Joel Yancey is a ^{should be Catherine J. Ross} Virginian by birth. He was born 13 Aug. 1830. His parents were Robert J. and Catharine Ross, Yancey, they were also Virginians by birth and were of Welsh decent. Great grandfather Yancey and three brothers came to the U.S. from Mill Wales and settled in Virginia and Kentucky. One of the brothers was killed at the battle of Eutaw Springs, South Carolina during the Rev. war.

The grandfather Joel Yancey who married ----- Burton served as major in the war of 1812. He died in Virginia. Robert J. Yancey and wife came to Missouri in 1835 and soon became residents of Wayne County. The father was a lawyer by profession but after coming to Missouri followed the occupation of farming and at the time of his death was a poor citizen. His death occurred in July 1861. He was county clerk at one time and for many years was justice of the peace.

Five of their children are living, Joel, Mattie A. Jennie, Charles D. and Virginia R. The eldest of these Joel, was about nine years old when he came to this county. He made his parents house his home until the war breaking out of the war when he immediately enlisted in the Missouri State Guards and served 6 months.

In 1862 he enlisted in Co. B. Fourth Missouri Infantry, Confederate States Army and served until the close of the war. He rose to the rank of 2nd. Lt. and took part in the battle of Fredrickstown Mo. Prairie Grove, Helena, Ark, Little Rock, Jenkins Ferry Pleasant Hill and Sabine Crossroads, La. He served in several sharp skirmishes but was not seriously wounded during his entire service.

Abe, Yancey of Tollhouse, Calif. dead
 Passes away when nearly 76 years old, (this is copied from a newspaper but not the date given, Abe, was famous as Democratic Politician in early days and Hotel Keeper.

C.A. Yancey, one of the oldest settlers in Fresno Co, Calif, and commonly known as Abe, to his many friends, died yesterday afternoon, at the Toll house where he has lived for over 30 years. At the time of his death he was almost 76 years old, having been born 4 Oct. 1833,

Shortly after arriving in Fresno Co. he engaged in the hotel business running what is known as the lower Tollhouse Hotel. this hotel has been run now for several years by his son as he has been ailing for a long time.

C.A. Yancey rancher and hotel keeper of Tollhouse was born in Albemarle Co. Va. in 1833. His father R.H. Yancey was for many years sherrif of the same county. and also operated the well known 'Yanceys Mill. He emigrated to Joe Davis Co. Illinois in 1835 and then carried on general farming. Young Yancey was educated at the public schools and lived at home until 1850, when he came across the plains to Calif. He came with the Miller and Harper emigrant train who charged for ~~man~~ transportation one half of the first years earnings.

The company was large and they divided at the junction of the Fort Hall and and Salt Lake route after traveling 1000 miles. and as a singular coincidence-- the ~~man~~ train again united and arrived at Hangtown 22 Sep. 1850

Young Yancey then followed mining in Amador Co. about one year and in 1852 bought a team and began freighting from Stockton to the mines, until ~~man~~ 1856 and then he bought a ranch and ran a hotel on the north side of the San Joaquin River. He followed ranching until 1858 and then he went into the stock business until 1868. He then came to Toll house and bought a claim of about 900 acres and built a hotel 18 by 90 feet with a dining room 20 by 40 and he has ince built up the town around him, consisting of six dwellings, blacksmith shop, store and the necessary barns and out buildings, all of which he owns and rents, He is ever ready to build for the renter, but says he has nothing to sell.

Mr. Yancey was married at Millerton in 1860 to a Mrs. Block, a widow with two children, she was the daughter of Judge Gillum Baley. They had nine children, but three only survive. They lost five children inside of eleven ~~man~~ days in a terrible epeмедic of dyptheria.

Mr. Yancey was appointed pastmaster of Tollhouse under the administerat of Pres. Hayes in 1876. He was a charter member of the Odd Fellows lodge established in Millerton.

