changed just in time. Many homes and much property was lost and it was a sad sight to behold.

Was glad to get to meet Neva tho don't think there was too much that she could add to what we know already and she was so excited too. Went also to Sutro Lib in SF again but not much more to add to our Yanceys there. They did have some film and found Elizabeth 1870.

Since you had done so very much, it is a shame for someone else to ~~go~~ go back and repeat it not knowing what others have done. This may save him some work and he can spend his energies and monies on new ideas and localities. Also he seems to have a very good idea of what he is doing and how to go about it.

Did get quite a bit at Sutro on my old Dutch line in New Jersey (Bogart) so while Wm D. is working on Yancey material am going to get this material in shape before it eludes my unretentive brain. At the same time will get what little material I gathered in Nevada into some shape to send you. Not much am afraid.

Will close for this time I guess. Oh yes we did go clear up Yancey Canyon out of Austin and took a few pics. Will have some prints made a bit later and send you a couple. As has been our good fortune the weather was very kind to us for our whole two weeks. We had to take our little car at the last minute so did no sleeping out. Since we ate all of our meals out and since we did not do so much traveling and walking out in the open, I gained about 8 or 9 pounds, so all of the sewing that I did this spring fits almost too, too. Guess you could say I ate myself through two states.

Write whenever you can as your letters are always so very welcome. Also had a nice letter from Alice which must be answered.

personally appeared before me, County Clerk in and for the County and State aforesaid, Thomas Yancey of Pulleys Mills, Williamson Co., Illinois who being duly sworn according to law by me deposes and says that he is the identical Thomas Yancey who enlisted in Co. G, 5th Regt. California Vols Infy at Sacramento, Cal. on the 11th day of November, AD 1861 and continued to serve there until the 29th day of November AD 1864 when he was honorably discharged at Las Cruces, N.M. when he again enlisted as a Veteran in Co. G. 1st Regt. California Infy Vols. at the Rio Grand Las Cruces N.M. and continued to serve therein until he was honorably discharged at San Francisco, Cal. on the 1st day of Dec. 1866. And that while in said service and in the line of his duty without fault or misconduct upon his part, in the fall of AD 1866 at Fort Craig on the Rio Grand N.M. he reached up to take a large quarter of Beef down which was hanging against the wall, which was higher than his head, he, standing on a small log when so reaching up and the movement of his body in reaching upwards caused the log to slip from under him at the time the Beef came loose and the weight of the Beef at arm's length forced him backwards, the Beef falling on him which Ruptured him on his right side. And that while at Las Cruces he was detailed as teamster to go back to Dram (Drum?) Barracks California and getting very wet in a cold rain and very cold all nights this being in December AD 1866 appeared to have a very bad cold, cold which has never subsided, afflicting him continuously until the present with Phthisis or Asthma that he makes this declaration for the purpose of being enrolled on the Pension list Roll of the United States. That he desires all communications concerning this claim to be sent to him at Pulleys Mill, Williamson County, Illinois.

Dear YANCEY researchers; Sparkman, Jensen & Bogardus, Garrison, Norwood
and Wm. D. and Clarence Yancey & Willis

It had been my intention to write to each of you separately, but material I copied 18 Sept. is still lying here in the way. One letter will have to do till there is a chance to handle each of the material each of you sent. Perhaps it is unlucky to say so "Out loud". but it looks as if some of us are finally reaching a turning point in our lines. This year, several of us should add another generation or two to our lines; it looks so hopeful. To Mr. Clarence Yancey of Shreveport, I am indebted for the memoirs of your ancestor, baby brother to my 2nd great grandfather ROBERT J. YANCEY, Jr. (of Memphis Tenn.) And to Col. Garrison, I am indebted for the next generation, apparently ROBERT J. YANCEY, SR. of Cumberland Co. Va. -- Clarence's data and Col. Garrison's fitted into my data. I am also indebted to Clarence for the deed from ROBERT J. & JOHN YANCEY of Cumberland Co. Va. & their wives, in 1820. The various little things are too numerous to mention. Now I am in debt to Wm. D. Yancey of Mo. for the wonderful (photocopies) he has sent of (wills, Revol pension records, census) and everything else he has sent last for my consideration. It is my hope to copy these and cross-check, but his material came at the same time Col. Garrison swamped me with Va. marriages bonds & licenses, other wills, etc. (photostats of the originals). Some of this I must return to him as soon as at all possible. To aid in this, I have taken all my library books back & will be concentrating on the material lying about my office for awhile.

My apologies for being slow. The enclosed material was another attempt to put together bits & pieces gathered up in my search; I had to stop copying before finishing as usual--and all of this other data poured in on top of me right then too (for which a thousand thanks, too) I had two pro reports to write and material to copy for a lady who wanted some Bennett data she had sent last spring; I had to stop to copy it off for her. There has been little time to finish copying data for Kenan in Milledgeville (Ga) and Jones in Macon (Ga) and Eason in Ripley (Tenn) & Churchtown in Mulino (Oregon), ad infinitum. You must all have a large correspondence, also; so you understand how buried I get. Also have a new pro job to search some newspapers for a Kansas City Gene. Soc. lady.

