In the Name of God Amen. I Robert Yancey, Sen. of the County of Mecklenburg State of Virginia of sound mind and memory do make ordain and Constitute this my last will and Testament Trusting in a Savior for Redemption.

Imprimis I give unto my son John Yancey the tract of land he is now living upon Containing by Estimation one hundred and forty acres be the same more or less also another tract adjoining the former containing sixty acres be the same more or less. The first tract of one hundred and forty acres Rated at Twenty Shillings per acre, the other tract of sixty acres Rate at fifteen shillings per acre with one negro girl Pink Rated at sixty pounds also one bed and furniture Rated at ten pounds, to him and his heirs forever.

Imprimis I give unto my son Richard Yancey the tract of land he is now living upon Containing by estimation Four hundred acres be the same more or less Rated at ten Shillings per acre, also one negro boy named Gabriel Rated at fifty pounds, one Feather Bed & furniture rated at ten pounds to him and his heirs forever.

Imprimis I give unto my son Robert Yancey the tract of land he is now living upon Containing by estimation four hundred and twelve acres be the same more or less rated at ten Shillings per acre, also one negro Girl named Jinney rated at one hundred dollars to him and his heirs forever.

Imprimis I give unto my son Hezekiah Yancey the Tract of land he is now living upon Containing by estimation one hundred and ninety five acres be the same more or less Rated at fifteen Shillings per acre, also one negro Boy named Haborn Rated at forty five pounds, Feather Bed and furniture rated ten pounds, also one hundred & twenty dollars that I have let him, To him and his heirs forever.

Imprimis I give unto my Daughter Mary Williamson one negro Girl named Agga Rated at Sixty pounds another negro Girl named Mitilda Rated at fifty pounds one Feather Bed at ten pounds one horse at Ten pounds to her and her heirs forever.

Imprimis I give to my Daughter Delphia Tillotson a negro Girl named (Amy) and her Children Rated fifty five pounds feather Bed & furniture at ten pounds, one Horse at ten pounds also the Tract of land whereupon she now lives Containing by estimation Three hundred acres be the same more or less rated at Twenty Shillings & six pence per acre to her and her heirs forever.

Imprimis I give to my Daughter Anna Overby one negro boy named Buck rated at Sixty pounds one Horse at ten pounds and one Feather bed at ten pounds, with half of the tract of land Laying and adjoining, Speed & Nelson Containing Three hundred & fifty acres Rated at twenty two Shillings per acre, to her and her heirs forever.

Imprimis I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Griffin one negro girl named Patsey rated at Sixty pounds also another Little Girl named Chana one Horse at ten pounds one Feather Bed & furniture at ten pounds and also the other half of the tract of Land named above adjoining Speed & Wilson to her and her heirs forever.

Imprimis I give unto my Daughter Suzanna Williamson one negro Girl named (Anna) Rated at fifty pounds one Horse Ten pounds one Bed and furniture Ten pounds to her and her heirs forever.

Imprimis I give unto my Daughter Lucy Yancey the Lands that I now am living upon Containing by Estimation Two Hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less Rated at fifteen Shillings per acre also one negro Boy by the name of (Hammond) at fifty pounds - also a negro girl by the name of (Judy) Rated at forty five pounds also her Choice of a Feather Bed and furniture also her Choice of My Horses, also her Choice of a Cow and Calf also a good Sow & pigs also a Sufficiency of provisions for her and her family --- One Years, But if my Daughter Lucy Should die before Marriage the property shall return to my Children or their heirs.

Imprimis I give unto Milley Griffin one negro Boy named Starling with a feather Bed and Furniture Ten pounds value to her and her Heirs forever.

Imprimis It is my desire that the rest of my Negros not mentioned in this my last will shall be put Equal Lots and Each of my Children draw the Lots & abide by such lot as shall be drawn by them -- I do appoint my Beloved Sons Richard Yancey and Hezekiah Yancey Executors of this my last will & Testament -- Given under my hand and seal this fifth day of March Eighteen Hundred and Seventeen.

