Shows a JAMES YANCEY who served as a member of the House of Commons of the General Assembly in Caswell County from 1800 thru 1822 (not consecutively). Also a BARTLETT YANCEY who served in the Senate in the same Assembly from 1817 thru 1827.

Shows a THORNTON YANCEY from Granville County, who was one of the delegates to Halifax, 12th November, 1776, that formed the Constitution.

Shows THORNTON YANCEY and STERLING YANCEY and HENRY YANCEY as being members of the House of Commons of the General Assembly in Granville County (1778 thru 1809) (not consecutively).

Yancey County was formed in 1833. It was cut off from Burke and Buncombe. Three counties have since been partly formed out of Yancey. They are: Watauga in 1849; Madison in 1851; and Mitchell in 1861. The county was named for BARTLETT YANCEY, a native of Caswell county. The county seat of Yancey is Burnsville. DR. JOHN YANCEY was given as one of the first settlers of Burnsville.

Shows that in 1845, Hon. William Yancey, of Alabama, well known in his day as 'a rabid fire eater', fought a duel with General Thomas L. Clingman.

Shows BARTLETT YANCEY from Caswell county, whose public career extends over a large part of the history of the State and Nation. Little is known of his career in early life or of his untiring struggle against circumstances and poverty. BARTLETT YANCEY, on his paternal side, was of Welsh extraction. An early ancestor was an Episcopal minister, ordained by the Archbishop of Canterbury. Three of his sons, LOUIS, HENRY, AND RICHARD, emigrated from England to America, but when is not known to the family. Henry and Richard Yancey settled in Virginia and became citizens of usefulness and influence. Louis Yancey located in Granville county, North Carolina and his son, Bartlett Yancey, Sr., moved to Caswell, then a part of Orange county, about 1760, and there married Miss Nancy Graves who was in every respect an exceptional woman. She was not only of great beauty of person, but was also possessed of a fine character of great strength and was consequently destined to influence in a marked degree the character and destinies of her children. From this union came Bartlett Yancey, Jr., who was born on Feb February 19th, 1785 at the old Yancey homestead, six miles south of the county seat, now called in his honor, Yanceyville. The father of Bartlett Yancey was a semi-invalid, unable to do manual labor, and managed to make a moderately est living for his growing family by teaching a country school. Bartlett was a posthumous child, his father having died in the October preceding his birth. Bartlett Yancey Jr., died on the 30th of August, 1828, after an illness of eight days. (much more history may be obtained from this source.)

We have several stories on John Hiram, Hiram, or Hiram John Yancey as to birth place and birth date. Then the 1850 census gives still another birthplace. So we would like to check all the above census records and see if we can find anything to confirm any of our records. I have the family of Hiram (Sr.) and his family on the 1850 census in Williamson County, Illinois. This gives Hiram (Jr.) as being born in 1832 in Illinois, so we assume the family was in Illinois from 1832 on. If we can get census check on the above list we might find additional children, or we might find Hiram, Sr.'s father or mother living with the family.

Be sure to copy ALL INFORMATION from census records. Each year's census will take a different tabulation as the early ones give very little information and the later ones give more.

Hiram, but Bertha has information that would almost put the family in Tenn. around there. So I wish you would check back and forth between Kentucky and Tennessee (in fact it might be wise to check both states on each census until you find what we need)

Then, too, Eliz. Pratt is listed on the 1850 census (provided that is the right family) as being born in Tenn. and this agrees with Bertha's record. So, when you check the Tennessee census watch for an Elizabeth Pratt, probably born about 1805-07. Perhaps children's names will not be given in the 1810 census so put down all the Pratt's you find in Tenn and Ky. and we will check each one until we find the right one.

If the 1850 census I have on Williamson Co shows the family we ~~fx~~ want, then this family was in Illinois in 1840. Checking that county for 1840 ~~might~~ should give us another check on the birth dates, ages, and add the other children who are married in the 1850 census. In fact, I believe I would do that first, then you will know where they were in 1840. So, check this way:

1840 census for Williamson Co. Illinois. (If not there, check Franklin County and also Morgan County. There was a "Judge" Yancey in Morgan County)

1830 census: Check first in the above Williamson County, etc. if you found the family there in 1830. (1850 census and Bertha both say family was in Tenn. in or about 1825 - so if you do not find them in Ill. in 1830, then check the 1830 ~~Kentucky~~ Tenn. Census. Then -

1820 census: Check first the county in which you found the family in ~~1820~~ 1830. And if you can't find the family in Tenn. or Ky, then go into North Carolina and South Carolina.