When my father came to Calif. a brother came with him by the name of Joe but did not stay long, he went back and joined the Army of the South and was killed in the war. I dont know if he was older or younger than my Dad. Ma

Thomas B. Yancey, a prominent figure in the commercial and political life of Somerville, Tenn., was born at La Grange, Fayette Co. of that State in the year 1844. His parents were A. L. and Elizabeth (Bragg) Yancey, the mother a sister of Gen. Braxton Bragg and Governor Bragg of North Carolina. When Thomas was about 12 years of age his parents moved to Arkansas, where his father engaged in planting. Shortly after going to Ark. A. L. Yancey was elected to the legislature of that State and died before the expiration of his term of office. The son received a good English education in the public schools and in May, 1861, enlisted as a private in Company E, Thirteenth Tenn. Infantry. His first battle was at Belmont, Mo. Afterward he fought at Shiloh, Tupelo, Richmond, Ky. Perryville, Murfreesboro, and several minor skirmishes around Cumberland Gap and Chattanooga. After the battle at Murfreesboro he was appointed a cadet in the regular confederate army, with the rank of Lieutenant and the privilege of remaining in the field. He then was assigned to duty on the staff of Gen. Preston Smith and was with that officer when he was killed at Chickamauga. After the death of Gen. Smith, Lieut. Yancey served on the staff of Gen. A. J. Vaughan through the Atlanta campaign. He was seriously wounded in the battle of Peachtree Creek and was for sometime in the hospital after which he was promoted to First Lieut. and returned to the regular army but he was at the same time given the rank and pay of a Captain in the provisional army. After the war he engaged in merchandizing ~~thaxk~~ at La Grange until 1872 when he removed to Somerville. During the first administration of Pres. Cleveland he held the office of United States Marshal; he served 10 years as Mayor of Somerville and was subsequently elected County Clerk. In all of these positions he has rendered service to the entire satisfaction of his constituents and he is regarded as one of the most public-spirited men of Somerville. Mr. Yancey is a member of the United Confederate Veterans and is active in promoting the interest of the order.

P-81: THE YANCEY FAMILY: The first trace we have of this family is that four Welshmen, - Charles, William Joel and Robert Yancey, - came to Virginia in 1642 with Sir William Berkeley, who was afterwards governor. They settled in the James River region and prospered.

From one of the original four was descended Lewis Davis Yancey, who settled in Culpepper about 1710; married Mildred, daughter of Charles Kavanaugh of Irish parentage, who owned a large land estate of 40,000 acres in said county. This tract extended westward and above the Beverly line, up Muddy Run to Judge Field's Mills, across by Boontown to Gibson's Mills on Mountain Run. A portion of this land he bequeathed to his daughter Mildred, which portion has never been out of the Yancey family, and is still owned by Benjamin M. Yancey, a great-grandson of Lewis Davis Yancey. Lewis Davis Yancey lived and was buried on the estate of James William Yancey, - "Arlington".

From the "Crawford Book" we have: "John Yancey came from Wales about the middle of the 17th century". Then there must have been another brother. The children of John Yancey were:

William Shepard of Va. From Raleigh Travers Greens Book, taken from Dr. Slaughters notes on Culpepper Co. VA. From Welsh families and Antiquities. And from old letters owned by descendants of the Yancey family. (Arms furnished by William Shepard.)

Nannev of Nannau

From Cadwgan, second son of the tribe, descendent of Nanney of York, Founder was Bleddyn of Cynfyn, from the third Royal Tribe was descended. Howard Selyf or Sele possessor of Nannau in the time of Owain Clyndwr, was ninth from Bleddyn of Cynfyn. His grandfather Ynwr Tychan Jr. son of Ynwr of Meurig in the third Regiment of Edward I, presented a petition to the Prince of Wales, stating that the king had made William Rhaglor, of the court of Tlybont for his services in taking Modic of Llyweln, who in the last war had made himself Prince of Wales. This petition was not granted as Ynwr could show no character to the Office. When Dwyn or Dwn visited Nannau in 1588 he was head of the family and signed the pedigree. His grandson, head of the family was Hugh Nanney Esq. Sheriff of County in 1638. Grandson of Col. Hugh Nanney, died in 1667 M. P. Col. of Militia of his county and Vice Admiral of North Wales in the last year of William 3. Edmon in Lanfachreth Ch. was the last of the line of Nanney.