Col. Garrison, you might notice the page 1 items on Lunenburg Co. Va. tithes, in 1764; record apparently filed by overseer (RICHARD) YANCEY for Wm. GOODE (?). I believe I may have forgotten to point out to you that I am a BEARDEN BENNETT POMFRET HUNT (HARRIS) spous out of Va. into Granville Co. Va. about the turn of the century (18th) In checking your GOODE book, I noticed that ANNE BENNET, 2nd wife of JOHN GOODE 2nd--ANNE (1670-80 & killed by Indians 1718-1725). This is familiar; I believe Mrs. Strain of California sent me data along these lines. I seem to remember some GILLESPIE'S in a YANCEY will somewhere--or an allied line. Re the YANCEY-BURLESON, I think I had early notes on some BURLESON marriages into that family. Notice the Lamar Co. Tex. notes--I was still tracing MARSHALL P. YANCEY and family--and that SKIDMORE son-in-law.

Hope you all enjoy the (DAR papers), even with errors. I believe Col. Garrison had some court martial data on ROBERT LEIGHTON and his brother DAVID--still not all charted by me. My charts and indices have had work done, but they remain jumbled. Notice that one daughter was listed both as "MITTY" and "UNITY" b. 16 Nov. 1766. It may be that "RHODA" was called "ROSA" or "ROSE"??? I hope to write the Savannah DAR lady later on--see if I have anything she wants & ask a few questions perhaps. Am so grateful to Jessie Taylor Webb

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of Memphis. See how those dates, etc. fit into my charts for the Memphis family. Notice the SAUNDERS and BOOKER names. More reading of Memphis newspapers is indicated now: also census. 360

What do you all say to my suggestion that PHILADELPHIA JONES married (ROBERT YANCEY) (after possibly marrying a GRIFFIN first?) & JOHN (m. Walton) & ROBERT (m. Wilkerson or Wilkinson) are the 2 men in Cumberland Co. Va, prob. 1810, 20, 30? Actually JOHN might have sold out with (ROBERT J. in 1820 & gone to S.C.) Have to go get the Meck Co. Va. will book out again--various wills sound as if the JONES & GRIFFIN families are all tied up the way I suggest. Then PHILADELPHIA, daughter of (ROBERT YANCEY) & wife PHILADELPHIA JONES, married that JOHN TILLOTSON in Meck Co. Va. mb 16 Jan 1801--apparently m. 18 Jan 1801 Halifax Co., Va.--Richard Murray, security. Richard MURREY was also security on the marr. bond 3 Sept 1802 Meck Co. Va. of JOHN WILLIAMSON & SUSANNA YANCEY, dau of (ROBERT YANCEY) who consented.

Richard → Observe those marriages listed at the bottom of p.4 of enclosed notes, 18 Sep 1964 copy. / JOHN m. Mary Hamblin, 14 Oct 1799 and RICHARD m Mary Walton & ROBERT m. Agnes Wilkinson or Wilkerson. 11 Oct 1796. MARY m. ROBT WILLIAMSON and ELIZ. & MILLY m. GRIFFIN men. It gived Delphia (b. ca 1781) m. 1801 John Tillotson. Observe the William Wilkinson deed of division agreement made by his widow Sarah in Meck Co, Va, 21 April 1797, with her 6 sons-in-law & 3 sons. This indicates that (Robert Yancey) married (Agnes Wilkinson) & was brother in-law to all those Wilkinsons--that brings him into close family connection with 2 Boswell men, Geo. Culberson, Lewis Griffin and John Jarrott. Notice that Lewis Griffin lived in Halifax Co, Va. Notice that witnesses are Wiles, and Charles and John Hamblin and Elijah Griffin and Joseph Townes. I havent seen the Townes man, but there are items on the others, except for Luke Wiles. The surnames I can find but not men of those given names yet.

Richard → I have copied the (Hezekiah Yancey); I believe (Wm. D. Yancey) has sent me a copy, if Garrison did not, of the original Hezekiah will, & also of wills of (Mary Yancey (1790/95) & Richard Yancey (1768/81)). See p 6, the inventory & appraisal notice of Hezekiah Yancey, 1782 and admin. acct. of Richard Yancey for Sept, 1780/1795 ret. by son Charles. The Williamson & Griffin names are prominent in the wills of Hezekiah and Mary, his mother. (Richard's children) had not married when he wrote his will, [1768], for the most part. Notice p. 6 also the extract of the will and admin. acct of John Jones 1791/2 in Meck Co, Va. This is the father of Philadelphia Jones who m. (Robert Yancey) pre 27 Sep 1791. John Jones mentions his grandaun Sarah & Frances Griffin; I think we find at least one of these appearing in the later Meck, Co. Va. marriages (some of which I copied yesterday for sending along to some of you who would be interested in marriages that late, 1811-1853 in Meck, Co, Va. (some would find it too late). There may have been some in my early Halifax Co, Va. notes and (Granville) marriage records. Notice that Philadelphia's sisters married Vaughn and Blanks and Wilkins. Did you notice on page 5 mention of the "land which the deceased (Wm Wilkinson) bought of Richard Wilkins..W side of Buffalo Creek". I wouldn't be surprised to learn that Sarah Wilkinson, the widow, was born Wilkins since he left her that land for life. I think we can see why the Saunders and (Graves) items are useful when we check the marriage records and wills in other areas, too. Re p.9 notes--don't forget the (John Yancey) with son (Gabriel) over in (Kentucky) ((Todd Co.)) he had Allen & Graves mixed into that in 1824-- think he may have come from Augusta Co, Ky. Va.

