Dear Lillian -

Just to let you know I received your letter - and say "Thanks". Actually, you've proved Matilda was Austin's daughter - which I don't think anyone else had done. I know Bertha had her that way, but don't know where she got the information.

I have copied some material from a Stevens history in the Gen. Library here and, if I haven't already done so, will send to you as soon as I get a chance. She was second wife of Wm. Stevens, but I don't believe the history gave anything but her Yancey name. Bertha had this as her second marriage, but, if so, why was she married to Stevens as "Yancey"? so I have always wondered about it. Think I have her marriage date but am not sure.

I'm snitching time enough to write this to you at work. I'm retired ~~xx~~ from being retired! My sister has been off work completely for a couple of months now and I'm working her job 'cause I'm afraid if she is off so long she won't have a job. Too, they pay her the salary as long as they don't have to hire anyone else. So it really puts a crimp in my genealogy work. But I get in a letter, or a roll of film or something once in a while.

I still haven't pinned down the Elizabeth Yancey who married a Farris in Kentucky at the RIGHT time to be one of ours. One of the researchers at the Gen. Library is back in Ky. on a research trip and is going to "keep her eyes open" for me. She is going to visit the cemetery where this Elizabeth is buried (that information I received from a Farris descendant who said the grave was there but he could not read it). Frances (the Lib. gal) says there isn't a stone in existence she can't figure out - so keep our fingers crossed!

Wish we had some contact in Montgomery County, Tenn., (if we had a town - or do we?) who could check County and Cemetery records there. There just might be something there. I'm still trying to get a copy of a Wm. Yancey will made about the time our Yancey family was there to see if there is anything in it - and think I will get it eventually.

Did I ever ask you (or did you tell me) where the information on Mahale and Joseph Smith came from?

Glad you had a good vacation - Utah is really something to see, isn't it? (By the way, now that I have a county located, I'll check the 1860 and 1870 census and see if the Stevens family was there then). Just don't get yourself so busy that you can't enjoy the memories of it - it's a whole year to another one. I had hoped to get up to Oregon this fall (around Portland) but just can't make it. Have neither the time or money. However, if we can just get sister well and back to work, guess that's about all I can ask for right now. End of paper - and time - more later,

Under "Proof of these statements" it reads ----- Austin Yancey served in the S.C. troops from Greenville Co. He came to Fulton Co., Ill. and applied for a pension (which was rejected because of service less than six months). He is buried in Fulton Co. Ill. Austin Yancey is listed 68 of the S.C. 1790 Census."

2. We do have a copy of deed dated 7 Dec. 1794 in Rutherford Co., North Carolina, for land sold to an Austin Yancey.

3. I have a census report (someone gave Bertha) for 1830 census, county of Franklin, State of Ill., which shows the following:

Austin Yancey, Sr., Males 1 age 15-20, 1 age 70-80
Females 1 age 70-80

Hyrum Yancey, Males 1 under 5, 1 age 20-30
Females 2 under 5, 1 age 20-30.

This is getting TOO long and I'd better stop. Hope you can make enough out of this to get you started. I have been hoping (and so has Aunt Bertha) for someone to take this Pratt line, concentrate on it and get it going. So was very, very glad to hear Mr. and Mrs. Harold were ready to go to work! If we find anything more definite on the Yancey end of it, we'll let you know and hope you will do the same for us.

If you need anything else I have, let me know. (Or Alice, or Bertha) Alice and I are going to TRY to really start working on this and take part of the load off Aunt Bertha. She surely has done wonders with what she had to start out with. I don't expect to accomplish nearly as much as she has - in fact, I don't know how I'm even going to assimilate all she has been able to get. But I'm going to take a try at it.

Good hunting - and we'll be expecting to hear from you.

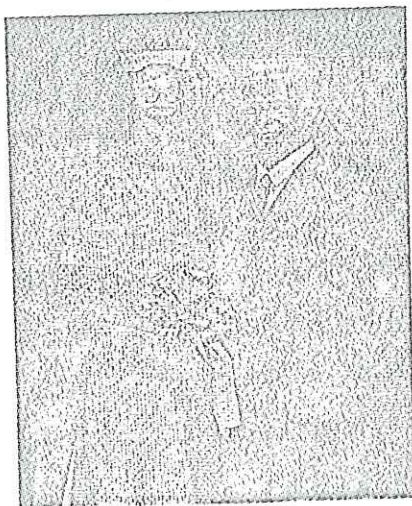

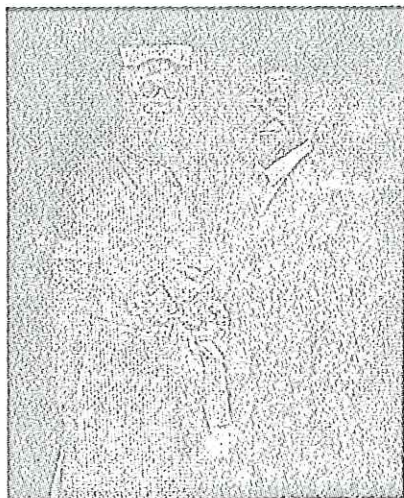

Which would mean another child found FOR SURE for the Austin sheet. I hadn't even thought (yet) of whether or not to change the sheet on Hiram if they turn out not to be his children - but have been thinking a lot about another child for the Austin Yancey sheet - as the two Austin sheets are a long way from being completed yet. Didn't know Vernon had just sent in sheets for you. I thought he might have been doing some research and had sent something in on his own. Yes, I'll be glad to send, in any, and all - of the marriages you want to send me. I have made out two sheets (six names) and am sending them in to see if they are acceptable. Took them from some research Lillian did and am not sure I have the proper reference for them to be accepted. Lillian did put the "call number" from the S.L.