And I do hereby nominate and appoint John Jones and Robert Jones and Richard Jones, my _____ sole Executors of this my last will and testament revoking and making void all other wills and testaments that everbefore made.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Jones all that tract or parcel of land and plantation he now lives on also my negro man named Sam and his first choice of my horses to him and his heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son John Jones my negro man named Harry and his next choice of my horses to him and his heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Blanks my negro woman named Sarah her first choice of my feather beds and furniture and my trunk to her and her heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Philadelphia Yancey her next choice of my feather beds and furniture to her and her heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Amelia Vaughan her next choice of my feather beds and furniture to her and her heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Frances Wilkins my chest and her choice of two of my cows and calves to her and her heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my two grand daughters Sarah Griffin and Frances Griffin all the tract or parcel of land joining the land of the Rev. Mr. John Camerons land the land whereon Mr. John Wilburn now lives formerly called Reed's land containing 133 acres to be equally divided between them two to them and their heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my two grandsons Joseph Blanks and John Blanks all the tract of land plantation whereon I now live to be equally divided between them two otherwise to sell the land and divide the money equally between them two (but not against their mothers consent in case she should want to live on it) to them and their heirs and assigns forever. Item I likewise give and bequeath to my said grandson Joseph Blanks my copper stillworm cap VC and my saddle and gun to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath all the tract or parcel of land joining Smiths land and known by the name of mountain tract containing 170 acres to my four daughters namely Philadelphia Yancey, Amelia Vaughan, Ann Blanks and Frances Wilkins also all my other Estate not already mentioned to be equally divided between four to them and their heirs and assigns forever. And I appoint my sons Benjamin Jones, James Jones and Joseph Blanks Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have unto set my hand and seal this 27th of September 1791.

Will of John Yancey

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In the name of God amen, I John Yancey of the County of Mecklenburg and State of Virginia being sick and weak in body, but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God for and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life do make this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows.

Item the first it is my wish that all my perishable property be sold and out of the proceeds first pay all my just debts and funeral expenses and the balance if any to be equally divided between my seven children.

Item the second, It is my wish and desire that the tract of land I now live on to be equally divided between my Thomas Yancey and my Daughter Elizabeth giving to Elizabeth the house I now live in and to Thomas the house he now lives in Each one to accompt for their proportion of the same at valuation to be valued by James Yancey, George W. Williamson & James Williamson and in case of either of these for the surviving one to call on some third man.

Item the third it is my wish and desire that the tract of land called the Harrison Tract with the small tract I purchased of Nelson to be equally divided between my son Charles H. Yancey and James Clark who married my Daughter Lucy to be divided by the above mentioned men and prices and Charles Yancey and James Clark to accompt for the same at valuation and in case my daughter Lucy Clark should die without issue it is my wish and desire that her portion of my Estate should come back and be divided between my other children or the Lawfull begotten heirs of their bodies.

Item the fourth it is my will and desire that all the balance of my Estate both real and personal be sold and equally divided between my seven children, except a parcel of her clothes which is now claimed by my Daughter Elizabeth which I wish her to have without accompting for.

Item the 5th it is my wish and desire that the negro boy Paul now in possession of my son Thomas and negro girl Liza now in possession of William Clarke to be returned back to my Estate whenever a sale takes place and neither of them to accompt for any hire of the said negroes and it is my further will that Thomas Yancey should not accompt for any rent of the land he now lives on.

Item the 6th all the rest of my Estate of what nature or kind it may be not here in particularly disposed of I desire may be equally divided amongst my seven Children Thomas, Elizabeth, Nancy, Clarke, William, Robert and Lucy Clarke which I give to them their heirs Executors Administrators & assigns forever, Except the portion given to Lucy Clarke and if she should die without issue then her portion to come back into my Estate again at her death.

Seventhly and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends James Williamson & George W. Williamson Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made; in testamony whereof I have here unto set my hand and affix my seal this 22nd day of April in the year 1840.

William Daniel Yancey was born December 23, 1841. His father, Charles H. Yancey, died February 24, 1849. His Mother, Ann Wade Yancey, was listed as head of the household in the 1850 census with two boys and three girls. Ann Wade Yancey married David R. Chandler, a widower with four children, October 23, 1856.

David R. Chandler was listed as head of the household with his wife Ann Wade and four Chandler children and four Yancey children in the 1860 census. Mary A. E. Yancey died on October 3, 1852 at age 6.

William Daniel Yancey enlisted in Co B 12 Reg N.C. Infantry CSA April 26, 1861. He was wounded in the battle at Malvern Hill in the summer of 1862. He was Honorably retired the 30th of October 1864. He then went to live with the Tanners near Bullock, North Carolina. He lived with them about 14 years. On November 7, 1879 he married Rosa Jones daughter of Thomas H. and Jane Wilson Jones who lived near the North Carolina-Virginia line south of Clarksville. During their married life they lived at the following places:
