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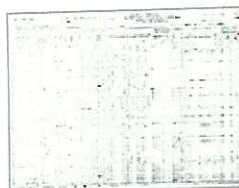

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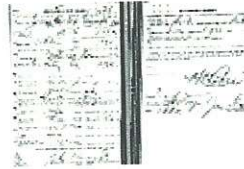

signature of registrant, among other things. Use the information found in this database to fill in details ancestor's life. Then, use the information as a springboard to lead you to other records. For example, if address of your ancestor is listed on the draft card, use that information to find your ancestor in a city and then trace your ancestor through that city's directories for as many years as you can.

The draft cards are also a good source for finding immigrant information because all young men were registered, regardless of U.S. citizen status, and since 1880-1920 was a high immigration period, a large number of immigrant men registered and gave information of birth date, birthplace, and in some cases their father's birthplace and nearest relative.

#### Search Hints

1. Persons already in the military did not register.
2. Surnames, first names, and maiden names were sometimes mixed up, so if you don't find an ancestor by their surname, type their surname into another search field.
3. Men who resided in British territories sometimes listed themselves simply as British citizens without indicating origin in Canada, Australia, Ireland, Jamaica, etc.
4. Illiterate men were unable to spell their names and birth location, so look for varying spelling variations. If you find a literate individual who filled out the form. There could also be complications if the immigrant's native language is not English.

No, I never knew Oscar, that was before my time. I have now gone back and reviewed the genealogy of the Samuel Large family. I now see that I was mistaken in thinking that Oscar was my great uncle. HE WAS NOT. Oscar is first cousin to my grandmother.

Oscar's father is William "Willie" Large. He married Charlotte Morrison on Oct. 9, 1872. Willie is the older half-brother of my grandmother, Emily "Emma" Alice Large who married John Benton Cole on Dec.,6, 1893. Willie was born on August 9, 1848 from Samuel Large's first marriage to Ellen Guiler, that produced 5 children. Ellen died June 28, 1850,\* and is buried in Whigville Cemetery, Noble County, Ohio. Samuel then remarried on December 4, 1851 to Maria Large a second cousin from Ireland and they had 8 children. Grandma was born of that marriage.

\* I think this date is wrong, because Ellen gave birth to a daughter, Ellen Large on Dec. 28, 1850. This daughter married W. J. Denton on Nov. 18, 1872. I think Ellen (the mother) died in 1851 and almost six months later Samuel remarried. My goodness, he had 5 children all under 9 years of age to care for....they needed a mother and he needed a wife! He married his second cousin, Maria Large, who was born in Ireland.

But, Ellen's tombstone in the Whigville Cemetery is lying flat on the ground and the year is covered with dirt in the photo that I took in 1999. If I go back by there on my way to Ohio this summer I am going to uncover the date so it can be read properly.

In the Large genealogy that I have from Doris Livingston it lists Oscar's marriage to Bessie Bickerdike on October 26, 1899 and her death as April 25, 1905. In your e-mail today you gave that Oscar had Bessie b. 1910 and that Bessie, the wife, died when your mother was 3 years of age. I am assuming that your mother is Bessie Martha Large, who was b. August 28, 1903. Am I correct in this? My genealogy gives Grace Elizabeth Large b. November 17, 1901. If this is incorrect please give me correct dates if you can.

That is really sad that your mother and her sister, Grace, never spoke all of their lives even though living in the same town. It happens in families sometimes with no explanation and no one attempting to bring them together to talk it out.

About Oscar's WWI registration papers. If you have not located them on the Internet I will print you a copy and send it to you via snail mail. Just let me know what you have found or not found and what you want me to do.

This has opened up an entire new door to his life. I do not know if he ever had to go to serve in the Army. My Mom never said....I just know that she had said some of the men of the family had served in the Civil War. I don't have any names of who they were.

Well, that is all for this time. Thanks for sharing. The picture of the family is clearer to me now after your letter and reviewing the genealogy again.

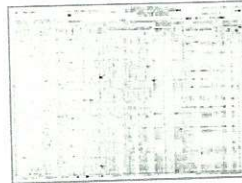

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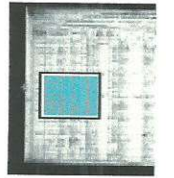

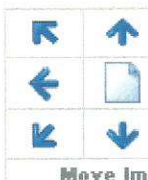

(If you do not initially find the name on the page that you are linked to, try a few pages forward and backward, as sometimes different pages had the same page number.)

Enumerators of the 1860 census were instructed to record the names of every person in the household. This, enumerators were presented with printed instructions, which account for the greater degree of accuracy compared with earlier censuses. Enumerators were asked to include the following categories in the census: age as of the census day; sex; color; birthplace; occupation of persons over age fifteen; value of real estate; whether married within the previous year; whether deaf, dumb, blind, insane, a pauper, or a convict; whether able to read or speak English; and whether the person attended school within the previous year. No relationship was shown between members of a household. The categories allowed Congress to determine persons residing in the United States for collection of taxes and the appropriation of seats in the House of Representatives.

Few, if any, records reveal as many details about individuals and families as do the U.S. federal census population schedules. These are successive "snapshots" of Americans that depict where and how they were living in particular periods in the past. Because of this, the census is often the best starting point for genealogical research after home sources have been exhausted.

The database presently includes the following states and territories: Alabama, Arkansas, California, Colorado Territory, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas Territory (includes parts of Colorado), Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska Territory (includes parts of North and South Dakota, Montana, and Wyoming), New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico Territory (includes Arizona), New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, Washington Territory, and Wisconsin.

### **Extended Description:**

The United States was the first country to call for a regularly held census. The Constitution required that a census of all "Persons...excluding Indians not taxed" be performed to determine the collection of taxes and the appropriation of seats in the House of Representatives. The first nine censuses from 1790 to 1870 were conducted under the United States Federal Court system. Each district was assigned a U.S. marshal who hired officials to administer the census. Governors were responsible for enumeration in territories.

The official enumeration day of the 1860 census was 1 June 1860. All questions asked were supposed to be answered on that date. By 1860, there were a total of thirty-three states in the Union, with Minnesota and Oregon the latest additions. There were no substantial state- or district-wide losses.
