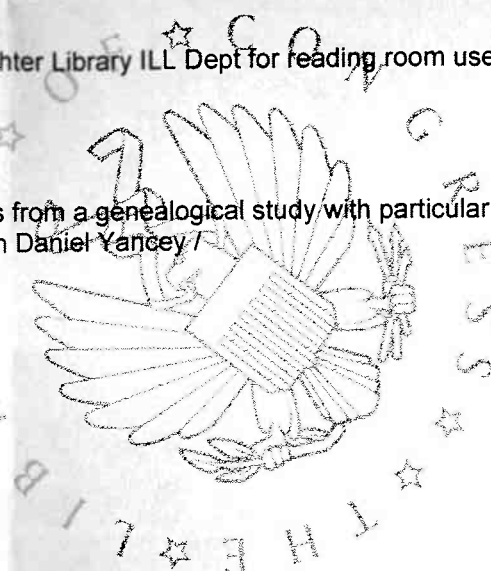

I Elizabeth S. Wade of the County of Mecklenburg and State of Virginia being weak in body but of sound and disposing mind and it may please God to help me so make my will and testament in manner following.

1st It is my will and desire that my brother in law Josiah Fourlines and Julie G. Fourlines his wife shall have the use and benefits of the sum of four hundred and forty four dollars and seventy five cents with interest there in from the 29th day of December 1860 during the natural life with the interest to be stopped on the above named sum after my death.

2naly It is my will and desire that there shall be no interest calculated or claimed on the above named four hundred forty four dollars and seventy five cents from the first day of January 1861 to the fifth of April in the year of our Lord 1865.

3rdly It is my will and desire that my sister Ann W. Chandler shall have one dollar of the above named four hundred and forty four dollars and seventy five cents after the death of my brother in law Josiah Fourlines and Julia G. Fourlines his wife.

4thly It is my will and desire that my entire estate principle and interest shall be equally divided between the following named parties after the death of my brother in law Josiah Fourlines and Julie G. Fourlines his wife to wit Mary E. Puryear, Sasnauth A. Blanks, Elbert G. Fourlines, Silas G. Fourlines, Wm D. Yancey, Lucy G. S. Fourlines wife of John W. Fourlines and Martha H. Moore wife of A. H. William Daniel Yancey was born December 23, 1841. His father, Charles H. Yancey, died February 24, 1849. His Mother, Ann Wade Yancey, was listed as head of the household in the 1850 census with two boys and three girls. Ann Wade Yancey married David R. Chandler, a widower with four children, October 23, 1856.

David R. Chandler was listed as head of the household with his wife Ann Wade and four Chandler children and four Yancey children in the 1860 census. Mary A. E. Yancey died on October 3, 1852 at age 6.

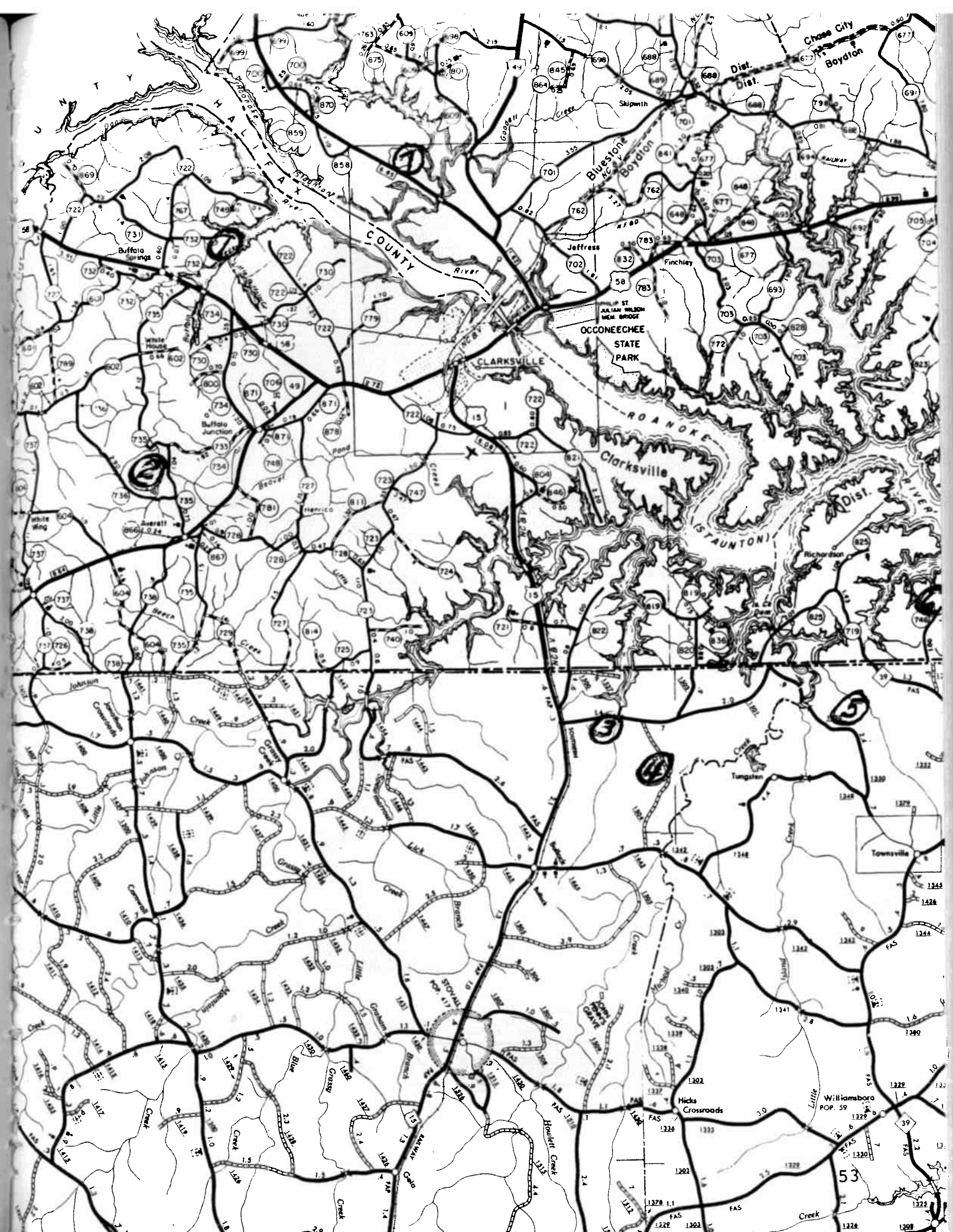
William Daniel Yancey enlisted in Co B 12 Reg N.C. Infantry CSA April 26, 1861. He was wounded in the battle at Malvern Hill in the summer of 1862. He was Honorably retired the 30th of October 1864. He then went to live with the Tanners near Bullock, North Carolina. He lived with them about 14 years. On November 7, 1879 he married Rosa Jones daughter of Thomas H. and Jane Wilson Jones who lived near the North Carolina-Virginia line south of Clarksville. During their married life they lived at the following places;

W. D. Yancey died August 20, 1924 and was buried at Tabernacle Methodist Church north of Townsville, N.C.

Rosa Jones Yancey died July 6, 1935 and also was buried at Tabernacle Methodist Church.

1. Peter and Polly Jones' house east of Buffalo Springs near the end of Road 732 in Virginia. This house which still stands in 1993 is used to store hay.
2. Graves of Robert and Philadelphia Yancey which are north of Averett on Road 736 on the west side of the headwaters of Big Buffalo Creek.
3. Red Hill is located east of Highway 15 on the south side of North Carolina Route 39 near the Virginia line. The middle portion of the house was built in the early 1770's. Recent renovation will probably be completed in 1993.
4. Green Field is southeast of Red Hill in North Carolina. The original house on this property is no longer standing.
5. Aspen Lawn in North Carolina is north of Townsville. The house on this property was standing in the late 1980's but has since been torn down.
6. Slab Town is in Virginia north of Townsville on Road 746. The house on this property was removed about 40 years ago.
7. Alfred and Martha Yancey Moore's home is in Virginia just east of Highway 15 and north of the Bluestone Creek Bridge. The house on this property is still standing in 1993 but is in very poor condition.



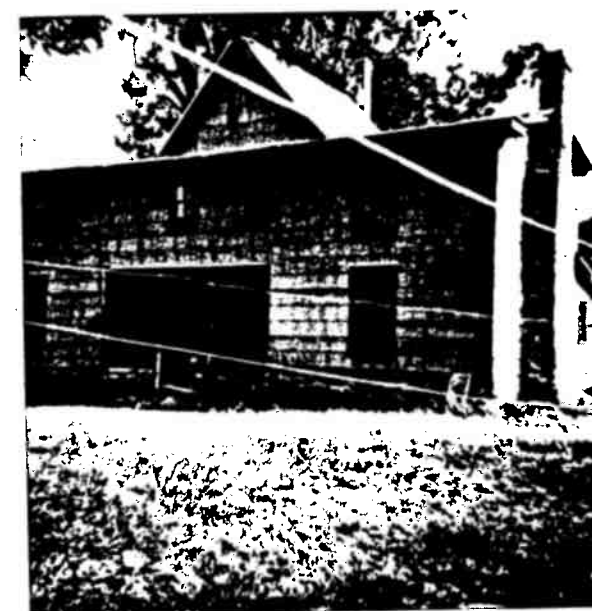

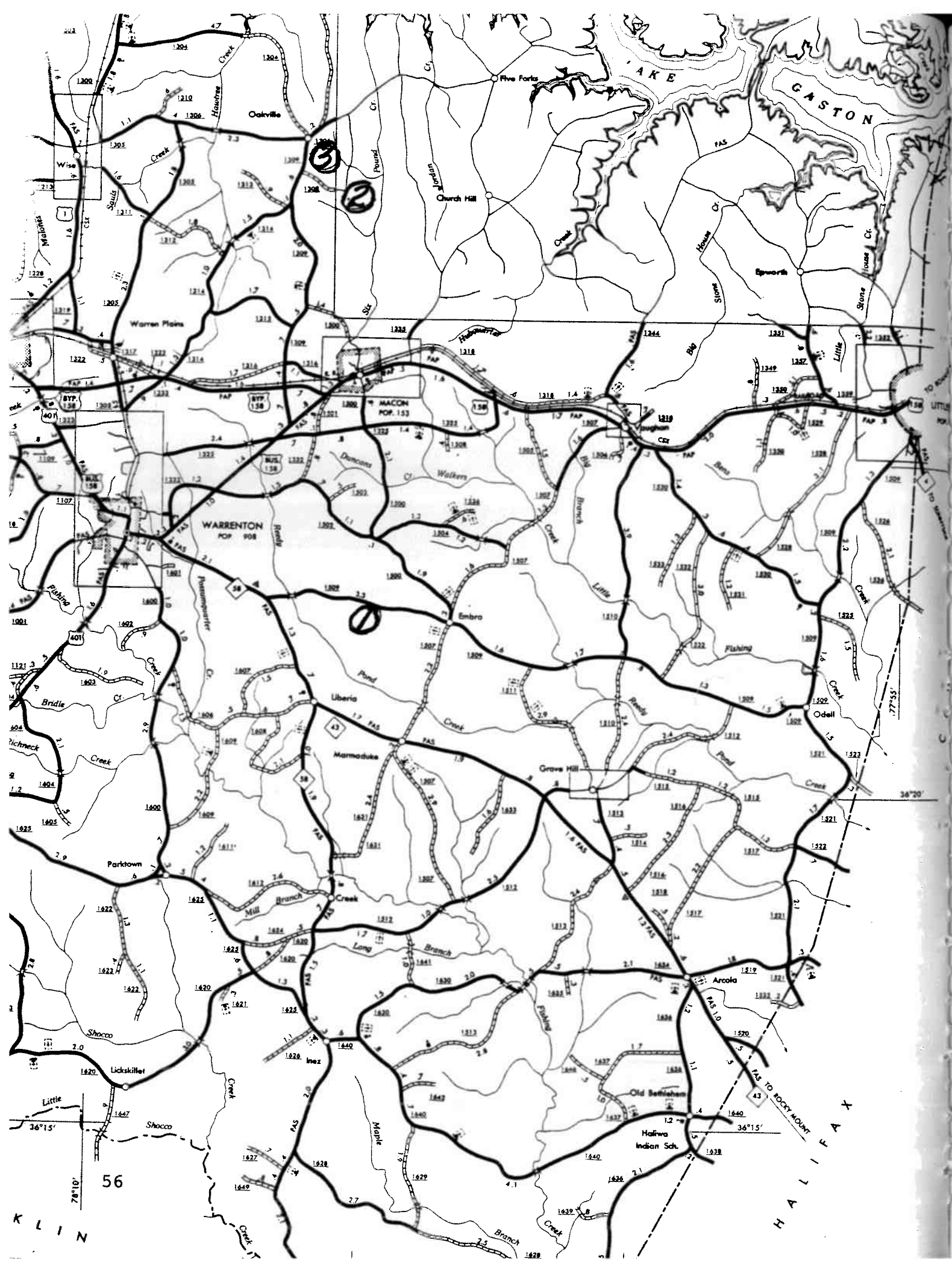
being restored, and will be featured in a forthcoming book on historic buildings of Granville County. It holds the distinction of being the oldest unaltered dwelling in Granville County.