~~1810~~

1810: Same procedure.

Somewhere along in here you should find another Austin Yancey record - 1850 census gives Hiram Yancey as 42 in 1850, which would make him born in 1807 or 1808. Bertha says he was born in ~~1802~~ 1804. 1850 census gives birthplace as N.C. Pat. blessing gives Ky.

But somewhere in one of these states is the census record that will settle the question. And I believe we should find the family on each census (~~1810~~ 1800, 1810, 1820, 1830, 1840, 1850 and 1860 - up to the point where we have records of our own.)

And, do NOT stop each time you find the name. Check the rest of that county. If you find Hiram (or Austin) in the first few pages, check the rest of the county, maybe you will find other Yanceys who are relatives. For instance, the 1850 gave the Hiram yancey on page 538. On page 556, 557 it gave other Yancy names, and on page 576 it gave a Thomas Yancey, and wife EMELINE and child, and this Emeline we believe is sister of Hiram, Jr.

Should have answered you the first of the week and just plain didn't get it done.

Yes, Alice did send me the same material that she sent to you. I am sending her copies of this material that is enclosed in this letter also so you will not have to make copies to send her either. Phelma has become quite interested again and sure want to encourage her. She has a good understanding of research procedures and also of office routine all of which seem to be necessary. You and I seem to be more of the old "fly by the seat of your britches" school. At any rate we all want the same thing.

This last year Alice sent me the address of an Austin Yancey who lived at Kenatchee Wash. Someone had noticed the name & sent it to her. I wrote to him but had no answer until just the other day - from his sister. Am enclosing a copy of her letter and sent one to Alice - Philma & Thm as noted.

Finally got to Eugene and am enclosing the results of that little trip also.

It was ~~of~~ very enjoyable and busy. Besides my main Yanceys there were also my Bogarts & Halbers into this area (1852) so really did some writing in the Linn & Lane Co courthouses. Had time to only "do" the indexes the same as Mrs Stevens. That way if you find something of definite use you can send for a copy and no research work is involved. There were no wills

and no probates in either county for any Yancey except a Mrs A. K. in 1912. Do not recognize her and it was a little late to be of much use. Some day may write and get a copy to satisfy my curiosity. Hiram John did take up a homestead near Cloverdale and later sold part of it to my Jf Alongo. As you notice in the land conveyances they seemed to have traded & sold their land back & forth to each other. I did look up the description for the homestead land (H. J.) and am writing to the Archives in Wash to see if I can get copies of the application papers that Hiram had to fill out. Don't know procedure too well but all land records are filed by land location rather than the name of the applicant. Well, we shall see and will let you know what comes of it. If I do get copies will send them to you and

your son would then perhaps be so kind as to take them off for you also.

I will get the Holman book ready to mail back to your daughter this weekend. Just pure carelessness on my part that I didn't get it done & thanks for reminding me. Certainly did enjoy it and have the information taken out that I wanted.

Did you ever get an opportunity to look at the book "Early East Tenn Tax Lists" by Mary Barnett Curtis. I think I told you that these were the counties for which there is no 1820 Census. Since we know that our Austin Sr was in Montgomery Co we could perhaps find out if there was an Austin Jr elsewhere in the state - or any other Yancey. Book costs \$15. & so I hesitate to send for it if you could find it there in the Lib.

Cant think of the woman's name but her source material says it was from pension applications and Austin was from Franklin not Fulton Co, and after 83 why would he trudge up to Fulton Co. At any rate I wrote a long time ago to the State Adjutant's office in Ill & they did not know of any Rev <sup>soldier</sup> Hart by that name in any county. I honestly think that is wrong info.

Asked him about the info quoted in those old DAR things by material gathered by the two women's uncle Levi Kelley. He has tried to locate also or at least knows all about the reference etc. but has no info on it.

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He apparently has an old manuscript with this one reference to Hiram Yancey. These three Elders apparently come to visit William Henry Keely living in Johnson County and they were preaching in the locality. Elders Hiram Yancey, Clapp, & Levi Stewart. So this surely indicates that Hiram and likely my William R joined the church while in Ill.

Started this letter the other evening and had company come. Came home Friday evening with some sort of a bug. Mostly just a terrific headache. It seems better today but I surely can't seem to get back to my thread of thought as I started this letter.