If Philadelphia Yancey who Married John Tillotson was born abt. 1781 she could well be the daughter mentioned by Robert Yancey in Meck Co. Va. will 1815/17. I need to check that original will too --must see what I have around here now. This Robert (d.1815/17) was apparently the son of Richard and Mary and had bro. Hezekiah and a son Hezekiah. We have the marriage records for most of the children he had names in his will, too. Notice in the Meck Co, Va marriages (1811-1853) the page 2 marr. John Jones and Philadelphia Tillotson, md 18 Dec 1822 surity John Tillotson. Thats just right for a dau of John Tillotson m. Philadelphia in 1801. This would certainly explain any confusion which arose over the two Philadelphia Jones's, eh? You can see in those late marriages, too, the children of Richard (d 1860/1) m 1797 Louisa Co Va, Mary Walton. (mb 30 Dec 1796 --m. 1 Jan 1797). Notice that Emily H. Yancey md George W. P'Pool(?) It appears that Richard Yancey's eldest son James Yancey often appears as surity on these marriages??? Charles Yancey m. Parmelia Yancey; Mary Baker Yancey m. Littleberry Moore; James M. Yancey doed m. Temperance F. Yancey; as well as the men's marriages. These help in fixing up that family from will daza--I forgot Louisa Ann Yancey who m. James T. Jones in 1836. These had, in part, gone to Fayette Co, Tenn--where my own Robert J. Yancey Jr. went in the late 1830's.

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Dear Mrs. Bogardus,

Received your letter and was most glad, Had been thinking of writing you.

I have located Cyrus Yancey, in fact there seems to be two, one probably a son. It appears that he went to Pendleton Co. S.C. about 1802, as I did not find him in the 1800 Census for that Co. but he showed up in the 1810 and Meredith was born in 1803, in that Co.

I do not have very much information on Cyrus as yet. He bought and sold land and there is a record where his wife Sarah signed away her dower rights.

I am going to accept him as my great great grandfather, unless something comes along to prove otherwise. I will tell you why. Just last Sunday, I talked to this old lady who is a first (double) cousin of my father's. I asked her if she had ever heard any other name like George Cyrus, she said no, just old great granddaddy Cyrus, which he was to her.

Was down in Arkansas and did not know Cyrus had been located until Sunday night when I talked to my wife by phone.

By the way I was down there to a decoration. This cemetery is the old Yancey burying ground. Its located on land purchased by Meredith Yancey in 1859 under the Act of 4 Aug. 1854 (Graduation Act). It is now called Liberty Hill Cemetery. Mary Yancey Courtney an Aunt of my father's was the first one buried there. Most of the land in that area has been repurchased by the Government and is now in the Ozark National Forest.

My grandfather Claphan's, mother's father, place is still owned by a granddaughter. It is located a short ways from the old Yancey place.

I have that line back to where my greatgrandfather Claphan came over from England. A few days ago I received from a Miss Alice Yancey through a Mr. L.B. Yancey of Kilgore, Texas. Miss Yancey is in Calif., information that in Granville Co. N.C. there was a Meredith Yancey married Elizabeth Yancey.

I have that marriage bond Meredith Yancey married Elizabeth C. Allen 28 Oct 1829. I thought perhaps he was my Meridith and a first wife but he evidently was not. As I find the following.

Mr. Garrison of Denton, Texas sent me this. It is taken from a Yancey History prepared by a Father Patrick Henry Yancey. Father Yancey said his great grandfather, name not mentioned, born about 1800 in N.C. started to Texas, but died en route in Opelousas La. 1836. His widow Elizabeth Allen, said to be a descendant of Patrick Henry, after the birth on 12 Oct, 1836 in Opelousas of a son Garland Meredith Yancey, returned to N.C. to live in the vicinity of Chapel Hill. She married a second time but Father Yancey was not sure of the name of the second husband.

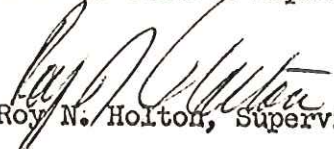

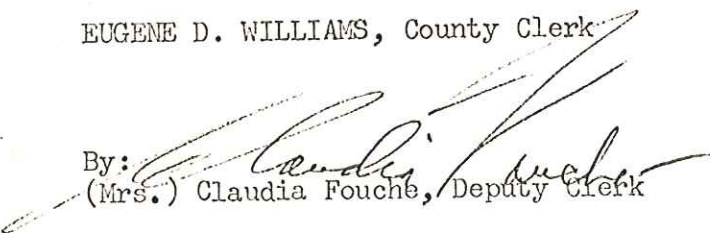