Catherine daughter of William Vaughn, Esq. of Corsygedol. His third daughter, Catherine married Robert Vaughn, Esq., celebrated antiquary of Hengwrt. Catherine's oldest son Hugh Vaughn succeeded to the Nanney estates but died unmarried. His next brother, Robert of Nanney and Hengwrt in 1792 Baron and his son was Sir Robert Vaughn: Bart M. P. of Nannau succeeded him. He was 44 years a member of Parliament: Also father of Griggith of Howell Vaughn Esq. of Phug and Hengwrt and Col. Edward William Vaughn who inherited the Phug estates and assumed leg. license the additional sur-name of Sailesbury and died in 1807. Sir Robert William Vaughn, third Baronet of Nannua D. S. P. died in 1859 and the title became extinct, and the estates were divided: Nannau was left to Hon. Thomas Price, Lord for life, and then to John Vaughn Esq. Hengwrt was given to his wife's three sisters for life, and the great collection of Hengwrt manuscripts to a kinsman W. W. Lwqnn Esq. of Peniarth. The Phug estates to H. C. H. Wynn, second son of Lord Newborough. (Signed O. E. Ruck).

Maisyfandi in the Parish of Talyllyn, now reduced to a farm, was for many ages the seat of a family of note. Ilwyn Hughes Esq. Sheriff of County of Merioneth 1582. Ilwyn Dwn. paid ten shillings to deputy for making out the pedigree: They traced their line from Simon Dais said to have been a descendant of Caradoc Ffrenchfras and bore Arms ascribed to that knight. Heiress of the Hughes family married Lewis Nanney Esq. a grandson of Hugh Nanney Esq. of Nannau, Sheriff of Merioneth County 1634. She married the second time to John Lloud of Ceiswgn, Sheriff of Merioneth Co. 1652. The Maisypandi estates passed into that of Wynn of Maisy-neuadg Walsarnau through marriage of William Wynn Esq. to Lowry, eldest sister of x John Nanney in 1668? (1868) The last of this name line died in 1868? (1668).

Nannev's of Nannau bore Arms, or a Lion Rampant. az. for Nanney on the first and fourth of quarters. Ermine on a Saltire gu. a crescent or for Wqnn. Mrs. Nanney of Bronylfa, St. Asslph Flintshire, Lucy Victoria, widow of John Nanney Esq. J. P. son of the late Rev. John

Nanney, M. A. J. P. of Pentre. She married Mr. Nanney, who died Dec. 27, 1868? (1668)

Sir William Perkley who lived in Cariganshire Wales, was a descendant of a Welsh family: he was evidently in touch with the Nanney brothers of Merionethshire the adjacent County, who came with him. Sir William Berkley was a connection of the Nanneys through his ancestor Bleddyn Cynfyn of the third Royal Tribe of Wales. One of the Nanneys descended from Carado Fraidhofras a Knight of the Mystical round table. Uron Goch, Just north of Bala Merioneth was the home of the Nanney brothers who emigrated to America in or about 1640. I send a little map in which Uron Goch is marked in the valley of the River Dee which rises in Bala Lake. (signed Ol E. Ruck) A. S. Vron goch were marry Nanney Clans. (O. E. Buck, William Shepard).

My theor is that the Nanney Brothers of Vron Goch, four or five emigrated to America about 1640 and they did not leave their address. gradually becoming known, perhaps first by the name of Yanney or Nancey and finally by the name Yancey. (For people were not particular as to the spelling of names in those days.)

The attributes of pure Welsh blood are; dark, vivacious, quick witted, and benevolent. Full of family pride and affection. (From Welsh Families and Antiquities.)

Nanney Arms

On a gold shield a lion in blue facing to the left rampant. (no motto or crest showing) Great age, being used by a Welsh Chief in battle r identification of himself and followers. Mottoes were taken arbitrarily by families and absence of one means nothing. However in several branches of the Yancey family the motto which means "touch not the cat without the glove", has been handed down by tradition.

A member of the Shepard family, Miss Annie Shepard, living in Buckingham Co. VA. inherited from her mother whose maiden name was Yancey, a copy of the Nanney coat of Arms. Miss Shepard was 98 years old in 1928 (she may be dead now) but I had the privilege of seeing and copying this arms. Signed Mrs. T. H. Carraway. Ashville, N. C.

A great many records in Buckingham Co. were burned.

In South Hill Va. there are Yanceys and also Nanneys, they do not claim any connection but this can be explained as the Nanneys probably came over later from a Nanney branch in Wales or England.

Memories of ~~my grandfather~~ ^{grandfather} Hiram John Yancey as given by Edmond Yancey eldest son of Jess Pratt Yancey (a brother of Hiram Yancey) (and with whom Hiram lived for some time after leaving Salt Lake City with his son John) at Cottage Grove, Oregon 11 June 1937. while attending a reunion of the "Yancey" family there.
(Edmond Yancey was born in 1857 and at this writing Jan. 1947 is well and strong at the age of 90 years.)

Hiram John Yancey, your great grand father and my grandfather lived in Placer Co, Calif, that being the first place I remember his being at. He also lived at Healdsburg, Sonoma Co, Calif. He was a wagon maker by trade-also did some farming. Then he moved to Cottage Grove, Lane Co, Oregon, where he died at the age of 86 years, and is now buried there. His first wife Elizabeth Pratt died before he came west. She is buried in Missouri, and Mary Tuttle was the name of his wife here in Calif. (At the time Mr. and Mrs. Jared Anderson and Mr. and Mrs. Joseph F. Jensen were there at Cottage Grove at the family gathering, Edmond Yancey accompanied them to the old cemetery and there among a heavy growth of weeds etc. they found the head stones of Hiram Hiram John Yancey and his wife Mary Tuttle.)

There were seven families of the Yancey's, Hiram John and six children with their families who left Illinois, They were considered well off for those days as they had a lot of fine cattle and horses, new wagons, nice furniture and money for those days. They arrived in Salt Lake City in 1853. Several different stories are told of them not being received well in Salt Lake by some of the people they had known in Illinois, at any rate when an immigrant train came thru Salt Lake they went on west with them and ~~arrived in California~~ landed at Placer Co county Calif in 1857. Adaline Yancey and her husband George Cox never went any further west than Salt Lake City but went from there to Mound City Kansas Lynn Co, where they were living in 1869.

George Worth Yancey, by Mrs. S.K.Yancey, taken from the " Churches of Christ" by John T.Brown and Co. Louisville, Ky. 1904, page 437

The subject of this sketch was the youngest child of Thomas and Zelcha Yancey and was born in New Liberty, Owen Co. Ky. 3 March, 1847.

His father was a Virginian, being a cousin of Wm.L.Yancey of Confederate fame. His mother was first cousin of the Morton brothers who were pioneer preachers of the Restoration. From both father and mother he inherited a fine physique and a strong mind.

When two years of age his father died, leaving the mother and five children. She journeyed to Missouri and here on the praries of this new country Worth Yancey spent his boyhood days. He left his home at the early age of thirteen to make his own way. At sixteen he entered the office of the Palmyra Spectator and learned the art of printing.

About this time he united with the church and soon afterwards am decided to become a preacher of the Gospel. To this end he bent every energy, reading and studying every spare moment. He became a proficient typesetter, earning good wages which he laid by for his college course. At the age of 19 he entered Kentucky University. He graduated from both the college of the Bible and the University with honors, beloved by faculty and student body.

During nearly all of his college course he preached regularly every Sunday. His vacations were spent in protracted meetings in Kentucky and Missouri. After graduating he was called to Carlisle, then to Floyd and Chestnut Street Church Louisville, (now Broadway) laboring with this church for six years, then the Campbell church four years, Cynthian church five years, where his sealth failed.

His last sermon was preached 30 Sept. 1894. On 7 Sept. 1896 at Williamstown, Ky. his bouyany spirit with glimpses of the farther shore, " was released from its tenant of clay. On 9 June 1871 he was united in marriage to Sarah Kendall Hogan of Williamstown, Ky. who with two sons Worth and Hogan and a little daughter Lela survive him. Graham the eldest son preceded his father to the homeland.