Hope you and all your family have a real nice Thanksgiving and your weather doesn't turn too

Dear Mrs. Buck,

In answer to your correspondance with Thelma Yancey, I, too should like to add my thanks for your letter and the information on our Yancey families. Have been trying to identify all Yanceys and must confess that yours were all new and have not been able to identify any as yet with the family lines.

So far we have been unable to account for our Austin's time and activities from the time he paid his last tax in Lincoln Co., Ky. until he shows in the Montgomery Co. Tenn Census in 1820. Hiram and Elizabeth Pratt were married abt 1823-4 and very likely in Tenn. I see now that on the printed sheet her age is wrong. At any rate she was listed as 43 in the 1850 Williamson Co., Ill Census. Thus she would have been born abt 1807 and possibly the dtr (14yr) of Thomas Pratt. Hawkins Co. would have been about in the line of travel as Austin went from the Carolinas into Tenn and Ky. I think It probably that he stayed in this part of the country for a few years before going to the central part of Tenn. Certainly NO records have been turned up for him in that area.

A few years back while reading the Kentucky and Tenn. Census the Pratt names found were noted. My means of reading these were poor and some of the Pratts could have been missed, tho believe it to be done with reasonable care.

Am enclosing this census list. Find I did not note our Austin in Montgomery Co. but there were no Pratts there ( at least on my list). Also enclosed is a short history of our family which will show our connection with the Pratt family. It may be that Mrs Jensen has further information on the Pratt line. Will send copies of this letter to those interested so that they may know what I have done.

Hope this will be of assistance to you and wish it could have been more. Enjoyed all material you sent and will find use for it.

Since your maiden name was Yancey I feel that I can call you by your 1st name. My maiden name was Yancey also. I am a sister to Austin Yancey that you wrote to in Wenatchee - I was up there last week & I had dinner with he and his wonderful wife Essie

I am 19 months younger than Austin. He wanted me to write to you as he is quite nervous and its hard for him to write, so here I am. Our father's name is Maxey W. Yancey. He was born in Arkansas in July 1887. His father was William Yancey and I believe he was born in either Tenn. or Alabama. He had to my knowledge, 2 brothers. When I was a small girl, his brothers Uncle John Yancey from away down south came to see him. Uncle George Yancey also lived near my Grandpa Yancey. Years ago our families were not discussed too much among children so therefore I dont have much information for you. My Grandmother Yancey's maiden name was Sarah Jane Box Porterfield. She died 3 years ago at the age of 99 years young, and the sweetest grandmother one could ever know. My father Maxey Yancey married Ethel McVey at the age of 17 - she was 16. They had a large family 6 boys, & 5 girls. 1 boy and 3 girls have passed on. We have lots and lots of Yancey relatives and believe my father could give you more information about where and when than I can. I married at Oxford Ark at the age of 18 to Austin Verner, he passed on in May 1950 I remarried in Dec 1951. So I hope the little bit of information I have written will help you. We seem to have Yancey relations scattered all over. In Newman, Calif there is a Yancey lumber yard. We have a Yancey relative in Texas, Charlie Yancey and I have a Charles Yancey - a nephew- in Wenatchee Wash, he is Austin's boy. So Yanceys seem to be all over, whether we are related to them or not I really dont know, but would love to hear from you if you get any more information on it.

Do you by any chance know Elmer or Flossie McVey in Troutdale? He is my cousin. His father and my mother were sister and brother. We are in the process of moving at present so must stop and get busy. Hope to hear from you some time

# YANCEY FAMILY DATA

493

In Bedford County, Virginia, Will Book 8:273 is the will of Joel Yancey. It was written Oct. 16, 1833 and was probated Nov 25, 1833. Witnesses were Jno. T.W. Read and Will Stentoo. They proved it and the executrix named in the will, Elizabeth Yancey, qualified. He directed that his land was to be sold to pay debts. He named "my wife"--shown to be Elizabeth in qualification--and "her children": John, Liewesa, Tudor, Gracy, Charles, Betsy, Margaret, Mary, Ann Ellen and stated that Robert, his son, and daughter Doretha or Dortha as it seems to be, have had their shares. He leaves "my sword given to me by my friend Robert Yancey ~~to~~ to my son, Robert". His wife is to administer and is to be advised by friend William Radford, and "my two sons-in-law". Elizabeth qualified on probate and made \$18,000. bond, but no securities were needed under the will.

A check of order books shows that Joel was active as an administrator of different estates other than Yancey. A Joel Yancey, Jr. sold a slave in 1822, but there is no other data in early documents to identify him. He seems to have remained in Bedford for I note him much later.

In Deed Book 13, page 694, Dec 7, 1811, Thomas Jefferson of Albemarle County sells for one dollar (\$1.00) a tract of land a bit under one thousand acres to validate a contract made with Wm Radford and Joel Yancey, both of Campbell Co. Va., by Charles Bankhead and his wife Ann, who is granddaughter of Jefferson. This tract was on Bear Branch and estimated to contain between 962 and 984 acres.

In the same Book--13, page 862 on same date Chas. L. Bankhead and wife, Ann, sell for \$12,800 to Wm. Radford and Joel Yancey of Campbell Co. Va. 719 acres or maybe as much as 741 acres, they state, land at Poplar Forest in Bedford. Bankhead and wife are in Caroline Co. Va. for an order is made to the justices of Caroline to question Ann apart from her husband as to this deed. Elizabeth sells this land after Joel's death.  
(In Ackerly's ~~"Our Kin"~~ Bedford Co. Va.

In Ackerly's "Our Kin" - Bedford County Va. page 288 Lucy Davis, dau of Henry Davis and Sarah Anthony, married Wm. Tudor Yancey. Date is not given but her parents Henry Davis and Sarah Anthony were married 10 July 1800. Sarah Anthony was born March 1784, died 1824.

In Dorman's Orange Co. Va. wills for 1744 to 1778 Philemon Cavanaugh's will in Book 2, 1744 to 1778 pages 9 and 13 is mention of his daughter Winifred Yancy or Yancey. Her husband was Lewis Davis Yancey and on pages 173-77 they are shown to have conveyed land in Orange and on Pappahannock-Deed Book 2.

Dickerson's "Lynchburg and Its People" has a good deal about the family. Page 216 H.D. Yancey from Lynchburg was reported killed during the Civil War. On page 455 he is listed as first corporal in Beauregard's Rifles. Page 386 mentions R.D. Yancey or Yancy as mayor of the town in 1889. Page 160 Wm. T. Yancey is on a commission of the town, 1811.

Early's "Campbell Chronicles" (Campbell County), page 393 Lucy Elizabeth Davis, born 1822, married Wm. Tudor Yancey. He was a lawyer in Lynchburg and his son Robt. Davis Yancey, was commonwealth's attorney.

Rosa Faulkner Yancey published a book in 1935 called "Lynchburg and Its Neighbors" and dedicated it to Robert Davis Yancey. He was

born Sept 15, 1855, died Jan 3, 1931. Page 402 Gen. David Rodes <sup>494</sup> married Nov. 23, 1822, Martha Yancey. She was daughter of Major Joel Yancey of Bedford County. (I assume that he is the Junior whom I found since the other Joel had no daughter named Martha) Martha was born Dec. 1803.

On page 440 ff. she gives a running sketch of the family. She says that Charles Yancey came to Virginia about 1674. His wife was granddaughter of Alex. Leighton who was bishop of Dunblane and archbishop of Glasgow. She says that Chas. was on quit rent roll of King Wm. Co. in 1704. His son Robert, left will in Louisa Co. Va. in 1745 and named sons Chas, Robt, James, Richard. She says that this will is in first will book, but gives no more data.

James Yancey, son of second Robert, and grandson of first Charles was major in Revolution under Gen Green. He settled in South Carolina and married a Miss Cudworth. He was grandfather of Wm. Lowndes Yancey the famous southern orator.

Charles, son of Robt. married Mademoiselle Dumas, dau of Jeremiah Dumas, of Louisa Co. He had Jeremiah, Charles and Robert. Many of his descendants live in Albemarle Co.

Charles, known as Capt, married Mary Crawford, daughter of David Crawford, and descendants in Amherst. She does not tell us just where this Charles fits into the picture.

Robert Yancey married Anne Crawford, sister of Mary above, and was rector in Louisa. Widow to Buckingham Co. Their son was Major Charles Yancey and was known as the "Duke of Buckingham" for his hospitality. Born 1770, died 1857. He married Nancy Spencer and had Mary Chambers who married Col. John Horsley of Nelson Co. Va. They also had a dau. Elizabeth Ann, who married twice--Robt. Williams of N.Y. and Richard Morris of Gloucester, Va. She had a son Chas. Yancey Morris, by second husband and this son built a mansion in Amherst. She says it is now known as "The Colony". This place is now known as Lynchburg Training School and is a large institution overlooking the James River and is a place for mentally retarded children. It is a beautiful campus and now has many large buildings. I think that I know which building is the original mansion house.

Robert Yancey, son of Robert and grandson of first Charles in Louisa Co. will of 1745 had son Joel, who married Barbara Jennings in Louisa. She was dau of Robt. Jennings of Hanover. He left will in 1758 and names her as apparently the youngest child. Her sister Elizabeth Jennings Hudson, was grandmother of Henry Clay. Barbara and Joel had one son, Joel Yancey, born 1773 and one year old when his father died. The elder Joel's will is in Louisa Co.

The second Joel came to Campbell and married Peggy (Elizabeth) Burton who was dau. of Jesse Burton. She then states that the issue of Joel is "by his own hand". Robt. Jennings Yancey born Nov. 15, 1797 to Missouri and left issue. Several of them were Confederates, but she does not list them. Harriet Barbara was a daughter who was born Apr 7, 1802, and settled in Missouri. I have notes on a Joel in Barren Co. Ky. but they only show that he was prominent in legislature and from Va. I am wondering if this is the same Joel who later went to Missouri. Another dau was Martha Ann who was born Dec 1803, and married General Davis Rodes and came to Lynchburg.

She states that Joel after first wifes death then married Bettie Macon Oct. 24 1809. She was dau of John Macon of Powhatan Co. They had John Macon Yancey, born Sept 11, 1810 and never married. Lived in the South. Catherine Louisa married Thomas Stentoo. Wm. Tudor Yancey was born Nov. 16, 1813 and married Lucy Elizabeth Davis. Grace Macon was never married. Charles Dabney Yancey was born May 15, 1817. He went to New Orleans and married a Miss Vallarhe, but had no issue. There were several single daughters so this is the Joel of Bedford will. The rest of her data deals with those who were in Virginia so does not help us in any western search. I can find no reference to an Austin Yancey from Va. to N.C. and nothing in any Ky. data of mine to locate him.

Dear Mrs. Bogardus,

I finally got to go to Bedford, but it has been a busy summer and my field trips are few. I am to go to Lunenburg and I just dont know when I can make that one for a woman who is a Virginian and too busy to go herself.

I have checked everything possible to locate the man Austin Yancey, but I am not having any luck with it. I shall keep him on file for ~~as~~ someday I want to go to N.C. to do some work on my own lines.

Your kind note of 10 March, which I received on the 14th, was most welcome. The material you enclosed confirmed in most of the details much of the information from other sources. I have just finished fitting together the many different items of information gathered for a second draft of the paper I am preparing on the Caswell County, N.C. Yanceys. I should get it back from the reproducer in a day or two. Then I shall send it to N.C. for additions and corrections by those most interested in getting their lines connected; after which I will revise the paper again, have it put in "final" form-- as if there ever will be such a thing-- and then I will send out copies somewhat as I did Some Yancey Notes several years ago.

This paper was started just to answer some questions three Yancey descendants in N.C. asked me in November, 1965. I will send you a copy, of course, when it is ready for distribution. This, hopefully, will be late in April or early May.

You must have an excellent filing system. In spite of all your moves, you seem to be able to go into your files and pull out whatever you have on any subject brought up. I know how to file things properly and do so much of the time. But when working on a subject, often I gather various papers and keep them out of their proper places. Something else will come up to take my entire time and attention for a longer period than I expect. When I try to start over again, I find it difficult to lay my hands on the papers I laid aside. I have to go sit down and think a long time, trying to recall where I could have put the papers. They turn up, but not before I have worried considerably about the situation...

It was interesting to learn of your cataract operations. Mrs. Lacy did well with hers, several years ago. Like you, most people seem to come out of their difficulty in better condition than for a long time. I told my sister about your case, as she has been a little depressed with the thought that she might have need for such an operation before too long. My new glasses are very helpful. I had been needing them more than I realized.

I am happy to learn that you have located your Austin Yancey and in Rutherford County, N.C. and need only more proof. You have searched diligently for him for a long time. Again I am impressed by the distances these ancestors of ours covered in the difficult days in which they traveled.

Found no land records for any other Yancey so that mention of Oliver's claim must have been a homestead from U.S.
